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1	(a) The division, in consultation with the Veteran's Council,

20 <u>the Legislature on Veterans Affairs on October 1, annually, on the</u> 21 <u>progress towards implementing and administering the program</u> 22 established in this section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is establish a program to promote veteran friendly communities; the bill provides that the

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Division of Veterans Affairs, in consultation with the Veteran's Council, shall establish a program to assist and encourage the development, availability and utilization of veteran friendly services, benefits and assistance available to veterans in communities in this state.

This section is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.

This bill was recommended for introduction and passage during the 2011 Regular Session of the Legislature by the Select Committee on Veterans' Affairs - Interim.
