14	That $\$33-15-14$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
15	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
16	ARTICLE 15. ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS INSURANCE.
17	§33-15-14. Policies discriminating among health care providers.
18	Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, when any health
19	insurance policy, health care services plan or other contract
20	provides for the payment of medical expenses, benefits or
21	procedures, such the policy, plan or contract shall be construed to
22	include payment to all health care providers including medical
23	physicians, osteopathic physicians, podiatric physicians,
24	chiropractic physicians, physical therapists, occupational

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1 <u>therapists</u>, midwives, and nurse practitioners <u>and their licensed</u>
2 <u>assistants</u>, who provide medical services, benefits or procedures
3 which are within the scope of each respective provider's license.
4 Any limitation or condition placed upon services, diagnoses or
5 treatment by, or payment to any particular type of licensed
6 provider shall apply equally to all types of licensed providers
7 without unfair discrimination as to the usual and customary
8 treatment procedures of any of the aforesaid listed providers.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit an insurance company for discriminating against occupational therapists and physical therapists.
