13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
14	That §8-22-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
15	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
16	ARTICLE 22. RETIREMENT BENEFITS GENERALLY; POLICEMEN'S PENSION
17	AND RELIEF FUND; FIREMEN'S PENSION AND RELIEF
18	FUND; PENSION PLANS FOR EMPLOYEES OF WATERWORKS
19	SYSTEM, SEWERAGE SYSTEM OR COMBINED WATERWORKS AND
20	SEWERAGE SYSTEM.
21	PART II. GENERAL RETIREMENT SYSTEMS FOR CLASS I, II AND III
22	CITIES.
23	\$8-22-2. Class I, II and III cities empowered and authorized to
24	establish and maintain "employees retirement and
25	benefit fund" or to maintain such fund heretofore
26	established.
27	Every Class I, II and III city which is not a participating
28	public employer in the said West Virginia Public Employees

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1 Retirement System is hereby empowered and authorized to and may 2 establish and maintain an "Employees Retirement and Benefit Fund" 3 in accordance with the provisions of this section two and sections 4 three through fourteen of this article. Any Class I, II and III 5 city which has heretofore established such a fund in accordance 6 with the Acts of the Legislature referred to in section fifteen of 7 this article may continue to maintain said fund in accordance with 8 the provisions of this section two and sections three through 9 fourteen of this article, or said acts, as specified in said 10 section fifteen, <u>and such municipal employee retirement funds</u> 11 <u>heretofore established which are not participating public employers</u> 12 <u>in the state retirement system shall share the same tax exempt</u> 13 <u>status as their police and firemen's pension systems so that</u> 14 <u>retirement pensions received by such municipal employees are</u> 15 uniformly exempt from taxation.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make municipal self-funded pensions tax exempt.
