## Senate Bill No. 467

(By Senators Plymale, Kessler (Acting President), Stollings, Miller, Beach, Chafin and Foster)

[Introduced February 8, 2011; referred to the Committee on Education.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §18A-4-14 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to preventing teachers from being assigned additional responsibilities during planning period without teacher's consent.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18A-4-14 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 4. SALARIES, WAGES AND OTHER BENEFITS.

§18A-4-14. Duty-free lunch and daily planning period for certain employees.

(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section seven, article
 two of this chapter, every teacher who is employed for a
 period of time more than one-half the class periods of the

4 regular school day and every service <del>personnel</del> person whose employment is for a period of more than three and one-half 5 6 hours per day and whose pay is at least the amount indicated in the "state minimum pay scale" as set forth in section 7 eight-a of this article shall be provided a daily lunch recess 8 of not less than thirty consecutive minutes, and such the 9 employee shall not be assigned any responsibilities during 10 this recess. <del>Such</del> The recess shall be included in the number 11 12of hours worked, and no county shall increase the number of 13hours to be worked by an employee as a result of such the employee being granted a recess under the provisions of this 14 section. 15

16 (2) Every teacher who is regularly employed for a period of 17time more than one-half the class periods of the regular 18 school day shall be provided at least one planning period within each school instructional day to be used to complete 1920 necessary preparations for the instruction of pupils. Such 21The planning period shall be the length of the usual class 22period in the school to which <del>such</del> the teacher is assigned, 23and shall be not less than thirty minutes. No teacher shall be 24assigned any responsibilities during this period without the consent of the teacher, and no county shall increase the 25

number of hours to be worked by a teacher as a result of such
the teacher being granted a planning period subsequent to
the adoption of this section (March 13, 1982).

29 Principals, and assistant principals, where applicable, shall cooperate in carrying out the provisions of this subsec-30 tion, including, but not limited to, assuming control of the 31 32class period or supervision of students during the time the teacher is engaged in the planning period. Substitute 33 34 teachers may also may be utilized used to assist with class-35 room responsibilities under this subsection: *Provided*, That any substitute teacher who is employed to teach a minimum 36 of two consecutive days in the same position shall be granted 37 a planning period pursuant to this section. 38

39 (3) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent 40 any teacher from exchanging his or her lunch recess or a planning period or any service <del>personnel</del> person from 41 exchanging his or her lunch recess for any compensation or 42benefit mutually agreed upon by the employee and the 43 county superintendent of schools or his or her agent: Pro-44 45*vided*. That a teacher and the superintendent or his or her agent may not agree to terms which are different from those 46 available to any other teacher granted rights under this 47

48 section within the individual school or to terms which in any 49 way discriminate among such the teachers within the 50 individual school, and that service personnel granted rights 51 under this section and the superintendent or his <u>or her</u> agent 52 may not agree to terms which are different from those 53 available to any other service personnel within the same 54 classification category granted rights under this section 55 within the individual school or to terms which in any way 56 discriminate among <u>such the</u> service personnel within the 57 same classification category within the individual school.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to redefine planning periods for teachers.
