

# Senate Bill No. 205

(By Senators Beach, Edgell, D. Facemire, Klempa and Wills)

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[Introduced January 17, 2012; referred to  
the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.]

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A BILL to amend and reenact §17C-3-4b of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to signage for construction zones; and other traffic restrictions.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That §17C-3-4b of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

**ARTICLE 3. TRAFFIC SIGNS, SIGNALS AND MARKINGS.**

**§17C-3-4b. Traffic violations in construction zones; posting requirement; criminal penalty.**

- 1       (a) ~~At each and every location Where street or highway~~
- 2   construction work is ~~to be conducted a sign being conducted,~~
- 3   ~~signs and other traffic control devices, as adopted in section~~
- 4   ~~one, article three, chapter seventeen-c of this code,~~ shall be
- 5   posted ~~at least one thousand feet from the construction site,~~
- 6   ~~or as close to one thousand feet from the construction site as~~

7 is practicable given giving the location of the site when  
8 workers are present, work and notifying all motorists as to  
9 the speed limit and displaying the words "construction work"  
10 any other traffic restrictions.

11 (b) Any person who exceeds any posted speed restriction  
12 or traffic restriction at a construction site referred to in  
13 subsection (a) of this section by less than fifteen miles per  
14 hour is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction  
15 thereof, shall be fined not more than \$200.

16 (c) Any person who exceeds any posted speed restriction  
17 or traffic restriction at a construction site referred to in  
18 subsection (a) of this section by fifteen miles per hour or  
19 more is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction  
20 thereof, shall be fined not more than \$200 or confined in a  
21 county or regional jail not more than twenty days, or both.

22 (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to preclude  
23 prosecution of any operator of a motor vehicle who commits  
24 a violation of any other provision of this code for such  
25 violation.

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(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to update language to reflect current standards used by the Division of Highways and identified in the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.)
