## Senate Bill No. 54

(By Senators Green, D. Facemire, Williams, Beach and Stollings)

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[Introduced January 11, 2012; referred to the Committee on Health and Human Resources; and then to the Committee on the Judiciary.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §16-38-3 and §16-38-7 of the Code

of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to prohibiting

minors under the age of sixteen from obtaining a tattoo;

requiring a parent or legal guardian be present at the tattoo

 $studio\, and\, provide\, photo\, identification\, and\, written\, consent\, for\,$ 

minors sixteen years of age or older; and providing for penal-

ties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §16-38-3 and §16-38-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,

as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 38. TATTOO STUDIO BUSINESS.

§16-38-3. Operation standards.

- 1 (a) Records. —
- 2 (1) Proper records of tattoos administered shall be
- 3 maintained for each patron by the holder of the studio
- 4 registration;
- 5 (2) A record shall be prepared for each patron prior to
- 6 any procedure being performed and shall include the
- 7 patron's name and signature, address, age, date tattooed,
- 8 design of the tattoo, location of the tattoo on the patron's
- 9 body and the name of the tattoo artist who performed the
- 10 work;
- 11 (3) Record entries shall be in ink or indelible pencil and
- 12 shall be available for examination by the inspecting authori-
- 13 ties provided in section six of this article;
- 14 (4) Before tattoo administration, the owner or tattoo
- 15 artist shall discuss with the patron the risks involved in the
- 16 tattoo requested, including the potential that a tattoo may
- 17 interfere with the clinical reading of a magnetic resonance
- 18 imaging study should the patron intending to be tattooed
- 19 ever encounter a medical need for such a study. The owner
- 20 shall provide the patron with written information regarding
- 21 the possible complications that may arise from receiving a
- 22 tattoo. The written information shall be prepared by the

- 23 Department of Health and Human Resources. Receipt of the
- 24 information shall be acknowledged in writing by the patron.
- 25 The owner or tattoo artist shall also keep and maintain the
- 26 acknowledgment as part of the patron's record pursuant to
- 27 the provisions of subdivision (5) of this subsection;
- 28 (5) All records required by this section shall be kept on
- 29 file for five years by the holder of the studio registration for
- 30 the studio in which the tattoo was performed.
- 31 (b) *Consent.* —
- 32 (1) Prior written consent for tattooing of minors shall be
- 33 <del>obtained from one parent or guardian</del> <u>No person under the</u>
- 34 age of sixteen may be tattooed. It is prohibited to tattoo a
- 35 minor sixteen years of age or older, without the written
- 36 consent of the parent or legal guardian. This consent must be
- 37 given in person to the tattoo artist or responsible person at
- 38 the studio by the parent or legal guardian at the time the
- 39 tattooing is to commence. Photographic identification of the
- 40 parent or legal guardian is required;
- 41 (2) All written consents shall be kept on file for five years
- 42 by the holder of the studio registration for the tattoo studio
- 43 in which the tattoo was performed;

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- 44 (3) The person receiving the tattoo shall attest to the fact
- 45 that he or she is not intoxicated or under the influence of
- 46 drugs or alcohol.
- 47 (c) Tattooing procedures. —
- 48 (1) Printed instructions on the care of the skin after
- 49 tattooing shall be given to each patron as a precaution to
- 50 prevent infection;
- 51 (2) A copy of the printed instructions shall be posted in
- 52 a conspicuous place, clearly visible to the person being
- 53 tattooed;
- 54 (3) Each tattoo artist shall wear a clean outer garment,
- 55 i.e., apron, smock, t-shirt, etc.;
- 56 (4) Tattoo artists who are experiencing diarrhea, vomit-
- 57 ing, fever, rash, productive cough, jaundice, draining or open
- 58 skin infections such as boils which could be indicative of
- 59 more serious conditions such as, but not limited to, impetigo,
- 60 scabies, hepatitis-b, HIV or AIDS shall refrain from tattoo-
- 61 ing activities until such time as they are no longer experienc-
- 62 ing or exhibiting the aforementioned symptoms;
- 63 (5) Before working on each patron, the fingernails and
- 64 hands of the tattoo artist shall be thoroughly washed and

- 65 scrubbed with hot running water, antibacterial soap and an
- 66 individual hand brush that is clean and in good repair;
- 67 (6) The tattoo artist's hands shall be air blown dried or
- 68 dried by a single-use towel. In addition, disposable latex
- 69 examination gloves shall be worn during the tattoo process.
- 70 The gloves shall be changed each time there is an interrup-
- 71 tion in the tattoo application, the gloves become torn or
- 72 punctured or whenever their ability to function as a barrier
- 73 is compromised;
- 74 (7) Only sterilized or single-use, disposable razors shall
- 75 be used to shave the area to be tattooed;
- 76 (8) Immediately prior to beginning the tattoo procedure,
- 77 the affected skin area shall be treated with an antibacterial
- 78 solution;
- 79 (9) If an acetate stencil is used by a tattoo artist for
- 80 transferring the design to the skin, the acetate stencil shall
- 81 be thoroughly cleaned and rinsed in a germicidal solution for
- 82 at least twenty minutes and then dried with sterile gauze or
- 83 dried in the air on a sanitized surface after each use;
- 84 (10) If a paper stencil is used by a tattoo artist for
- 85 transferring the design to the skin, the paper stencil shall be
- 86 single-use and disposable;

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- 87 (11) If the design is drawn directly onto the skin, the
- 88 design shall be applied with a single-use article only.
- 89 (d) Dyes or pigments. —
- 90 (1) Only nontoxic sterile dyes or pigments shall be used
- 91 and shall be prepared in sterilized or disposable single-use
- 92 containers for each patron;
- 93 (2) After tattooing, the unused dye or pigment in the
- 94 single-use containers shall be discarded along with the
- 95 container;
- 96 (3) All dyes or pigments used in tattooing shall be from
- 97 professional suppliers specifically providing dyes or pig-
- 98 ments for the tattooing of human skin.
- 99 (e) Sterilization of needles. —
- 100 (1) A set of individual, sterilized needles shall be used for
- 101 each patron;
- 102 (2) No less than twenty-four sets of sterilized needles and
- tubes shall be on hand for the entire day or night operation.
- 104 Unused sterilized instruments shall be resterilized at
- 105 intervals of no more than six months from the date of the last
- 106 sterilization;
- 107 (3) Used, nondisposable instruments shall be kept in a

- 108 separate, puncture resistant container until brush scrubbed
- 109 in hot water and soap and then sterilized by autoclaving;
- (4) If used instruments are ultrasonically cleaned prior to
- 111 being placed in the used instrument container, they shall be
- 112 ultrasonically cleaned and then rinsed under running hot
- 113 water prior to being placed in the used instrument container;
- 114 (5) The ultrasonic unit shall be sanitized daily with a
- 115 germicidal solution;
- (6) If used instruments are not ultrasonically cleaned
- 117 prior to being placed in the used instrument container, they
- 118 shall be kept in a germicidal or soap solution until brush
- 119 scrubbed in hot water and soap and then sterilized by
- 120 autoclaving;
- 121 (7) All nondisposable instruments, including the needle
- 122 tubes, shall be sterilized and shall be handled and stored in
- such a manner as to prevent contamination. Instruments to
- be sterilized shall be sealed in bags made specifically for the
- 125 purpose of autoclave sterilization and shall include the date
- 126 of sterilization. If nontransparent sterilization bags are
- 127 utilized, the bag shall also list the contents;
- 128 (8) Autoclave sterilization bags, with a color code
- 129 indicator which changes color upon proper steam steriliza-

- 130 tion, shall be utilized during the autoclave sterilization
- 131 process;
- (9) Instruments shall be placed in the autoclave in such
- 133 a manner as to allow live steam to circulate around them;
- 134 (10) No rusty, defective or faulty instruments shall be
- 135 kept in the studio.
- 136 (f) Aftercare of tattoo. —
- The completed tattoo shall be washed with a single-use
- 138 towel saturated with an antibacterial solution.

## §16-38-7. Violations and penalties.

- 1 Any owner of a tattoo studio who does not obtain a West
- 2 Virginia business registration certificate, who does not
- 3 register with their local or regional board of health, or who
- 4 fails to request an inspection pursuant to section six of this
- 5 article, who administers a tattoo to a minor under sixteen
- 6 years of age or administers a tattoo to a minor sixteen years
- 7 of age or older without proper parental consent set forth in
- 8 this article is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction
- 9 thereof, for a first offense, may have all of the tattoo equip-
- 10 ment and paraphernalia confiscated and shall be fined \$100.
- 11 For a second offense, which is a misdemeanor, the owner
- 12 may have all of the tattoo equipment and paraphernalia

confiscated and shall be fined not less than \$500 nor more
than \$1,000 or confined in county or regional jail not less
than ten days nor more than one year, or both fined and
imprisoned confined. For a third offense, which is a misdemeanor, the owner shall have all the tattoo equipment and
paraphernalia confiscated, shall be fined not less than \$1,000
nor more than \$5,000, or confined in county or regional jail
not less than thirty days nor more than one year, or both
fined and imprisoned confined.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit minors under the age of sixteen from obtaining a tattoo. The bill requires a parent or legal guardian to be present at the tattoo studio, provide photo identification and written consent for minors sixteen years of age or older obtaining a tattoo. The bill also provides for penalties.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.)
