**Senate Bill No. 364**

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by  
adding thereto a new section, designated §61-6-15, relating to  
crimes against the peace; unlawful protest activities that  
disturb or disrupt a funeral or burial service; and criminal  
penalties.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended  
by adding thereto a new section, designated §61-6-15, to read as  
follows:

**ARTICLE 6. CRIMES AGAINST THE PEACE.**

**§61-6-15. Unlawful protest activities disturbing or disrupting a  
funeral or burial service; penalty.**

(a) No person may picket or engage in other protest activities  
and an association or corporation may not cause picketing or other  
protest activities to occur within three hundred feet of the

1 property line of any residence, cemetery, funeral home, church,  
2 synagogue or other establishment during or within one hour before  
3 or one hour after the conducting of a funeral or burial service at  
4 that place.

5 (b) For the purpose of this section, "other protest  
6 activities" means any action that is disruptive or that is  
7 undertaken to disrupt or disturb a funeral or burial service.

8 (c) Any person who violates the provisions of this section is  
9 guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction for the first offense  
10 thereof, shall be fined not more than \$1,000, or confined in jail  
11 not more than thirty days, or both fined and confined. Upon a  
12 second or subsequent conviction, any such person shall be fined not  
13 more than \$5,000, or confined in jail not more than one year, or  
14 both fined and confined.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide that unlawful protest activities that disturb or disrupt a funeral or burial service are crimes against the peace. The bill provides misdemeanor criminal penalties.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
