WEST VIRGINIA MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT. 24 §30-3-10a. Special volunteer medical license; civil immunity for 25 voluntary services rendered to indigents. 26 (a) There is hereby established a special volunteer medical

27 license for active physicians, physicians retired or retiring from

1 the active practice of medicine who wish to donate their expertise 2 for the medical care and treatment of indigent and needy patients 3 in the clinic setting of clinics organized, in whole or in part, 4 for the delivery of health care services without charge. 5 special volunteer medical license shall be issued by the West 6 Virginia Board of Medicine to physicians licensed or otherwise 7 eligible for licensure under this article and the rules promulgated 8 hereunder without the payment of any application fee, license fee 9 or renewal fee, shall be issued for a fiscal year or part thereof, 10 and shall be renewable annually. The board shall 11 application forms for the special license provided in 12 subsection which shall contain the physician's acknowledgment that: 13 (1) The physician's practice under the special volunteer medical 14 license will be exclusively and totally devoted to providing 15 medical care to needy and indigent persons in West Virginia; (2) 16 the physician will not receive any payment or compensation, either 17 direct or indirect, or have the expectation of any payment or 18 compensation, for any medical services rendered under the special 19 volunteer medical license; (3) the physician will supply any 20 supporting documentation that the board may reasonably require; and 21 (4) the physician agrees to continue to participate in continuing 22 medical education as required of physicians in active practice.

(b) Any physician who renders any medical service to indigent 24 and needy patients of a clinic organized, in whole or in part, for 25 the delivery of health care services without charge under a special 26 volunteer medical license authorized under subsection (a) of this 27 section without payment or compensation or the expectation or

- 1 promise of payment or compensation is immune from liability for any 2 civil action arising out of any act or omission resulting from the 3 rendering of the medical service at the clinic unless the act or 4 omission was the result of the physician's gross negligence or 5 willful misconduct. In order for the immunity under this subsection 6 to apply, there must be a written agreement between the physician 7 and the clinic pursuant to which the physician will provide 8 voluntary noncompensated medical services under the control of the 9 clinic to patients of the clinic before the rendering of any 10 services by the physician at the clinic: Provided, That any clinic 11 entering into such written agreement shall be required to maintain 12 liability coverage of not less than \$1 million per occurrence.
- (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, a clinic organized, in whole or in part, for the delivery of health care services without charge shall not be relieved from imputed liability for the negligent acts of a physician rendering voluntary medical services at or for the clinic under a special volunteer medical license authorized under subsection (a) of this section.
- 20 (d) For purposes of this section, "otherwise eligible for 21 licensure" means the satisfaction of all the requirements for 22 licensure as listed in section ten of this article and in the 23 legislative rules promulgated hereunder, except the fee 24 requirements of subsections (b) and (d) of said section and of the 25 legislative rule promulgated by the board relating to fees.
- 26 (e) Nothing in this section may be construed as requiring the 27 board to issue a special volunteer medical license to any physician

whose medical license is or has been subject to any disciplinary action or to any physician who has surrendered a medical license or caused such license to lapse, expire and become invalid in lieu of having a complaint initiated or other action taken against his or her medical license, or who has elected to place a medical license in inactive status in lieu of having a complaint initiated or other action taken against his or her medical license, or who have been denied a medical license.

(f) Any policy or contract of liability insurance providing 10 coverage for liability sold, issued or delivered in this state to 11 any physician covered under the provisions of this article shall be 12 read so as to contain a provision or endorsement whereby the 13 company issuing such policy waives or agrees not to assert as a 14 defense on behalf of the policyholder or any beneficiary thereof, 15 to any claim covered by the terms of such policy within the policy 16 limits, the immunity from liability of the insured by reason of the 17 care and treatment of needy and indigent patients by a physician 18 who holds a special volunteer medical license: Provided, That this 19 subsection shall not apply to a terminated policy, terminated 20 contract of liability insurance or extended reporting endorsement 21 attached thereto that provides "tail insurance" as defined by 22 section two, article twenty-d, chapter thirty-three of this code: 23 Provided further, That nothing within this subsection shall be 24 construed to extend coverage under a terminated policy or 25 terminated contract of liability insurance or any extended 26 reporting endorsement attached thereto to: (1) Alter or amend the 27 effective policy period of any policy, contract of liability

- 4 ARTICLE 14. OSTEOPATHIC PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS.
- 5 §30-14-12b. Special volunteer medical license; civil immunity for voluntary services rendered to indigents.
- (a) There is hereby established a special volunteer medical 8 license for active physicians, physicians retired or retiring from 9 the active practice of osteopathy who wish to donate their 10 expertise for the medical care and treatment of indigent and needy 11 patients in the clinic setting of clinics organized, in whole or in 12 part, for the delivery of health care services without charge. The 13 special volunteer medical license shall be issued by the West 14 Virginia Board of Osteopathy to physicians licensed or otherwise 15 eligible for licensure under this article and the rules promulgated 16 hereunder without the payment of any application fee, license fee 17 or renewal fee, shall be issued for a fiscal year or part thereof, 18 and shall be renewable annually. The board shall develop 19 application forms for the special license provided in this 20 subsection which shall contain the physician's acknowledgment that: 21 (1) The physician's practice under the special volunteer medical 22 license will be exclusively and totally devoted to providing 23 medical care to needy and indigent persons in West Virginia; (2) 24 the physician will not receive any payment or compensation, either 25 direct or indirect, or have the expectation of any payment or 26 compensation, for any medical services rendered under the special 27 volunteer medical license; (3) the physician will supply any

- (f) Any policy or contract of liability insurance providing 18 coverage for liability sold, issued or delivered in this state to 19 any physician covered under the provisions of this article shall be 20 read so as to contain a provision or endorsement whereby the 21 company issuing such policy waives or agrees not to assert as a 22 defense on behalf of the policyholder or any beneficiary thereof, 23 to any claim covered by the terms of such policy within the policy 24 limits, the immunity from liability of the insured by reason of the 25 care and treatment of needy and indigent patients by a physician 26 who holds a special volunteer medical license.

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NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit practicing medical physicians and osteopathic physicians to apply for special volunteer medical licenses so they may donate their expertise for the medical care and treatment of indigent and needy patients in the clinic setting of clinics organized, in whole or in part, for the delivery of health care services without charge. At present only retired physicians and physicians about to retire may be granted these special licenses.
