20	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
21	That §4-11A-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
22	be amended and reenacted; that $\$19-1-4$ of said code be amended and
23	reenacted; and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new

24 section, designated \$19-1-4e , all to read as follows:

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CHAPTER 4. THE LEGISLATURE.

2 ARTICLE 11A. LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATION OF TOBACCO SETTLEMENT 3 FUNDS.

4 §4-11A-3. Receipt of settlement funds and required deposit in the 5 West Virginia Tobacco Settlement Fund.

6 (a) There is hereby created <u>continued</u> in the State Treasury a 7 special revenue account, designated the Tobacco Settlement Fund, 8 which <u>shall be</u> <u>is</u> an interest-bearing account and may be invested 9 in the manner permitted by the provisions of article six, chapter 10 twelve of this code, with the interest income a proper credit to 11 the fund. Unless contrary to federal law, fifty percent of all 12 revenues received pursuant to the master settlement agreement shall 13 be deposited in this fund. These funds shall be available only 14 upon appropriation by the Legislature as part of the state budget: 15 *Provided*, That for the fiscal year 2000, the first \$5 million 16 received into the fund shall be transferred to the Public Employees 17 Insurance Reserve Fund created in article two, chapter five-a of 18 this code.

19 (b) Appropriations from the Tobacco Settlement Fund are 20 limited to expenditures for the following purposes:

(1) Reserve funds for continued support of the programs
22 offered by the Public Employees Insurance Agency established in
23 article sixteen, chapter five of this code;

24 (2) Funding for expansion of the federal-state Medicaid

1 program as authorized by the Legislature or mandated by the federal
2 government;

3 (3) Funding for public health programs, services and agencies;4 and

5 (4) Funding for any state-owned or operated health facilities;6 and

7 (5) Five million dollars for the Transition Program for
8 Tobacco Farmers provided in section four-e, article one, chapter
9 nineteen of this code.

10 (c) Notwithstanding anything in this code to the contrary, on 11 the effective date of the sale of the state's share to the 12 authority as authorized in this article, the deposits and transfers 13 provided in this section shall cease and no longer be required.

14 <u>(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of section two, article</u> 15 <u>two, chapter twelve of this code, moneys within the Tobacco</u> 16 <u>Settlement Trust Fund may not be redesignated for any purpose other</u> 17 <u>than those set forth in this section.</u>

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CHAPTER 19. AGRICULTURE.

19 ARTICLE 1. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

20 §19-1-4. Duties of commissioner.

21 The Commissioner of Agriculture shall perform the following 22 duties:

(a) Devise means of advancing the agricultural interests of24 the state and, in the performance of such duty, he or she shall

1 have authority to may call upon any state department, or officer of 2 the state or county, to cooperate in promoting the agricultural 3 interests of the state. It shall be is the duty of any such 4 department, or officer, upon request of the commissioner to render 5 the assistance desired;

6 (b) Promote and encourage the organization of such societies 7 and associations as that have for their object the improvement and 8 development of the state's agricultural, horticultural and kindred 9 interests, especially in production, processing for market and 10 distribution;

(c) Conduct cooperative work with the United States Department Agriculture in inspecting and determining the grade and condition of farm produce at collecting centers, receiving centers and shipping points;

15 (d) Induce the investment of capital in, and immigration into, 16 this state by the dissemination of information relative to the 17 soil, climate, health, natural resources, market opportunities and 18 advantages of the state;

(e) Investigate and report upon the kinds, conditions and20 extent of the mineral products of the state and their value;

21 (f) Take charge of the museum of the Department of 22 Agriculture, collect, preserve and exhibit therein <u>in the museum</u> 23 specimens of agricultural, horticultural and kindred products, 24 products of the forests, minerals, flora and fauna of the state;

1 (g) Publish and distribute, from time to time, such reports 2 and bulletins concerning agriculture, horticulture and kindred 3 subjects as may be of value to the farmers of the state and, as 4 conditions may demand, publish a handbook giving the resources of 5 the several counties of the state, the varieties of soil and 6 products, both mineral and vegetable, and the adaptability of the 7 different sections of the state to the different branches of 8 agriculture, horticulture and kindred interests;

9 <u>(h) Assist farmers to make the transition from growing tobacco</u> 10 <u>to growing other crops or pursuing other agricultural-related</u> 11 <u>businesses through the Transition Program for Farmers provided in</u> 12 <u>section four-e of this article;</u>

13 (h) (i) Submit a biennial report to the Governor and 14 Legislature containing such information as to the operations of the 15 department as may be helpful to the agricultural interests of the 16 state, together with an itemized statement of all receipts and 17 disbursements during the biennial period covered thereby by the 18 <u>report</u> and giving the name of every person employed during such the 19 period, the time employed and the amount paid each employee;

20 (i) (j) Perform such other duties and exercise such other 21 powers as are provided in this chapter and by general law; and 22 (j) (k) Propose rules, including regulatory standards, for 23 legislative approval in accordance with the provisions of article 24 three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code for the purpose of

1 carrying out the requirements of this chapter.

2 §19-1-4e. Transition program for tobacco farmers; creation of 3 special revenue account.

4 (a) The commissioner shall propose rules for legislative 5 approval in accordance with the provisions of article three, 6 chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, designed to establish and 7 implement the transition program for tobacco farmers, no later than 8 September 1, 2011. The program's primary purpose is to assist 9 tobacco farmers in the transition from growing tobacco to growing 10 other crops or pursuing other agricultural-related businesses. In 11 addition to the authority granted in section four-a of this 12 article, the commissioner is authorized to accept grants and incur 13 indebtedness to fund the program.

(b) There is created in the State Treasury a special revenue for account, designated the "Transition Program for Tobacco Farmers' Fund." No later than September 1, 2011, \$5 million shall be transferred from the Tobacco Settlement Fund provided under section three, article eleven-a, chapter four of this code to the pransition Program for Tobacco Farmers' Fund which shall be allocated for use in the program's initial three-year phase. The Transition Program for Tobacco Farmers' Fund may also receive grants and loans or other sources of funding as provided under section four-a of this article, at the commissioner's discretion, and the commissioner shall administer the fund in accordance with

1 the purposes of the Transition Program for Tobacco Farmers' Fund.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide a system to assist farmers to make the transition from growing tobacco to growing other crops or pursuing other agricultural endeavors. The bill includes provisions which create the "Transition Program for Tobacco Farmers" as well as the "Transition Program for Tobacco Farmers' Fund." The bill also provides for use of the Tobacco Settlement Fund for the program.
