SPEED RESTRICTIONS. 18 §17C-6-3. When local authorities may alter speed limits. 19 (a) At intersection. -- Whenever local authorities within 20 their respective jurisdictions determine upon the basis of an 21 engineering and traffic investigation that the speed permitted 22 under this chapter at any intersection is greater than is 23 reasonable or safe under the conditions found to exist at such 24 intersection, such local authority subject to subsection (e) (f) of

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- 1 this section shall determine and declare a reasonable and safe 2 speed limit thereat, which shall be effective at all times or
- 3 during hours of daylight or darkness or at such other times as may
- 4 be determined when appropriate speed limit signs giving notice
- 5 thereof are erected at such intersection or upon the approaches
- 6 thereto.
- 8 authority to increase twenty-five mile limit. -- Local 8 authorities in their respective jurisdictions may in their 9 discretion, but subject to subsection (e) (f) of this section, 10 authorize by ordinance higher speeds than those stated in section 11 one of this article upon through highways or upon highways or 12 portions thereof where there are no intersections or between widely 13 spaced intersections, which higher speed shall be effective at all 14 times or during hours of daylight or at such other times as may be 15 determined when appropriate speed limit signs are erected giving 16 notice of the authorized speed, but local authorities shall not 17 have authority to modify or alter the basic rule set forth in 18 subsection (a), section one of this article, or in any event to 19 authorize by ordinance a speed in excess of fifty-five miles per 20 hour.

- 23 under the conditions found to exist upon the street or highway, the

- 4 (e) (f) Alteration of limits on state highways in
- 5 municipalities. -- Alteration of limits on state highways or
- 6 extensions thereof in a municipality by local authorities shall not
- 7 be effective until such alteration has been approved by the
- 8 Commissioner of Highways.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to give local authorities the authority to decrease the speed limit on streets and highways where school buses travel.
