14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That $\$8-22-25$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 22. RETIREMENT BENEFITS GENERALLY; POLICEMEN'S PENSION
18	AND RELIEF FUND; FIREMEN'S PENSION AND RELIEF FUND;
19	PENSION PLANS FOR EMPLOYEES OF WATERWORKS SYSTEM,
20	SEWERAGE SYSTEM OR COMBINED WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE
21	SYSTEM.
22	§8-22-25. Retirement pensions.
23	(a) Any member of a paid police or fire department who is
24	entitled to a retirement pension hereunder, and who has been in the

1 honorable service of such department for twenty years, may, upon 2 written application to the board of trustees, be retired from all 3 service in such department without medical examination 4 disability. On such retirement the board of trustees shall 5 authorize the payment of annual retirement pension benefits 6 commencing upon his the member's retirement or upon his the 7 member's attaining the age of fifty years, whichever is later, 8 payable in twelve monthly installments for each year of the 9 remainder of his the member's life, in an amount equal to sixty 10 percent of such member's average annual salary or compensation 11 received during the three twelve-consecutive-month periods of 12 employment with such department in which such member received his 13 the member's highest salary or compensation while a member of the 14 department, or an amount of \$500 per month, whichever is greater. 15 (b) Any member of any such department who is entitled to a 16 retirement pension under the provisions of subsection (a) of this 17 section and who has been in the honorable service of such 18 department for more than twenty years at the time of his the 19 member's retirement shall receive, in addition to the sixty percent 20 authorized in said subsection (a) of this section: (1) Two additional percent, to be added to the sixty percent

22 for each of the first five additional years of service completed at 23 the time of retirement in excess of twenty years of service up to 24 a maximum of seventy percent; and

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- 1 (2) One additional percent, to be added to such maximum of 2 seventy percent, for each of the first five additional years of
- 3 service completed at the time of retirement in excess of twenty-
- 4 five years of service up to a maximum of seventy-five percent.
- 5 The total additional credit provided for in this subsection 6 may not exceed fifteen additional percent.
- 7 (c) Any member of any such department whose service has been 8 interrupted by duty with the Armed Forces of the United States as 9 provided in section twenty-seven of this article prior to July 1, 10 1981, shall be eligible for retirement pension benefits immediately 11 upon retirement, regardless of his the member's age, if he the 12 member shall otherwise be eligible for such retirement pension 13 benefits.
- Any member or previously retired member of any such department who has served in active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States as described in section twenty-seven of this article, whether prior to or subsequent to becoming a member of a paid police or fire department covered by the provisions of this article, shall receive, in addition to the sixty percent authorized in subsection (a) of this section and the additional percent credit authorized in subsection (b) of this section, one additional percent for each year so served in active military duty, up to a maximum of four additional percent. In no event, however, may the total benefit granted to any member exceed seventy-five percent of

- 1 the member's annual average salary calculated in accordance with 2 subsection (a) of this section.
- (d) Any member of a paid police or fire department shall be 4 retired at the age of sixty-five years in the manner provided in When a member of the paid police or fire 5 this subsection. 6 department reaches the age of sixty-five years, the said board of 7 trustees shall notify the mayor of this fact, within thirty days of 8 such member's sixty-fifth birthday. The mayor shall cause such 9 sixty-five- year- old member of the paid police or fire department 10 to retire within a period of not more than thirty additional days. 11 Upon retirement under the provisions of this subsection, such 12 member shall receive retirement pension benefits payable in twelve 13 monthly installments for each year of the remainder of his the 14 member's life in an amount equal to sixty percent of such member's 15 average annual salary or compensation received during the three 16 twelve-consecutive-month periods of employment with such department 17 in which such member received his the member's highest salary or 18 compensation while a member of the department, or an amount of \$500 19 per month, whichever is greater. If such member has been employed 20 in said department for more than twenty years, the provisions of 21 subsection (b) of this section shall apply.
- (e) It shall be the duty of each member of a paid police or 23 fire department at the time a fund is hereafter established to 24 furnish the necessary proof of his the member's date of birth to

1 the said board of trustees, as specified in section twenty-three of 2 this article, within a reasonable length of time, said length of 3 time to be determined by the said board of trustees. 4 board of trustees and the mayor shall proceed to act in the manner 5 provided in subsection (d) of this section and shall cause all 6 members of the paid police or fire department who are over the age 7 of sixty-five years to retire in not less than sixty days from the 8 date the fund is established. Upon retirement under the provisions 9 of this subsection (e), such member, whether he the member has been 10 employed in said department for twenty years or not, shall receive 11 retirement pension benefits payable in twelve monthly installments 12 for each year of the remainder of his the member's life in an 13 amount equal to sixty percent of such member's average annual compensation received during the 14 salary or three twelve-15 consecutive-month periods of employment with such department in 16 which such member received his the member's highest salary or 17 compensation while a member of the department, or an amount of \$500 18 per month, whichever is greater. If such member has been employed 19 in said department for more than twenty years, the provisions of 20 subsection (b) of this section shall apply.

21 (f) Notwithstanding any provision in the code to the contrary,
22 a retired member may serve as a chief of police beyond the age of
23 sixty-five while continuing to receive retirement benefits.
24 However, in such an instance, the retired member is not eligible to

- 1 continue his or her participation as a contributing member of the
- 2 pension fund and shall not continue to accrue any additional
- 3 service credit or benefits in the pension fund related to the
- 4 continued service.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit a retired police officer to be hired as a chief of police and continue to receive retirement benefits. The bill also limits such a person from paying into or to accrue any additional benefits related to the continued service.
