21	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Any recipient of monthly retirement benefits from any public 3 4 retirement plan in this state may authorize that a deduction from 5 his or her monthly benefits be made for the payment of membership 6 dues or fees to a retiree association. The deductions shall be 7 authorized on a form provided by the Consolidated Public Retirement (a) The identity and social security 8 Board and shall include: 9 number of the retiree; (b) the amount and frequency of the 10 deduction; (c) the identity and address of the association to which 11 the dues or fees shall be paid; and (d) the signature of the 12 retiree. Upon execution of the authorization and its receipt by 13 the Consolidated Public Retirement Board, Any retiree association 14 so authorized shall certify to the Consolidated Public Retirement 15 Board the current rate of monthly dues. The deduction shall be 16 made in the manner certified by the designated retiree association 17 on the tenth day of each month: Provided, That the deduction may 18 not be made more frequently than monthly. Deduction authorizations 19 may be revoked at any time at least thirty days prior to the date 20 on which the deduction is regularly made and on a form to be 21 provided by the Consolidated Public Retirement Board.

- Notwithstanding the provisions of section twenty-one, article
- 23 eight, chapter five-a of this code to the contrary, a retiree
- 24 association is entitled to mail information and voluntary

1 membership applications and dues deduction cards to eligible 2 beneficiaries of any public retirement plan, including retirees of 3 the Public Employees Retirement System, Deputy Sheriff Retirement 4 System, any Policemen's or Firemen's Pension and Retirement Fund, 5 Municipal Employees Retirement and Benefit Fund, West Virginia 6 State Police Retirement System, Emergency Medical Services 7 Retirement System, State Teachers Retirement System, Teachers' 8 Defined Contribution Retirement System and the Retirement System 9 for Judges of Courts of Record. The retiree association shall pay 10 all costs associated with its mailings. The Consolidated Public 11 Retirement Board and any retiree organization under this section 12 shall agree on the method of providing a list of plan beneficiaries 13 and their addresses to accomplish the mailings while preserving the 14 confidentiality of the list. The agreement may include providing 15 the list to a third party in the business of providing mailing 16 services if the third party agrees to maintain the confidentiality 17 of the list. The Consolidated Public Retirement Board is not 18 responsible or liable to retired beneficiaries for providing the 19 names and addresses as provided in this section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the Consolidated Public Retirement Board to deduct from monthly benefits to retirees sums to pay retiree association dues. This is accomplished by changing existing statute and permitting retiree associations to receive dues by certifying to the Consolidated Public Retirement Board the amount of current dues without a retiree's written approval which is currently necessary. The bill also requires the

Consolidated Public Retirement Board and all other public retirement systems in the state to provide retiree associations or organizations lists of plan beneficiaries and addresses for blind mailings purposes. This is currently prohibited by the provisions of \$5A-8-21, enacted in 2004.
