20	ARTICLE 3. COMPETENCY OF WITNESSES.
21	§57-3-10. Reporters' Privilege.
22	(a) "Reporter" means a person who regularly gathers, prepares,
23	collects, photographs, records, writes, edits, reports, or
2.4	publishes news or information that concerns matters of public

- 2 of the person's livelihood or for substantial financial gain, or a
- 3 supervisor, or employer of that person in that capacity.
- 4 (b) No reporter may be compelled to:
- 5 (1) Testify in any civil, criminal, administrative or grand
- 6 jury proceeding in any court in this state concerning the source of
- 7 any published or unpublished information obtained by the reporter
- 8 in the course of the above described activities without the consent
- 9 of the source, unless such testimony is necessary to prevent
- 10 imminent death or serious bodily injury; or
- 11 (2) Produce any information or testimony that would identify
- 12 a confidential source, without the consent of the source, unless
- 13 <u>such testimony or information is necessary to prevent imminent</u>
- 14 death or serious bodily injury.
- 15 (c) Nothing in this section shall be read to limit any
- 16 existing constitutional protections afforded any person under the
- 17 United States or West Virginia Constitutions.
