A BILL to amend and reenact §60A-1-101 the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, and to amend and reenact §60A-2-204 of said code, all relating to adding certain cannabinoids, hallucinogens and stimulants to the Schedule I list of controlled substances; and clarifying references to definitions.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §60A-1-101 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, that §60A-2-204 of said code be amended and reenacted, and that §60A-4-401 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

### ARTICLE 2. STANDARDS AND SCHEDULES.

## §60A-1-101. Definitions.

- 1 As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Administer" means the direct application of a
- 3 controlled substance whether by injection, inhalation,
- 4 ingestion or any other means to the body of a patient or
- 5 research subject by:
- 6 (1) A practitioner (or, in his presence, by his
- 7 authorized agent); or
- 8 (2) The patient or research subject at the direction and
- 9 in the presence of the practitioner.
- 10 (b) "Agent" means an authorized person who acts on
- behalf of or at the direction of a manufacturer, distributor

- or dispenser. It does not include a common or contract
- carrier, public warehouseman or employee of the carrier or
- 14 warehouseman.
- (c) "Analogue" means a substance that, in relation to
- 16 <u>a controlled substance</u>, has a substantially similar chemical
- 17 structure.
- 18 (c) (d) "Bureau" means the "Bureau of Narcotics and
- 19 Dangerous Drugs, United States Department of Justice" or
- 20 its successor agency.
- 21 (d) (e) "Controlled substance" means a drug, substance
- or immediate precursor in Schedules I through V of article
- 23 two.
- 24 (e) (f) "Counterfeit substance" means a controlled
- substance which, or the container or labeling of which,
- 26 without authorization, bears the trademark, trade name or
- other identifying mark, imprint, number or device, or any
- 28 likeness thereof, of a manufacturer, distributor or
- 29 dispenser other than the person who in fact manufactured,
- 30 distributed or dispensed the substance.

- (f)(g) "Imitation controlled substance" means: (1) A 31 32 controlled substance which is falsely represented to be a different controlled substance; (2) a drug or substance 33 34 which is not a controlled substance but which is falsely represented to be a controlled substance; or (3) a 35 controlled substance or other drug or substance or a 36 37 combination thereof which is shaped, sized, colored, marked, imprinted, numbered, labeled, packaged, 38 distributed or priced so as to cause a reasonable person to 39 40 believe that it is a controlled substance. (g) (h) "Deliver" or "delivery" means the actual, 41
- constructive or attempted transfer from one person to another of: (1) A controlled substance, whether or not there is an agency relationship; (2) a counterfeit substance; or (3) an imitation controlled substance.
- 46 (h) (i) "Dispense" means to deliver a controlled 47 substance to an ultimate user or research subject by or 48 pursuant to the lawful order of a practitioner, including the

- prescribing, administering, packaging, labeling or compounding necessary to prepare the substance for that delivery.
- 52 (i) (j) "Dispenser" means a practitioner who dispenses.
- 53 (j) (k) "Distribute" means to deliver, other than by
  54 administering or dispensing, a controlled substance, a
  55 counterfeit substance or an imitation controlled substance.
- 56 (k) (l) "Distributor" means a person who distributes.
- (1) Substances recognized as 57 drugs in the official "United States Pharmacopoeia, 58 official Homeopathic Pharmacopoeia of the United States 59 or official National Formulary", or any supplement to any 60 of them; (2) substances intended for use in the diagnosis, 61 cure, mitigation, treatment or prevention of disease in man 62 or animals; (3) substances (other than food) intended to 63 affect the structure or any function of the body of man or 64 animals; and (4) substances intended for use as a 65 component of any article specified in clause (1), (2) or (3) 66

of this subdivision. It does not include devices or their components, parts or accessories.

- (n) "Immediate derivative" means a substance which 69 the "West Virginia Board of Pharmacy" has found to be 70 and by rule designates as being the principal compound or 71 72 any analogue of the parent compound manufactured from a known controlled substance primarily for use and which 73 has equal or similar pharmacologic activity as the parent 74 compound which is necessary to prevent, curtail or limit 75 76 manufacture.
- (m) (o) "Immediate precursor" means a substance which 77 the "West Virginia Board of Pharmacy" (hereinafter in this 78 act referred to as the State Board of Pharmacy) has found to 79 be and by rule designates as being the principal compound 80 commonly used or produced primarily for use and which is 81 82 an immediate chemical intermediary used or likely to be used in the manufacture of a controlled substance, the control of 83 which is necessary to prevent, curtail or limit manufacture. 84

85 (n)(p) "Manufacture" means the production, preparation,

86 propagation, compounding, conversion or processing of a

87 controlled substance, either directly or indirectly or by

88 extraction from substances of natural origin, or

89 independently by means of chemical synthesis, or by a

90 combination of extraction and chemical synthesis, and

91 includes any packaging or repackaging of the substance or

labeling or relabeling of its container, except that this term

does not include the preparation, compounding, packaging

or labeling of a controlled substance:

- 95 (1) By a practitioner as an incident to his administering
- or dispensing of a controlled substance in the course of his
- 97 professional practice; or

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- 98 (2) By a practitioner, or by his authorized agent under
- 99 his supervision, for the purpose of, or as an incident to,
- research, teaching or chemical analysis and not for sale.
- 101 (o) (q) "Marijuana" means all parts of the plant
- 102 "Cannabis sativa L.", whether growing or not; the seeds

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thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and 103 104 every compound, manufacture, salt, immediate derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant, its seeds or resin. It 105 106 does not include the mature stalks of the plant, fiber 107 produced from the stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds 108 of the plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt, immediate derivative, mixture or preparation of the mature 109 110 stalks (except the resin extracted therefrom), fiber, oil or cake, or the sterilized seed of the plant which is incapable 111 of germination. 112

- (p) (r) "Narcotic drug" means any of the following, whether produced directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of vegetable origin or independently by means of chemical synthesis, or by a combination of extraction and chemical synthesis:
- 118 (1) Opium and opiate and any salt, compound, 119 immediate derivative or preparation of opium or opiate.

120 (2) Any salt, compound, isomer, <u>immediate</u> derivative 121 or preparation thereof which is chemically equivalent or 122 identical with any of the substances referred to in 123 paragraph (1) of this subdivision, but not including the 124 isoquinoline alkaloids of opium.

(3) Opium poppy and poppy straw.

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- (4) Coca leaves and any salt, compound, <u>immediate</u>
  derivative or preparation of coca leaves and any salt,
  compound, isomer, <u>immediate</u> derivative or preparation
  thereof which is chemically equivalent or identical with
  any of these substances, but not including decocainized
  coca leaves or extractions of coca leaves which do not
  contain cocaine or ecgonine.
  - (q) (s) "Opiate" means any substance having an addiction-forming or addiction-sustaining liability similar to morphine or being capable of conversion into a drug having addiction-forming or addiction-sustaining liability.

    It does not include, unless specifically designated as

- controlled under section two hundred one, article two of
- this chapter, the dextrorotatory isomer of 3-methoxy-n-
- 140 methylmorphinan and its salts (dextromethorphan). It does
- 141 not include its racemic and levorotatory forms.
- (r) (t) "Opium poppy" means the plant of the species
- "Papaver somniferum L.", except its seeds.
- (s) (u) "Person" means individual, corporation,
- 145 government or governmental subdivision or agency,
- business trust, estate, trust, partnership or association, or
- 147 any other legal entity.
- (t) (v) "Placebo" means an inert medicament or
- 149 preparation administered or dispensed for its
- psychological effect, to satisfy a patient or research subject
- or to act as a control in experimental series.
- (w) (w) "Poppy straw" means all parts, except the
- seeds, of the opium poppy after mowing.
- 154  $\frac{(v)}{(x)}$  "Practitioner" means:

- 155 (1) A physician, dentist, veterinarian, scientific 156 investigator or other person licensed, registered or 157 otherwise permitted to distribute, dispense, conduct 158 research with respect to, or to administer a controlled 159 substance in the course of professional practice or research 160 in this state.
- 161 (2) A pharmacy, hospital or other institution licensed,
  162 registered or otherwise permitted to distribute, dispense,
  163 conduct research with respect to, or to administer a
  164 controlled substance in the course of professional practice
  165 or research in this state.
  - (w) (y) "Production" includes the manufacture, planting, cultivation, growing or harvesting of a controlled substance.

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169 (x) (z) "State", when applied to a part of the United
170 States, includes any state, district, commonwealth,
171 territory, insular possession thereof and any area subject to
172 the legal authority of the United States of America.

173 (y)(aa) "Ultimate user" means a person who lawfully
174 possesses a controlled substance for his own use or for the
175 use of a member of his household or for administering to
176 an animal owned by him or by a member of his household.

#### ARTICLE 4. OFFENSES AND PENALTIES.

## §60A-4-401. Prohibited acts A; penalties.

- 1 (a) Except as authorized by this act, it is unlawful for
- 2 any person to manufacture, deliver, or possess with intent
- 3 to manufacture or deliver, a controlled substance.

4 Any person who violates this subsection with respect

- 6 (i) A controlled substance classified in Schedule I or II,
- 7 which is a narcotic drug, is guilty of a felony and, upon

- or both;

- or fined not more than fifteen thousand dollars, or both;

(ii) Any other counterfeit substance classified in 40 41 Schedule I, II or III is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction, may be imprisoned in the state correctional 42 43 facility for not less than one year nor more than five years, or fined not more than fifteen thousand dollars, or both; 44 (iii) A counterfeit substance classified in Schedule IV 45 is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction, may be 46 imprisoned in the state correctional facility for not less 47 than one year nor more than three years, or fined not more 48 than ten thousand dollars, or both; 49 (iv) A counterfeit substance classified in Schedule V 50 is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be 51 confined in jail for not less than six months nor more than 52 one year, or fined not more than five thousand dollars, or 53 54 both: Provided, That for offenses relating to any substance classified as Schedule V in article ten of this 55

chapter, the penalties established in said article apply.

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(c) It is unlawful for any person knowingly or 57 58 intentionally to possess a controlled substance unless the substance was obtained directly from, or pursuant to, a 59 60 valid prescription or order of a practitioner while acting in the course of his professional practice, or except as 61 otherwise authorized by this act. Any person who violates 62 63 this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor, and disposition may be made under section four hundred seven of this 64 article, subject to the limitations specified in said section, 65 or upon conviction, such person may be confined in jail 66 not less than ninety days nor more than six months, or 67 68 fined not more than one thousand dollars, or both: *Provided.* That notwithstanding any other provision of this 69 act to the contrary, any first offense for possession of 70 Synthetic Cannabinoids as defined by subdivision (32) 71 subsection, (d), section 101, article 1 of this chapter; 3,4-72 73 methylenedioxypyrovalerone (MPVD) and 3.4methylenedioxypyrovalerone and/or mephedrone as 74

- 76 <u>chapter; or less</u> than 15 grams of marijuana, shall be

Any person being eighteen years old or more who violates subdivision (1) of this subsection and, 95 in so doing, distributes or delivers an imitation controlled 96 substance to a minor child who is at least three years 97 younger than such person is guilty of a felony and, upon 98 99 conviction, may be imprisoned in the state correctional facility for not less than one year nor more than three 100 years, or fined not more than ten thousand dollars, or both. 101 (4) The provisions of subdivision (1) of this subsection 102 shall not apply to a practitioner who administers or 103 104 dispenses a placebo.
