A BILL to amend and reenact $\$60A-5-506$ of the Code of West
Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to the uniformed
controlled substances act; and declaring that a defendant has
the right to a presumption of medical necessity in any trial,
hearing or other proceeding under this act, for use or
possession of medical marihuana.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
That §60A-5-506 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
amended, be amended and reenacted, to read as follows:
ARTICLE 5. ENFORCEMENT AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.
<pre>§60A-5-506. Burden of proof; liability of officers.</pre>
(a) It is not necessary for the state to negate any exemption
or exception in this act in any complaint, information, indictment,
or other pleading or in any trial, hearing, or other proceeding

under this act. The burden of proof of any exemption or exception
is upon the person claiming it.

3 (b) In the absence of proof that a person is the duly 4 authorized holder of an appropriate registration or order form 5 issued under this act, he <u>or she</u> is presumed not to be the holder 6 of the registration or form. The burden of proof is upon him <u>or</u> 7 <u>her</u> to rebut the presumption.

8 (c) No liability is imposed by this act upon any authorized 9 state, county, or municipal officer, engaged in the lawful 10 performance of his <u>or her</u> duties.

11 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the 12 contrary, it is hereby declared to be the intent of the Legislature 13 that a defendant has the right to a presumption of medical 14 necessity in any trial, hearing or other proceeding under this act, 15 for use or possession of medical marihuana.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to declare that a defendant has the right to a presumption of medical necessity in any trial, hearing or other proceeding under this act, for use or possession of medical marihuana.
