17	adding thereto a new section, designated §60A-3-301a, all
18	relating to permits for manufacturing, making, producing,
19	packing, packaging or preparing drugs, medicines, toilet
20	articles, dentifrices and cosmetics and registration of
21	practitioners dispensing controlled substances; modifying fees

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associated with the permits; granting rule-making authority to

the Board of Pharmacy to establish a fee schedule for

obtaining and maintaining the permit; providing that statutory

fee schedule will remain in effect until amended, modified,

repealed or replaced by legislative rule; clarifying

- 1 disciplinary action that may be taken if condition or rule 2 relating to permit is violated; modifying registration fees 3 for practitioners dispensing controlled substances; granting rule-making authority to boards, departments and agencies that 4 5 license or register practitioners dispensing controlled 6 substances; and providing that statutory fee schedule for 7 registering practitioners dispensing controlled substances 8 will remain in effect until amended, modified, repealed or 9 replaced by legislative rule.
- 10 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
- That §30-5-1a and §30-5-16 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, 12 as amended, be amended and reenacted; that said code be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §30-5-16c; that §60A-3-301 of said code be amended and reenacted; and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §60A-3-301a, 16 all to read as follows:
- 17 CHAPTER 30. PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS.
- 18 ARTICLE 5. PHARMACISTS, PHARMACY TECHNICIANS, PHARMACY INTERNS AND
- 19 PHARMACIES.
- 20 §30-5-1a. Statement of purpose.
- 21 <u>(a)</u> It is the purpose of this article to promote, preserve and 22 protect the public health, safety and welfare by the effective 23 regulation of the practice of pharmacy; the licensure of 24 pharmacists; and the licensure and regulation of all sites or 25 persons who distribute, manufacture or sell drugs or devices used

- 1 in the dispensing and administration of drugs or devices within 2 this state.
- 3 (b) A person, firm, corporation, partnership, company,
- 4 cooperative society or organization who offers any legend drugs for
- 5 sale, or sells, offers or exposes for sale through any method of
- 6 distribution, is subject to this article.
- 7 §30-5-16. Permit for manufacture and packaging of drugs,
- 8 medicines, cosmetics; distribution of legend drugs;
- 9 regulations as to sanitation and equipment;
- 10 penalties; revocation of permit.
- 11 (a) No drugs, or medicines, or toilet articles, dentifrices or
- 12 cosmetics shall be manufactured, made, produced, packed, packaged
- 13 or prepared within the state except under the personal supervision
- 14 of a pharmacist as defined by section one-b of this article or such
- 15 any other person as may be approved by the Board of Pharmacy after
- 16 an investigation and determination by the board that they are the
- 17 person is qualified by scientific or technical training and/or
- 18 experience to perform such the duties of supervision as may be
- 19 necessary to protect the public health and safety.
- 20 (b) No A person shall not manufacture, make, produce, pack,
- 21 package or prepare any such of these articles without first
- 22 obtaining a permit to do so from the Board of Pharmacy. The permit
- 23 shall be is subject to such rules with respect to sanitation and/or
- 24 equipment as promulgated by the Board of Pharmacy may from time to
- 25 time adopt for the protection of the public health and safety.

- 4 legend drugs shall be subject to this article.

- 6 section shall be made on a form, the contents of which shall to be
- 7 prescribed by legislative rule, and furnished by the Board of
- 8 Pharmacy and shall be accompanied by the following appropriate
- 9 fees. For a distributor, \$150, for a manufacturer, \$500, which
- 10 amounts shall also be are also paid as the fees for each annual
- 11 renewal of such the permits. Separate applications shall be made
- 12 and separate permits issued for each separate place of manufacture,
- 13 distribution, making, producing, packing, packaging or preparation.
- 14 (e) The following fees shall be charged for a permit to handle
- 15 controlled substances: For a hospital or clinic, \$50; for extended
- 16 care facilities, \$25; for a nursing home, \$25; for a teaching
- 17 institution, \$25; for a researcher, \$25; for a medical examiner,
- 18 \$25; and for a pharmacy or drugstore, \$15, which amounts shall also
- 19 be paid for each annual renewal of such permits.
- 20 (d) The board may establish, by legislative rule, application
- 21 and renewal fees for a permit required by this section: Provided,
- 22 That the fee schedule in effect as of July 1, 2013, shall remain in
- 23 effect until amended, modified, repealed or replaced by any

- 16 (a) The State Board of Pharmacy shall promulgate rules and
- 17 charge fees relating to the registration and control of the
- 18 manufacture and distribution of controlled substances within this
- 19 state. and Each department, board or agency of this state which
- 20 licenses or registers practitioners authorized to dispense any a
- 21 controlled substance shall promulgate rules and charge fees
- 22 relating to the registration and control of the dispensing of
- 23 controlled substances within this state by those practitioners
- 24 licensed or registered by such that department, board or agency.
- 25 The State Board of Pharmacy or the department, board or agency

- 1 shall collect the following annual registration fees from persons
- 2 who manufacture, distribute, dispense or conduct research with
- 3 controlled substances: For registration of a manufacturer, \$50;
- 4 for registration of a wholesaler, \$50; for registration of a
- 5 retailer \$15. for registration of a hospital or clinic, \$15; and
- 6 for registration of a research institution, \$5.
- 7 (b) The fee schedule in effect as of July 1, 2013, shall
- 8 remain in effect until amended, modified, repealed or replaced by
- 9 any legislative rule promulgated pursuant to this section.
- 10 **§60A-3-301a**. Fee schedule.
- 11 Until amended, modified, repealed or replaced by legislative
- 12 rule, the State Board of Pharmacy or any department, board or
- 13 agency shall collect the following annual registration fees from
- 14 persons who manufacture, distribute, dispense or conduct research
- 15 with respect to controlled substances:
- 16 (1) \$50 for registration of a manufacturer;
- 17 (2) \$50 for registration of a wholesaler;
- 18 (3) \$50 for registration of a hospital or clinic;
- 19 (4) \$25 for registration of a medical examiner;
- 20 (5) \$25 for registration of a teaching or research
- 21 institution;
- 22 (6) \$25 for registration of a nursing home or an extended care
- 23 facility; and
- 24 (7) \$15 for registration of a dispenser.
