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12	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
13	adding thereto a new section, designated $\$15-2-5a$, relating to
14	compensating certain state troopers for off-duty time when
15	they are required to be on standby to be called back to work;
16	and requiring that state troopers on off-duty time that are
17	called in to work or appear in court are guaranteed the
18	greater of at least two hours or the actual number of hours
19	worked.
20	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
21	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
22	by adding thereto a new section, designated $$15-2-5a$, to read as
23	follows:
24	ARTICLE 2. WEST VIRGINIA STATE POLICE.

§15-2-5a. Compensation for call-back time.

- 1 (a) Any time the West Virginia State Police requires a State
 2 Police Officer during the officer's off-duty hours to be restricted
 3 as to where the officer may go or what the officer may do to enable
 4 that officer to quickly return to duty, the officer shall be paid
 5 the minimum wage as set forth in section two, article five-c,
 6 chapter twenty-one of this code for every hour which the officer is
 7 on call. This code section only pertains to nonexempt State Police
 8 Officers as defined under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA).
 9 This pay is not subject to retirement deduction or used in
 10 retirement annuity calculations.
- 11 (b) State Police Officers who are off-duty and called back to
 12 work by the West Virginia State Police or required to appear in
 13 court, shall be guaranteed a minimum of two hours work or actual
 14 hours worked, whichever is greater.

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
