L1	A BILL to amend and reenact $$17B-2-3a$ of the Code of West Virginia,
L2	1931, as amended; and to amend said code by adding thereto a
L3	new section, designated \$17C-14-15, all relating to traffic
L 4	safety; establishing the offense of operating a motor vehicle
L 5	while sending or reading a text message or using a wireless
L 6	communication device without hands-free technology; providing
L 7	exceptions; providing definitions; providing penalties; and
L 8	making graduated driver's license provisions consistent with
L 9	new offenses.
20	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
21	That §17B-2-3a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
22	be amended and reenacted; and that said code be amended by adding
23	thereto a new section designated \$17C-14-15 all to read as

- 1 follows:
- 2 CHAPTER 17B. MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVER'S LICENSES.
- 3 ARTICLE 2. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE, EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL.
- 4 §17B-2-3a. Graduated driver's license.
- 5 (a) Any person under the age of eighteen may not operate a
- 6 motor vehicle unless he or she has obtained a graduated driver's
- 7 license in accordance with the three-level graduated driver's
- 8 license system described in the following provisions.
- 9 (b) Any person under the age of twenty-one, regardless of
- 10 class or level of licensure, who operates a motor vehicle with any
- 11 measurable alcohol in his or her system is subject to the
- 12 provisions of section two, article five, chapter seventeen-c of
- 13 this code and section two, article five-a of said chapter. Any
- 14 person under the age of eighteen, regardless of class or licensure
- 15 level, is subject to the mandatory school attendance and
- 16 satisfactory academic progress provisions of section eleven,
- 17 article eight, chapter eighteen of this code.
- 18 (c) Level one instruction permit. -- An applicant who is
- 19 fifteen years or older meeting all other requirements prescribed in
- 20 this code may be issued a level one instruction permit.
- 21 (1) Eligibility. -- The division shall not issue a level one
- 22 instruction permit unless the applicant:
- 23 (A) Presents a completed application, as prescribed by the

- 1 provisions of section six of this article, and which is accompanied
- 2 by a writing, duly acknowledged, consenting to the issuance of the
- 3 graduated driver's license and executed by a parent or guardian
- 4 entitled to custody of the applicant;
- 5 (B) Presents a certified copy of a birth certificate issued by
- 6 a state or other governmental entity responsible for vital records
- 7 unexpired, or a valid passport issued by the United States
- 8 government evidencing that the applicant meets the minimum age
- 9 requirement and is of verifiable identity;
- 10 (C) Passes the vision and written knowledge examination and
- 11 completes the driving under the influence awareness program, as
- 12 prescribed in section seven of this article;
- 13 (D) Presents a driver's eligibility certificate or otherwise
- 14 shows compliance with the provisions of section eleven, article
- 15 eight, chapter eighteen of this code; and
- 16 (E) Pays a fee of \$5, which shall permit the applicant two
- 17 attempts at the written knowledge test.
- 18 (2) Terms and conditions of instruction permit. -- A level one
- 19 instruction permit issued under the provisions of this section is
- 20 valid until thirty days after the date the applicant attains the
- 21 age of eighteen and is not renewable. However, any permit holder
- 22 who allows his or her permit to expire prior to successfully
- 23 passing the road skills portion of the driver examination, and who

1 has not committed any offense which requires the suspension, 2 revocation or cancellation of the instruction permit, may reapply 3 for a new instruction permit under the provisions of section six of The division shall immediately revoke the permit 4 this article. 5 upon receipt of a second conviction for a moving violation of 6 traffic regulations and laws of the road or violation of the terms 7 and conditions of a level one instruction permit, which convictions 8 have become final unless a greater penalty is required by this 9 section or any other provision of this code. Any person whose 10 instruction permit has been revoked is disqualified from retesting 11 for a period of ninety days. However, after the expiration of 12 ninety days, the person may retest if otherwise eligible. 13 addition to all other provisions of this code for which a driver's 14 license may be restricted, suspended, revoked or canceled, the 15 holder of a level one instruction permit may only operate a motor 16 vehicle under the following conditions:

(A) Under the direct supervision of a licensed driver, twenty18 one years of age or older, or a driver's education or driving
19 school instructor who is acting in an official capacity as an
20 instructor, who is fully alert and unimpaired, and the only other
21 occupant of the front seat. The vehicle may be operated with no
22 more than two additional passengers, unless the passengers are
23 family members;

- 1 (B) Between the hours of five a.m. and ten p.m.;
- 2 (C) All occupants must use safety belts in accordance with the
- 3 provisions of section forty-nine, article fifteen, chapter
- 4 seventeen-c of this code;
- 5 (D) Without any measurable blood alcohol content, in
- 6 accordance with the provisions of subsection (h), section two,
- 7 article five, chapter seventeen-c of this code; and
- 8 (E) Maintains current school enrollment and is making
- 9 satisfactory academic progress or otherwise shows compliance with
- 10 the provisions of section eleven, article eight, chapter eighteen
- 11 of this code.
- 12 (F) A holder of a level one instruction permit who is under
- 13 the age of eighteen years shall be prohibited from using a wireless
- 14 communication device while operating a motor vehicle, unless the
- 15 use of the wireless communication device is for contacting a 9-1-1
- 16 system: Provided, That the holder of a level one instruction permit
- 17 who is under the age of eighteen years may not contact a 911 system
- 18 by means of texting as that term is defined in subdivision, (3)
- 19 <u>subsection</u> (d), <u>section</u> <u>fifteen</u>, <u>article</u> <u>fourteen</u>, <u>chapter</u>
- 20 <u>seventeen-c of this code: Provided, however, That texting as that</u>
- 21 term is defined in subdivision (3), subsection (d), section
- 22 fifteen, article fourteen, chapter seventeen-c of this code by the
- 23 holder of a level one instruction permit who is under the age of

- 1 eighteen years is a primary offense. A person violating the
- 2 provisions of this paragraph is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
- 3 conviction thereof, shall for the first offense be fined \$25; for
- 4 a second offense be fined \$50; and for a third or subsequent
- 5 offense be fined \$75.
- 6 (d) Level two intermediate driver's license. -- An applicant
- 7 sixteen years of age or older, meeting all other requirements of
- 8 the code, may be issued a level two intermediate driver's license.
- 9 (1) Eligibility. -- The division shall not issue a level two
- 10 intermediate driver's license unless the applicant:
- 11 (A) Presents a completed application as prescribed in section
- 12 six of this article;
- 13 (B) Has held the level one instruction permit conviction-free
- 14 for the one hundred eighty days immediately preceding the date of
- 15 application for a level two intermediate license;
- 16 (C) Has completed either a driver's education course approved
- 17 by the state Department of Education or fifty hours of behind-the-
- 18 wheel driving experience, including a minimum of ten hours of
- 19 nighttime driving, certified by a parent or legal guardian or other
- 20 responsible adult over the age of twenty-one as indicated on the
- 21 form prescribed by the division: Provided, That nothing in this
- 22 paragraph shall be construed to require any school or any county
- 23 board of education to provide any particular number of driver's

- 1 education courses or to provide driver's education training to any
 2 student;
- 3 (D) Presents a driver's eligibility certificate or otherwise 4 shows compliance with the provisions of section eleven, article 5 eight, chapter eighteen of this code;
- 6 (E) Passes the road skills examination as prescribed by 7 section seven of this article; and
- 8 (F) Pays a fee of \$5.
- 9 (2) Terms and conditions of a level two intermediate driver's license. -- A level two intermediate driver's license issued under 11 the provisions of this section shall expire thirty days after the 12 applicant attains the age of eighteen, or until the licensee 13 qualifies for a level three full Class E license, whichever comes 14 first. In addition to all other provisions of this code for which 15 a driver's license may be restricted, suspended, revoked or 16 canceled, the holder of a level two intermediate driver's license 17 may only operate a motor vehicle under the following conditions:
- 18 (A) Unsupervised between the hours of five a.m. and ten p.m.;
- 19 (B) Only under the direct supervision of a licensed driver,
- 20 age twenty-one years or older, between the hours of ten p.m. and
- 21 five a.m. except when the licensee is going to or returning from:
- 22 (i) Lawful employment;
- 23 (ii) A school-sanctioned activity;

- 1 (iii) A religious event; or
- 2 (iv) An emergency situation that requires the licensee to
- 3 operate a motor vehicle to prevent bodily injury or death of
- 4 another;
- 5 (C) All occupants shall use safety belts in accordance with
- 6 the provisions of section forty-nine, article fifteen, chapter
- 7 seventeen-c of this code;
- 8 (D) For the first six months after issuance of a level two
- 9 intermediate driver's license, the licensee may not operate a motor
- 10 vehicle carrying any passengers less than twenty years old, unless
- 11 these passengers are family members of the licensee; for the second
- 12 six months after issuance of a level two intermediate driver's
- 13 license, the licensee may not operate a motor vehicle carrying more
- 14 than one passenger less than twenty years old, unless these
- 15 passengers are family members of the licensee;
- 16 (E) Without any measurable blood alcohol content in accordance
- 17 with the provisions of subsection (h), section two, article five,
- 18 chapter seventeen-c of this code;
- 19 (F) Maintains current school enrollment and is making
- 20 satisfactory academic progress or otherwise shows compliance with
- 21 the provisions of section eleven, article eight, chapter eighteen
- 22 of this code;
- 23 (G) A holder of a level two intermediate driver's license who

1 is under the age of eighteen years shall be prohibited from using 2 a wireless communication device while operating a motor vehicle, 3 unless the use of the wireless communication device is for 4 contacting a 9-1-1 system: Provided, That the holder of a level one 5 instruction permit who is under the age of eighteen years may not 6 contact a 911 system by means of texting as that term is defined in 7 subdivision(3), subsection (d), section fifteen, article fourteen, 8 chapter seventeen-c of this code: Provided, however, That texting 9 as that term is defined in subdivision(3), subsection (d), section 10 fifteen, article fourteen, chapter seventeen-c of this code by the 11 holder of a level one instruction permit who is under the age of 12 eighteen years is a primary offense. A person violating the 13 provisions of this paragraph is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon 14 conviction thereof, shall for the first offense be fined \$25; for 15 a second offense be fined \$50; and for a third or subsequent 16 offense be fined \$75.

(H) Upon the first conviction for a moving traffic violation or a violation of paragraph (A), (B), (C), (D) or (G), subdivision (1), subsection (d) of this section of the terms and conditions of a level two intermediate driver's license, the licensee shall enroll in an approved driver improvement program unless a greater penalty is required by this section or by any other provision of this code; and

At the discretion of the commissioner, completion of 1 2 approved driver improvement program may be used to negate the 3 effect of a minor traffic violation as defined by the commissioner 4 against the one year conviction-free driving criteria for early 5 eligibility for a level three driver's license and may also negate 6 the effect of one minor traffic violation for purposes of avoiding 7 a second conviction under paragraph (I) of this subdivision; and (I) Upon the second conviction for a moving traffic violation 9 or a violation of the terms and conditions of the level two 10 intermediate driver's license, the licensee's privilege to operate 11 a motor vehicle shall be revoked or suspended for the applicable 12 statutory period or until the licensee's eighteenth birthday, 13 whichever is longer unless a greater penalty is required by this 14 section or any other provision of this code. Any person whose 15 driver's license has been revoked as a level two intermediate 16 driver, upon reaching the age of eighteen years and if otherwise 17 eligible may reapply for an instruction permit, then a driver's 18 license in accordance with the provisions of sections five, six and 19 seven of this article.

20 (e) Level three, full Class E license. -- The level three
21 license is valid until thirty days after the date the licensee
22 attains his or her twenty-first birthday. Unless otherwise
23 provided in this section or any other section of this code, the

- 1 holder of a level three full Class E license is subject to the same
- 2 terms and conditions as the holder of a regular Class E driver's
- 3 license.
- A level two intermediate licensee whose privilege to operate
- 5 a motor vehicle has not been suspended, revoked or otherwise
- 6 canceled and who meets all other requirements of the code may be
- 7 issued a level three full Class E license without further
- 8 examination or road skills testing if the licensee:
- 9 (1) Has reached the age of seventeen years; and
- 10 (A) Presents a completed application as prescribed by the
- 11 provisions of section six of this article;
- 12 (B) Has held the level two intermediate license conviction
- 13 free for the twelve-month period immediately preceding the date of
- 14 the application;
- 15 (C) Has completed any driver improvement program required
- 16 under paragraph (G), subdivision (2), subsection (d) of this
- 17 section; and
- 18 (D) Pays a fee of \$2.50 for each year the license is valid.
- 19 An additional fee of \$.50 shall be collected to be deposited in the
- 20 Combined Voter Registration and Driver's Licensing Fund established
- 21 in section twelve, article two, chapter three of this code;
- 22 (E) Presents a driver's eligibility certificate or otherwise
- 23 shows compliance with the provisions of section eleven, article

- 1 eight, chapter eighteen of this code; or
- 2 (2) Reaches the age of eighteen years; and
- 3 (A) Presents a completed application as prescribed by the 4 provisions of section six of this article; and
- 5 (B) Pays a fee of \$2.50 for each year the license is valid.
- 6 An additional fee of \$.50 shall be collected to be deposited in the
- 7 Combined Voter Registration and Driver's Licensing Fund established
- 8 in section twelve, article two, chapter three of this code.
- 9 (f) A person violating the provisions of the terms and 10 conditions of a level one or level two intermediate driver's 11 license is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, 12 shall for the first offense be fined \$25; for a second offense be
- 13 fined \$50; and for a third or subsequent offense be fined \$75.
- 14 CHAPTER 17C. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND LAWS OF THE ROAD.
- 15 ARTICLE 14. MISCELLANEOUS RULES.
- 16 §17C-14-15. Writing, sending or reading a text message by means
 17 of an electronic communications device or using a
 18 wireless communication device while driving
 19 unlawful; definitions; exceptions; penalties.
- 20 (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b) of this section, a 21 person may not drive or operate a motor vehicle on a public street 22 or highway while texting or using a wireless communication device

- 1 without hands-free equipment.
- 2 (b) A driver is permitted to use an electronic communication
- 3 device to text or a wireless communication device without hands-
- 4 free technology to call while driving during an emergency, when it
- 5 is necessary for the driver to contact law-enforcement officials or
- 6 other emergency services.
- 7 (c) The provisions of this section do not apply to any person
- 8 under the age of eighteen with a level one or level two graduated
- 9 driver's license who operates a motor vehicle pursuant to section
- 10 three-a, article two, chapter seventeen-b of this code.
- 11 (d) As used in this section:
- 12 (1) "Driving" or "operating a motor vehicle" means operating
- 13 a motor vehicle, with the motor running, including while
- 14 temporarily stationary because of traffic, a traffic control device
- 15 or other momentary delays, but does not include operating a motor
- 16 vehicle when the driver moved the vehicle to the side of, or off,
- 17 a highway and halted in a location where the vehicle can safely
- 18 remain stationary;
- 19 (2) "Electronic communication device" includes, but is not
- 20 limited to, a cellular telephone; personal digital assistant,
- 21 pager, computer or any other device used to input, write, send,
- 22 receive or read text. For the purposes of this section, an
- 23 "electronic communication device" does not include:

- 1 (A) Voice radios, mobile radios, land mobile radios,
- 2 commercial mobile radios or two-way radios with the capability to
- 3 transmit and receive voice transmissions utilizing a "push to talk"
- 4 or "press to transmit" function; or
- 5 (B) Other voice radios used by a law-enforcement officer, an
- 6 emergency services provider, an employee or agent of public safety
- 7 organizations, first responders, Amateur Radio Operators (HAM)
- 8 licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and school bus
- 9 operators;
- 10 (3) "Texting" means manually entering alphanumeric text into,
- 11 or reading text from, an electronic communication device, and
- 12 includes, but is not limited to, short message service, e-mailing,
- 13 instant messaging, a command or request to access a World Wide Web
- 14 page or engaging in any other form of electronic text retrieval or
- 15 entry for present or future communication. For purposes of this
- 16 section, "texting" does not include the following actions:
- 17 (A) Reading, selecting or entering a telephone number, an
- 18 extension number, or voicemail retrieval codes and commands into an
- 19 electronic device for the purpose of initiating or receiving a
- 20 phone call or using voice commands to initiate or receive a
- 21 telephone call;
- 22 (B) Inputting, selecting or reading information on a global
- 23 positioning system or navigation system; or

- 1 (C) Using a device capable of performing multiple functions,
- 2 including fleet management systems, dispatching devices, smart
- 3 phones, citizens band radios or music players for a purpose that is
- 4 not otherwise prohibited in this section.
- 5 (e) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection (a)
- 6 of this section is quilty of a traffic offense which may not be
- 7 construed to be a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall
- 8 for a first offense be fined \$100; for a second offense be fined
- 9 \$200; and for a third or subsequent offense be fined \$400. Court
- 10 costs or other fees may not be assessed for a violation of
- 11 subsection (a).
- 12 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the
- 13 contrary, points may not be entered on any driver's record
- 14 maintained by the Division of Motor Vehicles as a result of a
- 15 violation of this section.
- 16 (g) This traffic offense may not be a primary offense for
- 17 citation.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the secondary offense of operating a motor vehicle while texting or using a wireless communications device without hands-free technology.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

\$17C-14-15 is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
