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12	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$16-5P-6$ of the Code of West Virginia,
13	1931, as amended, relating generally to the creation of an in-
14	home direct care worker registry; clarifying the duties of the
15	Commissioner of the Bureau of Senior Services as executive and
16	administrative head of the Bureau of Senior Services;
17	requiring the Bureau of Senior Services to develop and
18	maintain an in-home direct care worker registry; and granting
19	rule-making authority.
20	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
21	That §16-5P-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
22	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
23	ARTICLE 5P. SENIOR SERVICES.
24	§16-5P-6. Powers and duties generally.

The commissioner $\frac{\mbox{\sc shall be}}{\mbox{\sc is}}$ the executive and administrative

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- 1 head of the bureau and shall have has the power and duty to:
- 2 (a) Exercise general supervision of the bureau;
- 3 (b) Propose legislative rules for the effective and
- 4 expeditious performance and discharge of the duties and
- 5 responsibilities placed upon the commissioner by law;
- 6 (c) Conduct and coordinate studies of the problems of the
- 7 state's older people;
- 8 (d) Encourage and promote the establishment of local programs
- 9 and services for the aging;
- 10 (e) Conduct programs of public education on the problems of
- 11 the aging;
- 12 (f) Review state programs for the aging and annually make
- 13 recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature;
- 14 (g) Encourage and assist governmental and private agencies to
- 15 coordinate effective efforts on behalf of the aging;
- 16 (h) Coordinate statewide local and voluntary efforts to serve
- 17 the aging and develop programs at the local level;
- 18 (I) Supervise fiscal management and responsibilities of the
- 19 bureau;
- 20 (j) Keep an accurate and complete record of all bureau
- 21 proceedings, record and file all bonds and contracts and assume
- 22 responsibility for the custody and preservation of all papers and
- 23 documents of the bureau;
- 24 (k) Submit an annual report to the Governor on the condition,
- 25 operation and functioning of the bureau;

- 1 (1) Invoke any legal or special remedy for the enforcement of 2 orders or the provisions of this chapter;
- 3 (m) Standardize administration, expedite bureau business, 4 revise rules and promote the efficiency of the service;
- 5 (n) Provide a program of continuing professional, technical 6 and specialized instruction for the personnel of the bureau and 7 local service providers; and
- 8 (o) Receive on behalf of the state any grant or gift and 9 accept the same, so that the title shall pass to the state. All 10 moneys from grants or gifts shall be deposited with the State 11 Treasurer in a special fund and shall be used for the purposes set 12 forth in the grant or gift.
- (p) Create and maintain a registry of certified in-home direct

 care workers that details qualifications and experience of in-home

 direct care workers in West Virginia. The bureau shall propose

 rules for legislative approval in accordance with the provisions of

 article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, to establish the

 following: (1) the definition of "in-home direct care worker" and

 (2) the requirements for certification as an "in-home direct care

 worker", including educational requirements and the completion of

 a criminal background check.
