13	providing an exemption from the requirement for a Class D
14	driver's license for certain nonresident drivers.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §17B-2-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 2. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE, EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL.
19	<pre>§17B-2-2. Persons exempt from license.</pre>
20	The following persons are exempt from license hereunder:
21	(1) Any person while operating a motor vehicle in the armed
22	services of the United States while in the performance of his \underline{or}

1 her official duties;

2 (2) A nonresident who is at least sixteen years of age and who 3 has in his <u>or her</u> immediate possession a valid driver's license 4 issued to the person in the person's home state or country, unless 5 the commissioner determines the person's home state or country does 6 not extend the same privileges to a resident of this state, may 7 operate a motor vehicle in this state only as a noncommercial 8 driver for a period not to exceed ninety days in any one calendar 9 year;

(3) A nonresident who is at least sixteen years of age who has 11 in the person's immediate possession a valid driver's license 12 issued to the person in the person's home state or country and who 13 is employed in this state, or owns, maintains or operates a place 14 or places of business in this state, or engages in any trade, 15 profession or occupation in this state, in addition to the driving 16 privileges extended under subdivision (2) of this section, unless 17 the commissioner determines the person's home state or country does 18 not extend the same privileges to a resident of this state, may 19 operate a motor vehicle in this state only as a noncommercial 20 driver in traveling to and from the person's place or places of 21 employment, place or places of business or place or places at which 22 the person engages in the trade, profession or occupation and in 23 the discharge of the duties of the person's employment, business,

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1 trade, profession or occupation if the duties are such that, if 2 performed by a resident of the State of West Virginia over the age 3 of eighteen years of age, the resident would not be required under 4 the provisions of this chapter to obtain a Class A, B, C or D 5 driver's license: <u>Provided, That a nonresident driver who meets</u> 6 the minimum age and experience requirements for a Class D driver's 7 license pursuant to subdivision (2), subsection (c), section one, 8 article two, chapter seventeen-b of the code who is licensed in a 9 jurisdiction that does not offer an equivalent driver's license may 10 operate a motor vehicle in this state that requires a resident to 11 <u>have a Class D license.</u> However, this subsection shall not exempt 12 any person who is required to obtain a West Virginia driver's 13 license in accordance with the provisions of section one-a of this 14 article;

(4) A nonresident who is at least eighteen years of age and 16 who has in his or her immediate possession a valid commercial 17 driver's license issued to the person in his or her home state or 18 country and which meets the requirements of the federal Commercial 19 Motor Vehicle Act of 1986, Title XI of public law 99-570, and 20 unless the commissioner determines the person's home state or 21 country does not extend the same privilege to a resident of this 22 state, may operate a motor vehicle in this state either as a 23 commercial driver subject to the age limits applicable to

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1 commercial driver in this state, or as a noncommercial driver 2 subject to the limitations imposed on nonresident drivers in 3 subdivisions (2) and (3) of this section;

4 (5) Any person who is a student, properly enrolled and 5 registered in an accredited school, college or university in this 6 state, who is at least sixteen years of age and who has in his or 7 her immediate possession a valid driver's license issued to the 8 person in the person's home state, notwithstanding the limitations 9 of subdivisions (2) and (3) of this section, may operate a motor 10 vehicle in this state only as <u>a</u> noncommercial driver: *Provided*, 11 That the state of which the person is a resident shall extend the 12 same privileges to residents of this state. This exemption shall 13 be canceled immediately when the student is graduated from school, 14 college or university or is expelled or ceases to be a student.

⁽NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide reciprocity to certain nonresidents whose primary occupation is operating motor vehicles which would require a Class D license in this state but do not require an equivalent licence in the nonresident's state. Operation of vehicles requiring a Class D license does not require a commercial driver's license.

This legislation was recommended for passage in the 2013 Regular Session by the Legislative Select Committee on Infrastructure.
