### Senate Bill No. 241

(By Senators Kessler (Acting President) and Hall, By Request of the Executive)

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[Originating in the Committee on Government Organization; reported February 3, 2011.]

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A BILL to amend and reenact §5B-1-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; to amend and reenact §5B-2-8 and §5B-2-9 of said code; and to amend and reenact §5F-2-1 of said code, all relating generally to Division of Tourism and Tourism Commission; clarifying that Division of Tourism and the Tourism Commission are separate entities within Department of Commerce; modifying composition of Tourism Commission; and modifying the Tourism Commission's annual reporting requirement.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §5B-1-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; that §5B-2-8 and §5B-2-9 of said code be amended and reenacted; and that §5F-2-1 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE 5B. DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE.

# §5B-2-8. Division of Tourism and Tourism Commission created; members, appointment and expenses.

### §5B-2-9. Powers and duties of tourism commission.

offered by the state with respect to tourism promotion and

10 development; facilitate cooperation among local, regional

11 and private tourism enterprises; improve infrastructure on a

- 14 generally; and leverage funding from sources other than the
- 15 state, including local, federal and private sources.
- 16 (b) In developing its strategies, the commission shall
- 17 consider the following:

- 53 tise, promote and market state parks, state forests, state
- 54 recreation areas and wildlife recreational resources;
- 55 (5) To promote and disseminate information related to the
