- 3 §4-1-24. Seventy-two hour budget review.
- 4 (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the
- 5 "Seventy-Two-Hour Budget Review Act."
- 6 (b) Legislative finding. -- The Legislature finds that public
- 7 participation in the legislative process improves the quality of
- 8 proposed legislation by allowing the opportunity for its detailed
- 9 review by interested parties. The opportunity for a detailed
- 10 review by the public prior to votes on legislation helps increase
- 11 public trust in government and enhances respect for the Legislature
- 12 by ensuring that its operation is conducted with the openness,
- 13 order, and dignity befitting West Virginia. It is the intent of
- 14 the Legislature, therefore, to prohibit votes on a final budget
- 15 bill until seventy-two hours after the bill has been made publicly
- 16 available.
- 17 (c) For the purpose of this section, the following terms shall
- 18 be defined:
- 19 (1) "Budget bill" means any bill authorizing an appropriation
- 20 of funds for state operating, capital or transportation expenses.
- 21 (2) "Amendment" means any proposed change in a bill.

- 1 (3) "Publicly available" means posting a bill on the
- 2 Legislature's website and its publication in a bill report,
- 3 committee report or conference report.
- 4 (d) Any vote for final passage of a state budget bill shall be
- 5 prohibited until seventy-two hours after the bill is made publicly
- 6 available. The seventy-two hour time period excludes Saturdays,
- 7 Sundays and holidays except when the legislative body considering
- 8 the bill is in session on that day.
- 9 (e) Amendments offered to a budget bill shall not be
- 10 considered in order unless made publicly available twenty-four
- 11 hours prior to any vote. The twenty-four hour time period excludes
- 12 Saturdays, Sundays and holidays except when the legislative body
- 13 considering the bill is in session on that day.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require a budget bill to be made publicly available for seventy-two hours prior to voting on final passage. The bill also requires any amendments be made publicly available twenty-four hours prior to any vote.

This section is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
