12	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
13	adding thereto a new section, designated \$17C-14-15, relating
14	to traffic safety; establishing the offense of operating a
15	motor vehicle while sending or reading a text message or using
16	a wireless communication device without hands-free technology;
17	providing exceptions; providing definitions; and providing
18	penalties.
19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
21	by adding thereto a new section, designated $$17C-14-15$ , to read as
22	follows:
23	ARTICLE 14. MISCELLANEOUS RULES.
24	§17C-14-15. Writing, sending or reading a text message by means of

- an electronic communications device or using a

  wireless communication device while driving unlawful;

  definitions; exceptions; penalties.
  - (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b) of this section, a person may not drive or operate a motor vehicle on a public street or highway while texting or using a wireless communication device without hands-free equipment.
  - (b) A driver is permitted to use an electronic communication device to text or a wireless communication device without hands-free technology to call while driving during an emergency, when it is necessary for the driver to contact law-enforcement officials or other emergency services.
  - (c) This section does not supersede the provisions of section three-a, article two, chapter seventeen-b of this code or any more restrictive provisions for drivers of commercial motor vehicles prescribed by the provisions of chapter seventeen-e of this code or federal law or rule.
- 18 (d) As used in this section:

(1) "Driving" or "operating a motor vehicle" means operating a motor vehicle, with the motor running, including while temporarily stationary because of traffic, a traffic control device, or other momentary delays, but does not include operating a motor vehicle when the driver moved the vehicle to the side of, or off, a highway and halted in a location where the vehicle can safely remain

- 2 (2) "Electronic communication device" includes but is not
- 3 limited to, a cellular telephone; personal digital assistant; pager;
- 4 computer; or any other device used to input, write, send, receive
- 5 or read text. For the purposes of this section, an "electronic
- 6 communication device" does not include:
- 7 (A) Voice radios, mobile radios, land mobile radios,
- 8 commercial mobile radios or two-way radios with the capability to
- 9 transmit and receive voice transmissions utilizing a "push to talk"
- 10 or "press to transmit" function; or
- 11 (B) Other voice radios used by a law-enforcement officer, an
- 12 emergency services provider, an employee or agent of public safety
- organizations, first responders, Amateur Radio Operators (HAM)
- 14 licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and school bus
- 15 operators;
- 16 (3) "Texting" means manually entering alphanumeric text into,
- 17 or reading text from, an electronic communication device, and
- includes, but is not limited to, short message service, e-mailing,
- 19 instant messaging, a command or request to access a World Wide Web
- 20 page, or engaging in any other form of electronic text retrieval or
- 21 entry, for present or future communication. For purposes of this
- 22 section, "texting" does not include the following actions:
- 23 (A) Reading, selecting or entering a telephone number, an
- 24 extension number, or voicemail retrieval codes and commands into an

- 1 electronic device for the purpose of initiating or receiving a phone
- 2 call or using voice commands to initiate or receive a telephone
- 3 call;
- 4 (B) Inputting, selecting or reading information on a global
- 5 positioning system or navigation system; or
- 6 (C) Using a device capable of performing multiple functions,
- 7 including fleet management systems, dispatching devices, smart
- 8 phones, citizens band radios or music players, for a purpose that
- 9 is not otherwise prohibited in this section.
- 10 (e) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection (a)
- of this section is guilty of a traffic offense and, upon conviction
- 12 thereof, shall for a first offense be fined \$100; for a second
- offense be fined \$200; and for a third or subsequent offense be
- 14 fined \$400. No court costs or other fees shall be assessed for a
- 15 violation of subsection (a).
- 16 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the
- 17 contrary, points may not be entered on any driver's record
- 18 maintained by the Division of Motor Vehicles as a result of a
- 19 violation of this section.
- 20 (g) This traffic offense shall not be a primary offense for
- 21 citation.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the secondary offense of operating a motor vehicle while texting or using a wireless communications device without hands-free technology.
