2 §60A-3-309. Restrictions on dispensing oxycontin and fentanyl 3 patches; penalties; felony for third conviction.

4 <u>(a) No person may prescribe, nor may a person possess,</u> 5 <u>oxycontin extended release or fentanyl patches unless those items</u> 6 <u>contain naloxone to be released only on alteration of the delivery</u> 7 <u>vehicle. These two items must be directly prescribed by a licensed</u> 8 <u>practitioner with Schedule II privileges and directly monitored by</u> 9 a licensed physician or nurse at least monthly.

10 (b) Any person that violates this section is quilty of a 11 misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be confined in jail 12 for not less than ten days nor more than sixty days. If a person 13 violates this section for a second offense, the person is quilty of 14 a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be confined in 15 jail for not less than thirty days nor more than six months. Any 16 person violating this section for a subsequent offense, the person 17 is quilty of a felony and, upon conviction thereof, shall be 18 confined in a correctional facility for not less than one year nor 19 more than two years.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prevent the abuse of oxycontin extended release and fentanyl by requiring those substances contain naloxone to be released only on alteration of the delivery vehicle. The bill requires those substances be directly prescribed by a licensed practitioner with Schedule II privileges and directly monitored by a licensed physician or nurse at least monthly. The bill also provides for penalties, including being a felony for third and subsequent convictions.
