14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
15	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended	
16	by adding thereto a new section, designated §22-6A-6a, to read as

18	ARTICLE 6. NATURAL GAS HORIZONTAL WELL CONTROL ACT.	
19	§22-6A-6a. Study of the human and environmental health impacts of	
20	shale gas development.	
21	(a) The secretary shall initiate a study with the School of	
22	Public Health at West Virginia University for the purpose of	
23	studying the human and environmental health impacts of shale gas	

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1 development, if any.

2 (b) The study shall include, but not be limited to, the 3 effects of all potential pollutants from shale development on human 4 and environmental health.

5 (c) At a minimum, the potential pollutants to be evaluated as 6 a part of this study include, but are not limited to, fracking 7 fluid stored in containers, flowback mud and fluids, fracking 8 chemicals not to be limited to volatile organic compounds, 9 naturally occurring radioactive materials and total dissolved 10 solids, fugitive air pollutants from flareoffs, leaking methane and 11 its components from all possible areas of escape and frack 12 chemicals and trihalomethanes in water wells near gas wells.

13 (d) The study will broaden to include potential pollutants as 14 <u>awareness of potential pollutants surface resulting from the study</u> 15 required in this section or in the scientific community.

16 (e) The study required by this section shall commence by May 17 1, 2012. The researchers from West Virginia University shall 18 submit study progress reports, with preliminary findings as these 19 occur, to the secretary on a quarterly basis annually. The 20 secretary shall submit reports to the Joint Committee on Government 21 and Finance beginning December 1, 2012, and every six months 22 thereafter until the study is completed and a final report is 23 submitted. NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to study the impact of shale gas development on human and environmental health.
