13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
14	That §9-5-18 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
15	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
16	ARTICLE 5. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.
17	§9-5-18. Funeral and cremation expenses for indigent persons;
18	filing of affidavits to certify indigency and notice
19	to next of kin; penalties for false swearing; payment
20	by division.
21	(a) The Department of Health and Human Resources shall pay for
22	reasonable funeral service expenses for indigent persons, in an
23	amount not to exceed \$1,250.

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1 (b) For purposes of this section, the indigency of a deceased 2 person is determined by the filing of an affidavit with the 3 department, in a form provided by and determined in accordance with 4 the income guidelines as set forth by the department: (1) Signed 5 by the heir or heirs-at-law which states that the estate of the 6 deceased person is pecuniarily unable to pay the costs associated 7 with a funeral; or (2) signed by the county coroner or the county 8 health officer, the attending physician or other person signing the 9 death certificate or the state medical examiner stating that the 10 deceased person has no heirs or that heirs have not been located 11 after a reasonable search and that the deceased person had no 12 estate or the estate is pecuniarily unable to pay the costs 13 associated with a funeral.

14 (c) Payment shall be made by the department to the person or 15 persons who have furnished the services and supplies for the 16 indigent person's funeral expenses or to the persons who have 17 advanced payment for same, as the department may determine, 18 pursuant to appropriations for expenditures made by the Legislature 19 for such purpose.

20 (d) For purposes of this section, "reasonable funeral service 21 expenses" means expenses for services provided by a funeral 22 director for the disposition of human remains.

(e) A funeral director providing for the disposition of human
 remains under the provisions of this section is permitted to decide

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1 the type of services that will be rendered for the amount paid by
2 the department, including cremation. If the funeral director
3 elects to provide for the disposition of the human remains by
4 cremation, a reasonable effort must be made by the funeral director
5 to give notice to the next of kin, if any are known. If the next
6 of kin object to the cremation, the funeral director may proceed
7 with the cremation only if the next of kin are unwilling or unable
8 to pay the difference between the cost of cremation and the cost of
9 the type of service the next of kin desire.

10 <u>The funeral director shall execute an affidavit setting forth</u> 11 <u>the efforts made to notify the next of kin the intent to cremate</u> 12 <u>the remains of an individual. In no event may a cremation take</u> 13 <u>place sooner than twenty-four hours after the funeral director</u> 14 <u>receives the body.</u>

(e) (f) Any person who knowingly swears falsely in an affidavit required by this section shall be <u>is</u> guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon ronviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or confined here the county or regional jail for a period of not more than six months, or both <u>fined and confined.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize cremation of indigent persons by funeral directors and the payment of this service by the Department of Health and Human Resources.
