(By Senators Beach, Kessler (Mr. President), Miller and Stollings)

[Originating in the Committee on Education; reported January 25, 2012.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §18A-3A-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to requiring the Center for Professional Development to provide for the routine education of all professional educators and certain service personnel on warning signs and resources to assist in suicide prevention.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18A-3A-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 3A. CENTER FOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT. §18A-3A-2. Professional development project.

- 1 Subject to the provisions of section twenty-three-a,
- 2 article two, chapter eighteen of this code, through this
- 3 project the Center <u>for Professional Development</u> shall:
- 4 (1) Identify, coordinate, arrange and otherwise assist in
- 5 the delivery of professional development programs and
- 6 activities that help professional educators acquire the
- 7 knowledge, skills, attitudes, practices and other such
- 8 pertinent complements deemed considered essential for an
- 9 individual to demonstrate appropriate performance as a
- 10 professional personnel person in the public schools of West
- 11 Virginia. The basis for such the performance shall be the
- 12 laws, policies and regulations adopted for the public schools
- 13 of West Virginia, and amendments thereto. The center also
- 14 may permit and encourage school personnel such as class-
- 15 room aides, higher education teacher education faculty and
- 16 higher education faculty in programs such as articulated tech
- 17 prep associate degree and other programs to participate in
- 18 appropriate professional development programs and activi-
- 19 ties with public school professional educators;
- 20 (2) Identify, coordinate, arrange and otherwise assist in
- 21 the delivery of professional development programs and
- 22 activities that help principals and administrators acquire

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knowledge, skills, attitudes and practices in academic leadership and management principles for principals and 24 25 administrators and such other pertinent complements 26 deemed considered essential for principals and administra-27 tors to demonstrate appropriate performance in the public schools of West Virginia. The basis for such the performance 28 shall be the laws, policies and regulations adopted for the 29 public schools of West Virginia, and amendments thereto; 30 31 (3) Serve in a coordinating capacity to assure that the 32 knowledge, skills, attitude and other pertinent complements of appropriate professional performance which evolve over 33 time in the public school environment are appropriately 34 reflected in the programs approved for the education of 35 36 professional personnel, including, but not limited to, advis-37 ing the teacher education programs of major statutory and policy changes in the public schools which affect the job 38 39 performance requirements of professional educators, includ-

41 (4) Provide for the routine updating of professional skills 42 of professional educators, including principals and administrators, through in-service and other programs. Such The 43 44 routine updating may be provided by the center through

ing principals and administrators;

45 statewide or regional institutes which may require a regis-46 tration fee:

- 47 (5) Provide for the routine education of all professional educators, including principals and administrators, and 48 49 those service personnel having direct contact with students on warning signs and resources to assist in suicide preven-50 51 tion under guidelines established by the state board. The education may be accomplished through self review of 52 53 suicide prevention materials and resources approved by the 54 state board. The provisions of this paragraph may be known 55 and cited as the "Jason Flatt Act of 2012";
- (5) (6) Provide consultation and assistance to county staff 56 development councils established under the provisions of 57 58 section eight, article three of this chapter in planning, 59 designing, coordinating, arranging for and delivering professional development programs to meet the needs of the 60 61 professional educators of their district. From legislative appropriations to the center, for professional development 62 exclusive of such the amounts required for the expenses of 63 64 the principals academy, the center shall, unless otherwise directed by the Legislature, provide assistance in the 65 66 delivery of programs and activities to meet the expressed

67 needs of the school districts for professional development to

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68 help teachers, principals and administrators demonstrate

69 appropriate performance based on the laws, policies and

70 regulations adopted for the public schools of West Virginia;

72 $\frac{(6)}{(7)}$ Cooperate and coordinate with the institutions of

73 higher education to provide professional staff development

74 programs that satisfy some or all of the criteria necessary for

75 currently certified professional educators to meet the

76 requirements for an additional endorsement in an area of

77 certification and for certification to teach in the middle

78 school grades.

79 If the center is not able to reach agreement with the

80 representatives of the institutions providing teacher educa-

81 tion programs on which courses will be approved for credit

82 toward additional endorsements, the state board may certify

33 certain professional staff development courses to meet

84 criteria required by the state board. This certification shall

85 be done on a course by course basis.
