- 13 predominant number or types of games offered for play are

- 15 (c) The Lottery Commission shall propose rules for legislative
- 16 approval in accordance with the provisions of article three,
- 17 chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to authorize and regulate
- 18 limited charity fundraising events.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit the Lottery Commission to authorize and regulate limited charity fundraising events and authorize rule-making authority towards this end.
