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1 application of the effective schools research, including components 2 such as instructional leadership, school climate, high student 3 expectations, emphasis on academic and occupational achievement and 4 community and parental involvement. The program shall be 5 coordinated by the bureau of vocational, technical and adult 6 education with the advisement from a committee composed of two 7 vocational administrators, two vocational teachers, one vocational 8 guidance counselor, one educator of vocational teachers, one county 9 school superintendent, one comprehensive high school principal, one 10 academic teacher, two business/industry representatives, one labor 11 representative and one vocational education program completer. 12 <u>Seventh grade and older students may receive vocational-technical</u>

13 education.
