PROJECT TEIR (TEACHERS ENGAGED IN RESEARCH)

PROGRAM PURPOSE: The purpose of the RESA 2 Project TEIR grant is to increase student mathematics achievement by: 1) expanding teacher content knowledge and improvement of the instructional pedagogy of elementary mathematics teachers assigned to teach grades 3-5; 2) modeling the utilization of engaging mathematics instructional materials and technology sources; 3) supporting administrators in the professional growth of teacher instructional leaders in mathematics; and 4) promoting positive relationships and a sustained partnership between higher education faculty, RESA 2 and K-12 teachers in school districts in Cabell, Lincoln, Logan, Mason and Mingo counties located in southwestern West Virginia.

MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS: Project TEIR (Teachers Engaged in Research) provides elementary mathematics teachers in grades 3-5 the opportunity for sustained, research-based professional development designed to improve both mathematics content knowledge and instructional practice. This three-year initiative offers participating teachers a variety of professional development experiences including participation in four mini-institutes held on Saturdays per grant year, monthly on-line professional learning communities and a two-week summer mathematics institute. All sessions focus on modeling the utilization of providing quality and research-based mathematics instruction using engaging, high quality instructional materials to address alignment with common core/NextGen standards; balanced assessments that support student learning and integration of technology utilizing 21st century instructional materials. Marshall University professors representing both the College of Science and College of Education were heavily involved in researching the alignment of the common core/NextGen standards to the content included in the three elementary adopted mathematics textbooks (i.e., Everyday Math, Investigations and Math Expressions) to promote teacher knowledge of the application of mathematics with real world experiences.

SUMMARY OF STRATEGIC PLAN RESULTS: Year one (SY 2011-2012) focused on fractional development and common assessments that support student learning. Years two (SY 2012-2013) and three (SY 2013-2014) will focus on elementary algebraic and geometric measurement strands including a continuation of the balanced assessment philosophy.

TITLE: TEACHING AMERICAN HISTORY IN THE 21ST CENTURY GRANT

PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- Collaborated with 27 elementary teachers in monthly professional learning communities within individual counties
- Held roundtable discussions on the book, *A Social History of American Technology* by Ruth Cowen, focusing on the impact industrialization had on American society.
- Examined how the social studies fit into Common Core Standards and placed the Next Generation CSO's into templates compatible with Common Core.
- Sent the 4 traveling trunks from last year's project to various schools through-out the RESA2 counties
- Developed the education section for Heritage Farm and Museum's web-page. Teachers around the nation will be able to click on the site and access lesson plans that were created by the teachers in the TAH program. In addition, the TAH participants developed the curriculum that students will follow when they visit the museum. Heritage Farm and Museum is a partner in the TAH grant.
- Traveled to the Plymouth, Lowell, and Boston Massachusetts area to tour historical landmarks and participant in professional development that teachers will use in their classrooms.
- Offered college credit to teachers attending the summer institutes at Ashland University in Ashland, Ohio and received training from expert historians and lecturers to deepen teacher content knowledge
- Completed over 120 hours of professional development to the 27 teachers in year four of the TAH program

This project has provided sustained professional development opportunities in 21st century teaching and learning techniques in the content area of American history. In addition, teachers were provided student awareness resources that build character and citizenship.

MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

As we embark on transforming our schools and systems into Next Generation teaching and learning environments, Region 2 is working diligently to create schools and classrooms with high expectations and achievement for *all* students in every school. Data from the National Assessment of Educational Progress show that the academic performance of students in our nation's highest-poverty schools is often several grade levels behind that of students in low-poverty schools. Furthermore, schools with academic challenges are required to make strategic decisions about instructional practices, the engagement of students, and the alignment of every aspect of school operations in order to support and sustain efforts to improve student achievement.

By setting high academic standards, holding all schools accountable for performance, and identifying schools that do not meet standards, counties are taking important steps to raise expectations for all students. For schools that do not meet expectations, RESA 2 can do much to provide the support necessary to improve teaching and learning. In schools where student achievement remains persistently low, we must actively intervene with resources and technical assistance to further the school improvement process. - Developing support for the transition to Common Core and subsequent Smarter Balanced Assessment.

PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- Students currently participating in the 18 hour/one year program to acquire a principal's certificate completed cohort classes in December 2012
- Students currently participating in the 36 hour/two year program to obtain a master's in educational administration will complete the cohort program in December 2013
- High demand resulted in the formation of a second 18 hour/one year program to acquire a principal's certificate beginning in January 2013 through December 2013
- High demand has resulted in the formation of a second 36 hour/two year program to obtain a master's in educational administration beginning in January 2014 through December 2016.
- Students are currently participating in the 18 hour program to acquire English or Physics certification which are areas of critical need.

SUMMARY OF STRATEGIC PLAN RESULTS:

The Leadership Cohort has provided participating teachers with a master's degree in an educational field to complete the 18 hours necessary to acquire a principal's certificate or the opportunity to obtain a master's degree in educational administration through a one or two year program respectively. A benefit to counties is addressing the critical shortage of both highly qualified and effective principals at both the elementary and secondary levels.

The English/Physics Cohorts have provided practicing teachers with the opportunity to obtain English or Physics certification and has benefitted counties by addressing the critical shortage of both highly qualified and effective English or Physics teachers.

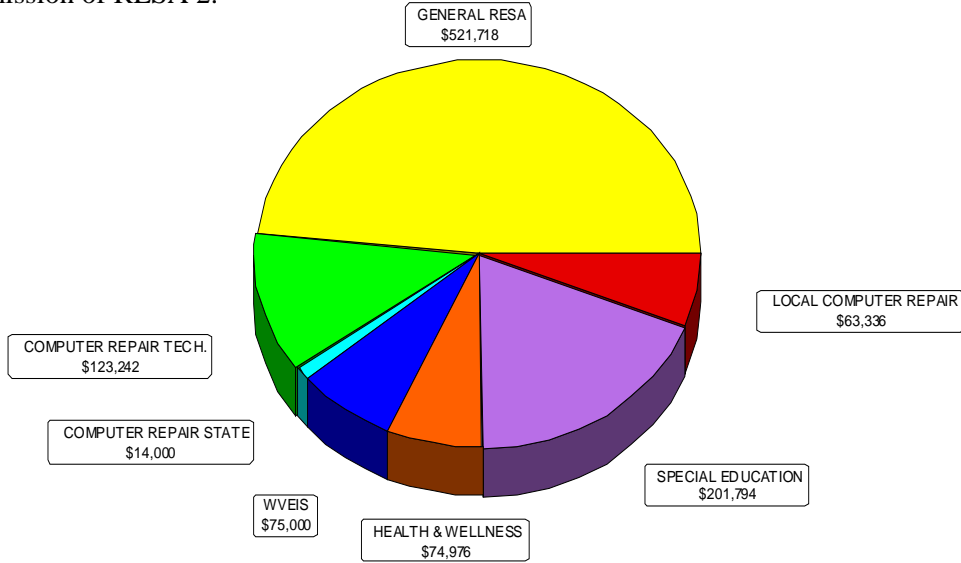

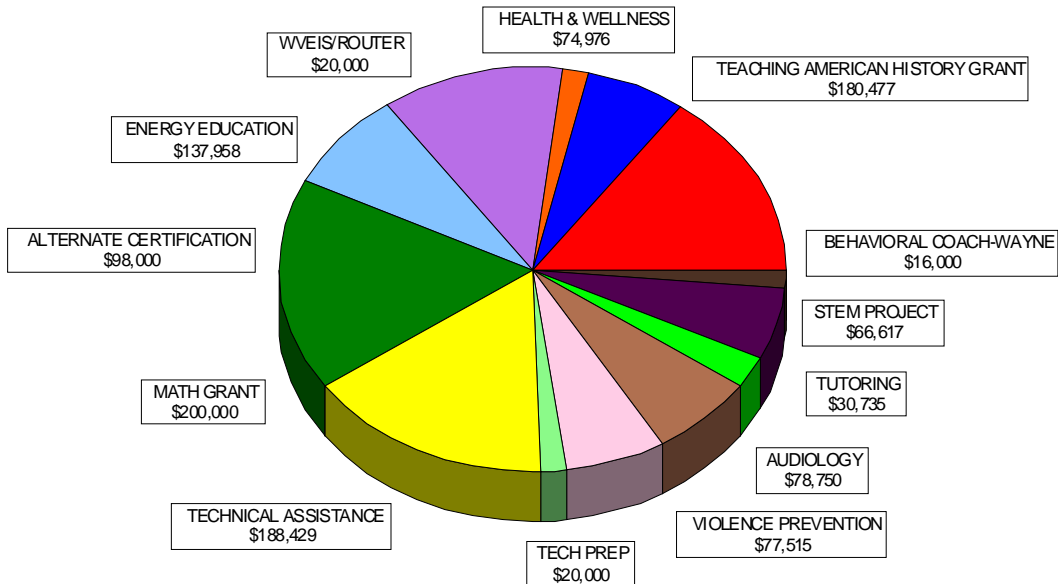
RESA 2 PROGRAM ALLOCATIONS

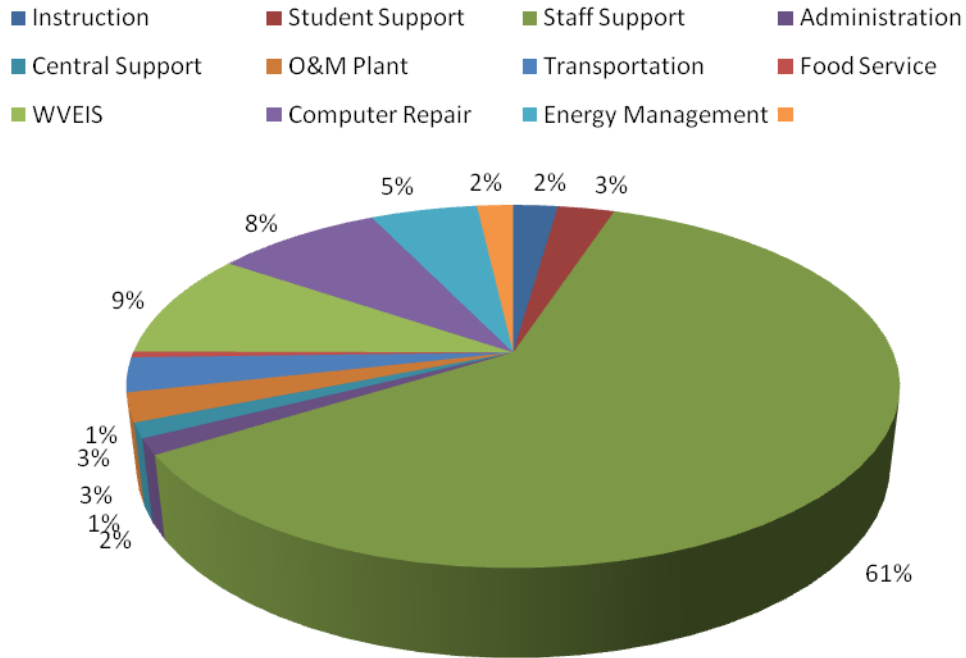


RESA 2 SUPPLEMENTARY GRANT FUNDS

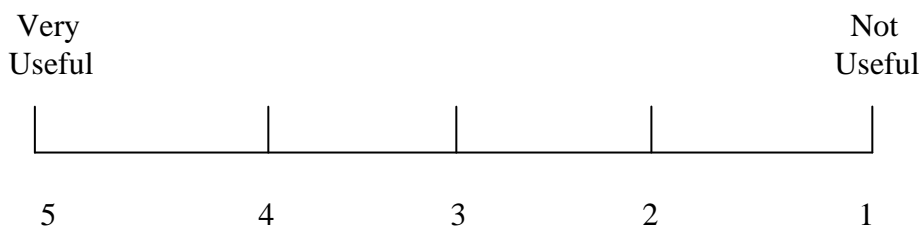

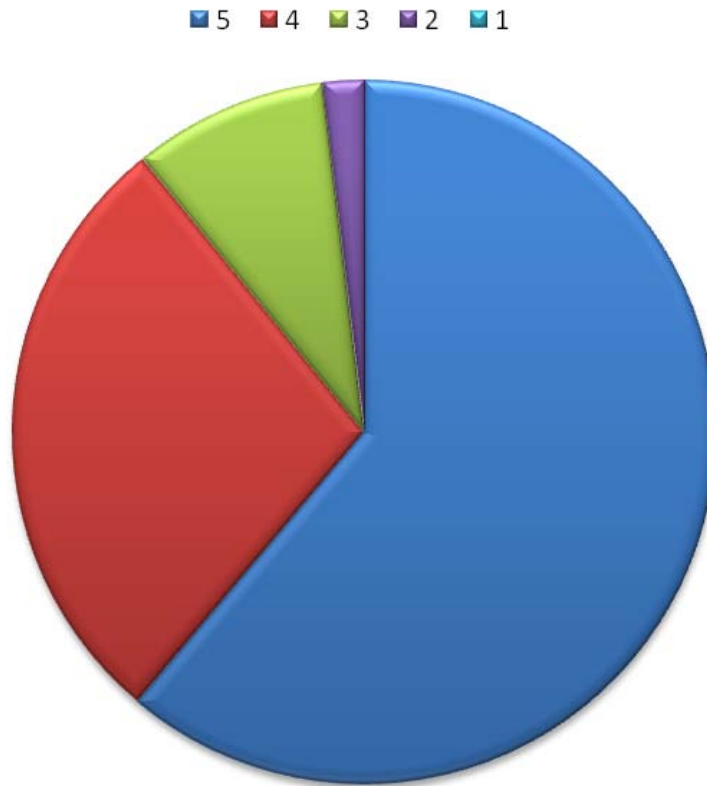
