A BILL to amend and reenact §60-3A-18 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to permitting the sale of liquor on election day.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §60-3A-18 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 3A. SALES BY RETAIL LIQUOR LICENSEES. §60-3A-18. Days and hours retail licensees may sell liquor.

- 1 Retail licensees may not sell liquor on Sundays and
- 2 Christmas or election day, or between the hours of twelve
- 3 midnight and eight o'clock a.m., except that wine and

- 4 fortified wines may be sold on such those days and at such
- 5 times as authorized in section thirty-four, article eight of this
- 6 chapter.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit the sale of liquor on election days.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
