Attached hereto is a copy of Thornton Cooper Congressional Map No. 1. If you have difficulty opening the attachment, please let me know.

On August 13, 2021, I designed a plan to divide West Virginia into two districts, one centered to the northeast and one centered to the southwest. This plan was mapped on the davesredistricting.org website on August 20, 2021.

New Congressional District No. 1 would include the counties that are closest to the point where Maryland, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia meet, as well as the Northern and Eastern Panhandles, several interstates, and Corridor H.

New Congressional District No. 2 would include the counties that are closest to the point where Kentucky, Virginia, and West Virginia meet and the southern coalfields, as well as Interstates 64 and 77 and Corridor G.

The populations of the two districts would be nearly equal.
