H. B. 3271

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(Originating in the Committee on Finance) [February 25, 2011]

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §12-4-14a; and to amend said code by adding thereto a new section, designated §33-3-33a, all relating to the distribution of state funds to volunteer fire companies and departments generally; establishing the Volunteer Fire Department Workers' Compensation Premium Subsidy Fund; providing that the state auditor administer the distribution of moneys of the fund to volunteer and part volunteer fire companies and departments to

help defray workers' compensation insurance premium increases; providing additional funding from various sources; and requiring reviews, assessments and reports to the Legislature prior to termination of provisions.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §12-4-14a; and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §33-3-33a, all to read as follows:

CHAPTER 12. PUBLIC MONEYS AND SECURITIES.

ARTICLE 4. ACCOUNTS, REPORTS AND GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- §12-4-14a. Workers' Compensation Premium Subsidy for

 Volunteer Fire Departments; creation of

 Volunteer Fire Department Workers'

 Compensation Premium Subsidy Fund; auditor
 to administer.
 - 1 (a) In recognition of the burden of increasing workers'
 - 2 compensation insurance premiums on volunteer and part
 - 3 volunteer fire companies and departments, the Legislature
 - 4 has determined that additional funding assistance should be
 - 5 made available to eligible departments to pay those premium
 - 6 increases beginning with invoices due and payable on or after
 - 7 July 1, 2011.

8	(b) There is hereby established a special fund in the state
9	treasury which shall be known as the "Volunteer Fire
10	Department Workers' Compensation Premium Subsidy
11	Fund." The fund shall be administered by the State Auditor
12	and consist of moneys deposited in the fund pursuant to §33-
13	3-33a, any other funds appropriated by the Legislature for
14	volunteer and part volunteer fire companies and departments
15	for the purposes of this section, and the interest or other
16	earnings on the moneys in the fund. Balances in the fund at
17	the end of any fiscal year shall not expire, but shall be
18	expended for the purposes of this section in ensuing fiscal
19	years pursuant to appropriation of the Legislature.
20	(c) The state auditor shall administer the distribution of
21	moneys of the fund to volunteer and part volunteer fire
22	companies and departments to help defray workers'
23	compensation insurance premium increases.
24	(1) Volunteer and part volunteer fire companies and
25	departments shall request supplemental funds by submitting
26	to the auditor the following information:
27	(A) The previous fiscal year's workers' compensation
28	premium invoices with paid receipts;

(B) The current fiscal year's workers' compensation 29 30 premium invoices showing the amount due and due date and 31 any applicable paid receipts; and 32 (C) Any other information the auditor may deem 33 necessary for administering the subsidy on such forms and 34 schedules as the auditor may direct. The auditor is authorized to set up an electronic filing system at the 35 36 discretion of the auditor for filing of the aforementioned 37 information. (D) For purposes of this section, "fiscal year" means the 38 39 fiscal year of this State. 40 (2) After determining that there is a premium increase and the amount of the premium increase for the volunteer 41 42 company or department requesting the subsidy, the auditor 43 shall make disbursements in the manner set forth in 44 subsection (d) of this section subject to the following 45 requirements: 46 (A) The volunteer company or department must be in 47 good standing with the State Fire Marshal; 48 (B) The volunteer company or department must be 49 registered with the auditor's office in a form and manner 50 prescribed by the auditor prior to being eligible for 51 consideration of any subsidy, which registration must be 52 completed no fewer than thirty days prior to the due date of 53 the workers' compensation premium; 54 (C) The volunteer company or department must agree 55 that the subsidy for its workers' compensation insurance 56 premium increase will be paid directly to its insurance carrier 57 by the auditor and that it will timely pay the balance of the 58 premium due; 59 (d) Beginning with the fiscal year that starts July 1, 2011, 60 and continuing in each fiscal year thereafter, after the auditor 61 has verified that a company or department is eligible for a subsidy pursuant to this section, he or she shall pay on behalf 62 63 of that company or department its subsidy, which is 64 calculated by subtracting the individual base year premium 65 from the individual premium. In no event shall a company or department receive a workers' compensation premium 66 67 subsidy greater than one hundred percent of its premium 68 increase. 69 (e) For fiscal years after the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2011, the auditor shall consult with the insurance 70 71 commissioner to determine the total amount of workers' 72 compensation premium due by volunteer and part volunteer

- 73 fire companies and departments for any subsequent fiscal
- 74 year. The auditor may determine payment dates based upon
- 75 information reasonably available for such a determination.
- 76 (f) For the purposes of this section:
- 77 (1) "Individual base year premium" shall mean the
- 78 workers' compensation insurance premium that became due
- and payable by a volunteer company or department after June
- 80 30, 2010, but before July 1, 2011.
- 81 (2) "Individual premium" shall mean the workers'
- 82 compensation premium due and payable by a volunteer
- 83 company or department in each twelve month period
- 84 beginning on or after July 1, 2011.
- 85 (3) "Volunteer company or department" shall mean a
- 86 volunteer or part volunteer fire company or department that
- 87 was qualified to receive a distribution from the Fire
- 88 Protection Fund pursuant to section thirty-three, article three,
- 89 chapter thirty-three of this code on July 1, 2010 and is, at the
- 90 time of the distribution under this section, eligible to receive
- 91 <u>distributions from the Fire Protection Fund.</u>
- 92 (g) The auditor may promulgate emergency rules and
- 93 may propose for promulgation legislative rules, in
- 94 accordance with the provisions of article three, chapter

95	twenty-nine-a of this code, as are necessary to provide for
96	implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this
97	section.
98	(h) The implementation of the provisions of this section
99	shall undergo a review to assess its effectiveness after three
100	years of operation. The auditor shall submit a report to the
101	Legislature not later than June 30, 2013, and provide details
102	of the implementation, including funds distributed and
103	departments taking advantage of the subsidy, as well as the
104	assessment of its effectiveness.
105	(i) No provision of this section may be construed to
106	require the auditor to provide funding for the purposes of this
107	section in any amount in excess of the moneys available in
108	the Volunteer Fire Department Workers' Compensation
109	Premium Subsidy Fund.
110	(j) Upon the conclusion of the fiscal year ending June 30,
111	2014, the provisions of this section shall expire and be of no
112	further force and effect, the Volunteer Fire Department
113	Workers' Compensation Premium Subsidy Fund shall be
114	closed, and any balances remaining in the fund shall be
115	distributed as provided in section thirty-three-a, article three,
116	chapter thirty-three of this code.

CHAPTER 33. INSURANCE.

ARTICLE 3. LICENSING, FEES AND TAXATION OF INSURERS.

§33-3-33a. Excess moneys of Fire Protection Fund deposited into Volunteer Fire Department Workers' Compensation Premium Subsidy Fund.

1	(a) Beginning July 1, 2011, and in each fiscal year
2	thereafter until June 30, 2014, the excess of the aggregate of
3	amounts collected by the commissioner that are otherwise
4	required under any provision of this code to be deposited into
5	the Fire Protection Fund over the aggregate of those amounts
6	deposited into the Fire Protection Fund during the fiscal year
7	ending June 30, 2011, shall be deposited into the Volunteer
8	Fire Department Workers' Compensation Premium Subsidy
9	Fund established pursuant to section fourteen-a, article four,
10	chapter twelve of this code and expended solely for the
11	purposes established in that section.
12	(b) On or before August 1, 2011, the commissioner shall
13	transfer \$7.5 million from the premium tax savings fund
14	created under section thirteen, article twelve, chapter twenty-
15	nine of this code to the Volunteer Fire Department Workers'
16	Compensation Premium Subsidy Fund and expended solely
17	for the purposes established in section fourteen-a, article
18	four, chapter twelve of this code until June 30, 2014.

19	(c) The State Fire Marshal, in consultation with the
20	commissioner and the Secretary of Revenue, shall conduct a
21	review of the needs of each volunteer or part volunteer fire
22	company or department serving in the various counties of the
23	state. On or before June 30, 2013, the State Fire Marshal
24	shall submit to the Joint Committee on Government and
25	Finance a comprehensive report of the review and the State
26	Fire Marshal's recommendations, substantiated by the
27	findings of the review, of steps that may be taken to meet the
28	needs of the volunteer and part volunteer fire companies and
29	departments, including, but not limited to, the following:
30	(1) An assessment of all current funding received by the
31	volunteer companies and departments, and a further
32	assessment of the funding necessary to provide the
33	community protections required for the areas served by the
34	volunteer companies and departments, the extent to which
35	those needs are being met, the extent to which they are not
36	being met, and recommendations of sources of funds to meet
37	additional needs and the amounts needed, if any;
38	(2) An assessment of the cost of workers' compensation
39	coverage for the volunteer companies and departments and
40	recommendations for any actions that may be undertaken by

- 41 the volunteer companies and departments and others to 42 reduce those costs; 43 (3) An assessment of the causes of any decline in recruitment and retention of volunteer firefighters and 44 45 recommendations for improvements in this area, including any recommendations for incentives that have a demonstrated 46 47 record of significant increases in recruitment and retention as 48 well as recommendations of sources of funds to provide those incentives, if funds are necessary; 49 (4) An assessment of the level of financial accountability 50 51 that should be required of volunteer companies and 52 departments in order to provide the Legislature the 53 information necessary to target future funding for their 54 activities based upon the safety and fire protection needs of 55 the various areas of the state; 56 (5) An assessment of the comparative levels of funding 57
- for volunteer companies and departments provided by

 counties, municipalities and other political subdivisions and
 the means by which that funding is provided, including
 identification of those which contribute little or no funding to
 the volunteer companies and departments within their

62	jurisdictions, together with recommendations for increasing
63	those levels of contributions;
64	(6) An assessment of the comparative levels of funding
65	for volunteer companies and departments provided by their
66	own efforts, and the means by which that funding is
67	provided, including identification of those which provide
68	little or no funding through their own efforts, together with
69	recommendations for increasing these sources of funding;
70	(7) An assessment of the comparative economic and
71	other benefits provided by the various volunteer companies
72	and departments to their particular counties, municipalities
73	and other political subdivisions, as well as to citizens of the
74	local communities they serve;
75	(8) Other assessments and recommendations which the
76	State Fire Marshal deems appropriate in the circumstances.
77	(d) Upon the conclusion of the fiscal year ending June
78	30, 2014, the provisions of this section shall expire and be of
79	no further force and effect and the Volunteer Fire Department
80	Workers' Compensation Premium Subsidy Fund shall be
81	closed. Upon closure of the fund, from any balances therein
82	remaining, the state auditor shall first, to the extent available,
83	transfer to the Fire Protection Fund an amount equal to the

84 aggregate of funds deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Workers' Compensation Premium Subsidy Fund 85 during the fiscal years ending June 30, 2012, 2013 and 2014 86 pursuant to subsection (a) of this section that would 87 otherwise have been required to be deposited into the Fire 88 Protection Fund, and any balances thereafter remaining in the 89 90 Volunteer Fire Department Workers' Compensation 91 Premium Subsidy Fund shall expire to the general revenue 92 fund of the state.
