20	(a) Any time that the West Virginia State Police requires a
21	State Police Officer (inclusive of the ranks of trooper to
22	sergeant) during their off-duty hours, to be restricted as to where
23	he or she may go, or what he or she may do in order that he or she
2/1	may quickly return to duty the officer shall be naid the minimum

- 1 wage as determined in section two, article fifteen-c, chapter
- 2 twenty-one of this code for every hour which he or she is on call.
- 3 This code section pertains to nonexempt State Police Officers as
- 4 <u>defined under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA)</u>. This pay is not
- 5 <u>subject to retirement deduction or used in retirement annuity</u>
- 6 calculations.
- 7 (b) State Police Officers who are off-duty and called back to
- 8 work by the West Virginia State Police or required to appear in
- 9 court, shall be guaranteed a minimum of two hours' work or actual
- 10 hours worked, whichever is greater.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to compensate state troopers for off-duty time when they are required to be on standby to be called back to work.
