Senate Bill No. 428

(By Senators Beach and Klempa)

[Introduced January 25, 2012; referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure; and then to the Committee on Finance.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §17A-3-23 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to registration plates for state, county, municipal and other governmental vehicles; authorizing the Commissioner of the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue no more than five Class A registration plates to the division for vehicles to be used by investigators for commercial driver examination fraud investigation and driver's license issuance fraud detection and fraud prevention; authorizing the commissioner to issue Class A registration plates to Medicaid Fraud Control Unit and the West Virginia Insurance Fraud Unit; deleting an outdated requirement; and providing penalties. Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §17A-3-23 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 3. ORIGINAL AND RENEWAL OF REGISTRATION; ISSU-ANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF TITLE.

§17A-3-23. Registration plates to state, county, municipal and other governmental vehicles; use for undercover activities.

1 (a) Any motor vehicle designed to carry passengers, owned or leased by the State of West Virginia, or any of its 2 3 departments, bureaus, commissions or institutions, except 4 vehicles used by the Governor, Treasurer, three vehicles per 5 elected office of the Board of Public Works, vehicles operated 6 by the State Police, not to exceed five vehicles operated by 7 the Office of the Secretary of Military Affairs and Public Safety, not to exceed five vehicles operated by the Division 8 9 of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, vehicles 10 operated by natural resources police officers of the Division 11 of Natural Resources, not to exceed ten vehicles operated by the arson investigators of the Office of State Fire Marshal, 12not to exceed two vehicles operated by the Division of 13 14 Protective Services, not to exceed sixteen vehicles operated

by inspectors of the Office of the Alcohol Beverage Control 15Commissioner and vehicles operated by probation officers 1617employed under the Supreme Court of Appeals may not be 18 operated or driven by any person unless it has displayed and 19attached to the front thereof, in the same manner as regular motor vehicle registration plates are attached, a plate of the 20 21same size as the regular registration plate, with white lettering on a green background bearing the words "West 22Virginia" in one line and the words "State Car" in another 2324line and the lettering for the words "State Car" shall be of 25sufficient size to be plainly readable from a distance of one hundred feet during daylight. 26

The vehicle shall also have attached to the rear a plate bearing a number and any other words and figures as the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall prescribe. The rear plate shall also be green with the number in white.

(b) On registration <u>Registration</u> plates issued to vehicles
owned by counties the color shall be white on red with the
word "County" on top of the plate and the words "West
Virginia" on the bottom.

35 (c) On any registration <u>Registration</u> plates issued to a city
36 or municipality the color shall be white on blue with the

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37 word "City" on top and the words "West Virginia" on the38 bottom.

39(d) Provided, That after December 31, 2006, registration 40 Registration plates issued to a city or municipality law-41 enforcement department shall include blue lettering on a white background with the word "West Virginia" on top of 42the plate and shall be further designed by the commissioner 43to include a law-enforcement shield together with other 44 45insignia or lettering sufficient to identify the motor vehicle 46 as a municipal law-enforcement department motor vehicle. 47 The colors may not be reversed and shall be of reflectorized material. The registration plates issued to counties, munici-48 49 palities and other governmental agencies authorized to 50 receive colored plates hereunder shall be affixed to both the 51front and rear of the vehicles. Every municipality shall provide the commissioner with a list of law-enforcement 52vehicles operated by the law-enforcement department of the 53 municipality, unless otherwise provided in this section, and 54 a fee of \$10 for each vehicle submitted by July 1, 2006. 55

56 (c) (e) Registration plates issued to vehicles operated by
57 county sheriffs shall be designed by the commissioner in
58 cooperation with the sheriffs' association with the word

59 "Sheriff" on top of the plate and the words "West Virginia"
60 on the bottom. The plate shall contain a gold shield repre61 senting the sheriff's star and a number assigned to that plate
62 by the commissioner. Every county sheriff shall provide the
63 commissioner with a list of vehicles operated by the sheriff,
64 unless otherwise provided in this section, and a fee of \$10 for
65 each vehicle submitted by July 1, 2002.

(d) (f) The commissioner is authorized to designate the
colors and design of any other registration plates that are
issued without charge to any other agency in accordance
with the motor vehicle laws.

(e) (g) Upon application, the commissioner is authorized
to issue a maximum of five Class A license plates per applicant to be used by county sheriffs and municipalities on lawenforcement vehicles while engaged in undercover investigations.

(h) The commissioner is authorized to issue a maximum
of five Class A license plates to be used on vehicles assigned
to the Division of Motor Vehicle investigators for commercial
driver examination fraud investigation and driver's license
issuance fraud detection and fraud prevention.

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80 (f) (i) The commissioner is authorized to issue an unlim-81 ited number of license plates per applicant to authorized 82 drug and violent crime task forces in the State of West Virginia when the chairperson of the control group of a drug 83 and violent crime task force signs a written affidavit stating 84 that the vehicle or vehicles for which the plates are being 85 86 requested will be used only for official undercover work 87 conducted by a drug and violent crime task force.

(g) (j) The commissioner is authorized to issue twenty
Class A license plates to the Criminal Investigation Division
of the Department of Revenue for use by its investigators.

91(h) (k) The commissioner may issue a maximum of ten 92 Class A license plates to the Division of Natural Resources 93 for use by natural resources police officers. The commissioner shall designate the color and design of the registration 9495 plates to be displayed on the front and the rear of all other 96 state-owned vehicles owned by the Division of Natural Resources and operated by natural resources police officers. 97 98 (i) (l) The commissioner is authorized to issue an unlim-99 ited number of Class A license plates to the Commission on 100 Special Investigations for state-owned vehicles used for

101 official undercover work conducted by the Commission on102 Special Investigations.

(m) The commissioner is authorized to issue a maximum
of two Class A plates to the Division of Protective Services
for state-owned vehicles used by the Division of Protective
Services in fulfilling its mission.

- 107 (n) The commissioner is authorized to issue Class A
 108 registration plates for vehicles used by the Medicaid Fraud
 109 Control Unit created by section seven, article seven, chapter
 110 nine of this code.
- (o) The commissioner is authorized to issue Class A
 registration plates for vehicles used by the West Virginia
 Insurance Fraud Unit created by section eight, article fortyone, chapter thirty-three of this code.

(j) (p) No other registration plate may be issued for, or
attached to, any state-owned vehicle.

(k) (q) The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall have a
sufficient number of both front and rear plates produced to
attach to all state-owned cars. The numbered registration
plates for the vehicles shall start with the number five
hundred and the commissioner shall issue consecutive
numbers for all state-owned cars.

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(1) (r) It is the duty of each office, department, bureau,
commission or institution furnished any vehicle to have
plates as described herein affixed thereto prior to the
operation of the vehicle by any official or employee.

127(m) (s) The commissioner may issue special registration 128 plates for motor vehicles titled in the name of the Division of 129Public Transit or in the name of a public transit authority as 130defined in this subsection and operated by a public transit 131authority or a public transit provider to transport persons in the public interest. For purposes of this subsection, "public 132 transit authority" means an urban mass transportation 133 authority created pursuant to the provisions of article 134twenty-seven, chapter eight of this code or a nonprofit entity 135136exempt from federal and state income taxes under the Internal Revenue Code and whose purpose is to provide mass 137138 transportation to the public at large. The special registration 139plate shall be designed by the commissioner and shall display the words "public transit" or words or letters of 140 similar effect to indicate the public purpose of the use of the 141 142 vehicle. The special registration plate shall be issued without 143 charge.

(n) (t) Any person who violates the provisions of this
section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction
thereof, shall be fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$100.
Magistrates have concurrent jurisdiction with circuit courts
for the enforcement of this section.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Commissioner of the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue no more than five Class A registration plates to the division for vehicles to be used by investigators for commercial driver examination fraud investigation and driver's license issuance fraud detection and fraud prevention. The bill authorizes the commissioner to issue Class A registration plates to Medicaid Fraud Control Unit and the West Virginia Insurance Fraud Unit. The bill deletes the outdated requirement that municipalities provide the commissioner with lists of vehicles used by their law-enforcement departments. The bill also provides for penalties.
