10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
11	adding thereto a new section, designated \$18A-4-8j, relating
12	to salary increases for school service employees based upon
13	residential housing costs.
14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
16	by adding thereto a new section, designated $\$18A-4-8j$ , to read as
17	follows:
18	ARTICLE 4. SALARIES, WAGES AND OTHER BENEFITS.
19	§18A-4-8j. Granting service personnel salary increases based on
20	housing costs.
21	Effective for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, every
22	eligible person employed as school service personnel with three or
23	more years of service shall receive an annual salary increase equal

1 to two percent of the employee's regular salary, if that employee 2 resides in a county where residential home prices are at least ten 3 percent above the statewide average for residential homes. Every 4 eliqible employee with three or more years of service shall receive 5 an annual salary increase equal to four percent of the employee's 6 regular salary, if that employee resides in a county where 7 residential home prices are at least twenty percent above the 8 statewide average for residential homes. These incremental 9 increases are in addition to any across-the-board, cost-of-living 10 or percentage salary increases which may be granted in any fiscal 11 year by the Legislature. And, every eligible employee with three 12 or more years of service shall receive an annual salary increase 13 equal to six percent of the employee's regular salary, if that 14 employee resides in a county where residential home prices are at 15 least thirty percent above the statewide average for residential 16 homes. If an eligible employee with three or more years of service resides in a county where residential home prices are more than 18 thirty percent above the statewide average for residential homes, 19 the employee shall receive an annual salary increase of two percent 20 of the employee's regular salary for every ten percent that 21 residential home prices in that employee's county exceed the 22 statewide average for residential homes.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide salary increases

for school service personnel based upon residential housing costs. The employee shall receive an annual salary increase of two percent of the employee's regular salary for every ten percent that residential home prices in that employee's county exceed the statewide average for residential homes.
