15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That $\$15-2-3$ and $\$15-2-5$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,

18	ARTICLE 2. WEST VIRGINIA STATE POLICE.
19	§15-2-3. State police structure; how established.
20	(a) The superintendent shall create, appoint and equip the
21	State Police which shall consist of the number of troops, districts
22	and detachments required for the proper administration of the State
23	Police. Each troop, district or detachment shall be composed of
24	the number of officers and members the superintendent determines
25	are necessary to meet operational needs and are required for the
26	efficient operation of the State Police.

- 1 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other section of
- 2 this code and pursuant to amendments made to this section during
- 3 the 2011 regular session of the Legislature, the superintendent
- 4 shall implement a program to increase the number of state troopers

- (e) Each member of the West Virginia State Police whose salary is fixed and specified pursuant to this section shall receive, and is entitled to, an increase in salary over that set forth in subsection (d) of this section for grade in rank, based on length of service, including that service served before and after the effective date of this section with the West Virginia State Police as follows: At the end of two years of service with the West Virginia State Police, the member shall receive a salary increase of \$400 \$580 to be effective during his or her next year of service and a like increase at yearly intervals thereafter, with the increases to be cumulative.
- (f) In applying the salary schedules set forth in this section
 the where salary increases are provided for length of service, members
 the of the West Virginia State Police in service at the time the
 schedules become effective shall be given credit for prior service
 and shall be paid the salaries the same length of service entitles
 them to receive under the provisions of this section.
- 20 (g) The Legislature finds and declares that because of the 21 unique duties of members of the West Virginia State Police, it is 22 not appropriate to apply the provisions of state wage and hour laws 23 to them. The authority of the superintendent to propose a legislative rule or amendment thereto for promulgation in accordance with article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to establish the number of hours per month which constitute the standard work month for the members of the West Virginia State Police is hereby continued. The rule shall further establish, on a graduated hourly basis, the criteria for receipt of a portion or all of supplemental payment when hours are worked in excess of the standard work month. The superintendent shall certify monthly to the West Virginia State Police's payroll officer the names of those members who have worked in excess of the standard work month and the amount of their entitlement to supplemental payment. The supplemental payment may not exceed \$236 monthly. The superintendent and civilian employees

- (h) Each member of the West Virginia State Police, except the superintendent and civilian employees, shall execute, before entering upon the discharge of his or her duties, a bond with security in the sum of \$5,000 payable to the State of West Virginia, conditioned upon the faithful performance of his or her duties, and the bond shall be approved as to form by the Attorney General and as to sufficiency by the Governor.
- 8 (i) In consideration for compensation paid by the West 9 Virginia State Police to its members during those members' 10 participation in the West Virginia State Police Cadet Training 11 Program pursuant to section eight, article twenty-nine, chapter 12 thirty of this code, the West Virginia State Police may require of 13 its members by written agreement entered into with each of them in 14 advance of such participation in the program that, if a member 15 should voluntarily discontinue employment any time within one year 16 immediately following completion of the training program, he or she 17 shall be obligated to pay to the West Virginia State Police a pro 18 rata portion of such compensation equal to that part of such year 19 which the member has chosen not to remain in the employ of the West 20 Virginia State Police.
- 21 (j) Any member of the West Virginia State Police who is called 22 to perform active duty training or inactive duty training in the 23 National Guard or any reserve component of the Armed Forces of the 24 United States annually shall be granted, upon request, leave time

- 1 not to exceed thirty calendar days for the purpose of performing
- 2 the active duty training or inactive duty training and the time
- 3 granted may not be deducted from any leave accumulated as a member
- 4 of the West Virginia State Police.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide for an increase and establish a minimum number of troopers to provide basic law enforcement services. The bill further provides that members of the West Virginia State Police shall receive a \$580 salary increase at the end of two years of service.
