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## **Senate Bill No. 412**

(By Senators Kirkendoll, Browning, Jenkins,  
Plymale, Klempa, Wills and Stollings)

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[Originating in the Committee on the Judiciary;  
reported February 24, 2012.]

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A BILL to amend and reenact §24B-4-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to increasing civil penalties that can be imposed by the Public Service Commission for pipeline safety violations.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That §24B-4-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

### **ARTICLE 4. HEARINGS; BURDEN OF PROOF; ENFORCEMENT.**

**§24B-4-6. Penalties.**

1       (a) Any person who violates any provision of this chapter  
2   or any valid regulation or order issued thereunder ~~shall be is~~  
3   subject to a civil penalty to be imposed by the commission  
4   not to exceed ~~\$1,000 \$200,000~~ for each violation for each day  
5   the violation persists: *Provided*, That the maximum civil  
6   penalty ~~shall may~~ not exceed ~~\$200,000 \$2 million~~ for any  
7   related series of violations.

8       (b) Any civil penalty may be compromised by the com-  
9   mission. In determining the amount of penalty, or the  
10   amount agreed upon in compromise, the appropriateness of  
11   the penalty to the size of the business of the person charged,  
12   the gravity of the violation, and the good faith of the person  
13   charged in attempting to achieve compliance, after notifica-  
14   tion of the violation, shall be considered. The amount of the  
15   penalty, when finally determined, or the amount agreed upon  
16   in compromise, may be deducted from any sums owing by the  
17   state to the person charged or may be recovered in a civil  
18   action in the state courts.

19       (c) Civil penalties collected under this section shall be  
20   paid into the State Treasury.
