17 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That \$30-1A-2, \$30-1A-3, \$30-1A-5 and \$30-1A-6 of the Code of 19 West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to 20 read as follows:

21 ARTICLE 1A. PROCEDURE FOR REGULATION OF OCCUPATIONS AND 22 PROFESSIONS.

23 §30-1A-2. Required application for regulation of professional or occupational group; application and reporting dates.

- 25 (a) Any professional or occupational group or organization, 26 any individual or any other interested party which proposes the 27 regulation of any unregulated professional or occupational group or 28 organization, or who proposes to substantially establish, revise or 29 expand the scope of practice of a regulated profession or 30 occupation, shall submit an application to the Joint Standing 31 Committee on Government Organization, as set out in this article.
- (b) The Joint Standing Committee on Government Organization 32 33 may only accept an application for regulation of a professional or 34 occupational group or organization, or substantial establishment, 35 revision or expansion of the scope of practice of a regulated 36 profession or occupation, when the party submitting an application 37 files with the committee a statement of support for the proposed 38 regulation which has been signed by at least ten residents or 39 citizens of the State of West Virginia who are members of the 40 professional or occupational group or organization for which 41 regulation is being sought, or for which substantial establishment, 42 revision or expansion of the scope of practice of a regulated 43 profession or occupation is being sought.

© The completed application shall contain:

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- (1) A description of the occupational or professional group or 3 organization for which regulation is proposed, or for which $\frac{1}{2}$ 4 substantial establishment, revision or expansion of the scope of 5 practice of a regulated profession or occupation is proposed, 6 including a list of associations, organizations and other groups 7 currently representing the practitioners in this state, and an 8 estimate of the number of practitioners in each group;

- (a) Nothing in this article shall be construed as limiting or 42 interfering with the right of any member of the Legislature to 43 introduce or of the Legislature to consider any bill that would 44 create a new state governmental department or agency or amend the 45 law with respect to an existing one.
- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this 47 section, the recommendations of the Joint Standing Committee on 48 Government Organization are to be given considerable weight in

1 determining if a profession or occupation should be regulated, or 2 if the scope of practice of a regulated profession or occupation 3 should be <u>established</u>, revised or expanded.
