10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
11	adding thereto a new section, designated \$17C-14-15, relating
12	to establishing the misdemeanor offense of operating a motor
13	vehicle while sending, reading or receiving a text message;
14	providing exceptions; providing definitions; and establishing
15	misdemeanor criminal penalties.
16	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
17	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
18	by adding thereto a new section, designated §17C-14-15, to read as
19	follows:
20	ARTICLE 14. MISCELLANEOUS RULES.
21	§17C-14-15. Writing, sending or reading a text message by means of
22	a wireless communications device while driving
23	unlawful; definitions; exceptions; penalties.
24	(a) Except as provided in subdivision (b) of this section, a

- 1 person may not operate a motor vehicle while writing, sending or
- 2 reading a text message by means of a wireless communications
- 3 device.
- 4 (b) The provisions of this section do not apply to a driver
- 5 who is writing, sending or reading a text message by means of a
- 6 wireless communications device while operating a motor vehicle
- 7 when:
- 8 <u>(1) The driver is writing, sending or reading a text message</u>
- 9 by means of a wireless communications device when is necessary for
- 10 the driver to contact law-enforcement officials or other emergency
- 11 services ; or
- 12 (2) Acting in the course and scope of his or her employment
- 13 as an emergency services personnel, the driver is responding to an
- 14 emergency situation while operating an authorized emergency
- 15 vehicle, as defined in section six, article one of this chapter.
- 16 (c) The provisions of this section do not apply to any person
- 17 under the age of eighteen with a level one or level two graduated
- 18 driver's license who operates a motor vehicle pursuant to section
- 19 three-a, article two, chapter seventeen-b of this code.
- 20 (d) As used in this section:
- 21 (1) "Driving" or "operating a motor vehicle" means operating
- 22 a motor vehicle, with the motor running, including while
- 23 temporarily stationary because of traffic, a traffic control
- 24 device, or other momentary delays, but does not include operating

- 1 a motor vehicle when the driver moved the vehicle to the side of,
- 2 or off, a highway and halted in a location where the vehicle can
- 3 safely remain stationary;
- 4 (2) "Electronic device" means and includes, but is not limited
- 5 to, a cellular telephone, personal digital assistant, pager,
- 6 computer, or any other device used to input, write, send, receive,
- 7 or read text. An "electronic device" does not include:
- 8 (A) Voice radios, mobile radios, land mobile radios,
- 9 commercial mobile radios or two-way radios with the capability to
- 10 transmit and receive voice transmissions utilizing a "push to talk"
- 11 or "press to transmit" function; or
- 12 (B) Other voice radios used by a law-enforcement officer, an
- 13 emergency services provider, an employee or agent of public safety
- 14 organizations, first responders, Amateur Radio Operators (HAM)
- 15 licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and school bus
- 16 operators;
- 17 (3) "Writing, sending or reading a text message by means of
- 18 a wireless communications device" means manually entering
- 19 alphanumeric text into, or reading text from, an electronic device,
- 20 including, but not limited to, short message service, e-mailing,
- 21 <u>instant messaging</u>, a command or request to access a World Wide Web
- 22 page, or engaging in any other form of electronic text revival or
- 23 entry, for present or future communication, but does not include:
- 24 (A) Reading, selecting or entering a telephone number, an

- 1 extension number, or voicemail retrieval codes and commands into an
- 2 electronic device for the purpose of initiating or receiving a
- 3 phone call or using voice commands to initiate or receive a
- 4 telephone call;
- 5 (B) Inputting, selecting, or reading information on a global
- 6 positioning system or navigation system; or
- 7 (C) Using a device capable of performing multiple functions,
- 8 including fleet management systems, dispatching devices, smart
- 9 phones, citizens band radios, music players, for a purpose that is
- 10 not otherwise prohibited in this section.
- 11 (e) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection (a)
- 12 of this section is quilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction
- 13 thereof, shall for a first offense be fined \$50; for a second
- 14 offense be fined \$100; and for a third or subsequent offense be
- 15 fined \$200. No court costs or other fees shall be assessed for a
- 16 violation of subsection (a).
- 17 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the
- 18 contrary, points may not be entered on any driver's record
- 19 maintained by the Division of Motor Vehicles as a result of a
- 20 violation of this section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the misdemeanor offense of operating a motor vehicle while writing, sending or reading a text message by means of a wireless communications device.

This section is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
