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11	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$61-7-6$ and $\$61-7-6a$ of the Code of
12	West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to allowing a
13	resident of another state to carry a handgun in West Virginia
14	if the person holds a valid permit or license to possess or
15	carry a handgun from the other state and the other state
16	allows residents of West Virginia who are licensed in West
17	Virginia to carry a concealed deadly weapon to carry a
18	concealed deadly weapon in that state.
19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That §61-7-6 and §61-7-6a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
21	as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
22	ARTICLE 7. DANGEROUS WEAPONS.
23	§61-7-6. Exceptions as to prohibitions against carrying concealed
24	deadly weapons.
25	The licensure provisions set forth in this article do not
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1 apply to:

2 (1) Any person:

3 (A) Carrying a deadly weapon upon his or her own premises; nor
 4 shall anything herein prevent a person from

5 <u>(B)</u> Carrying any <u>a</u> firearm, unloaded, from the place of 6 purchase to his or her home, residence or place of business or to 7 a place of repair and back to his or her home, residence or place 8 of business; nor shall anything herein prohibit a person <u>or</u>

9 <u>(C)</u> From possessing a firearm while hunting in a lawful manner 10 or while traveling from his or her home, residence or place of 11 business to a hunting site and returning to his or her home, 12 residence or place of business;

13 (2) Any person who is a member of a properly organized 14 target-shooting club authorized by law to obtain firearms by 15 purchase or requisition from this state or from the United States 16 for the purpose of target practice from carrying any pistol, as 17 defined in this article, unloaded, from his or her home, residence 18 or place of business to a place of target practice and from any 19 place of target practice back to his or her home, residence or 20 place of business, for using any such weapon at a place of target 21 practice in training and improving his or her skill in the use of 22 the weapons;

(3) Any law-enforcement officer or law-enforcement official as
24 defined in section one, article twenty-nine, chapter thirty of this
25 code;

1 (4) Any employee of the West Virginia Division of Corrections 2 duly appointed pursuant to the provisions of section five, article 3 five, chapter twenty-eight of this code while the employee is on 4 duty;

5 (5) Any member of the armed forces of the United States or the 6 militia of this state while the member is on duty;

7 (6) Any circuit judge, including any retired circuit judge 8 designated senior status by the Supreme Court of Appeals of West 9 Virginia, prosecuting attorney, assistant prosecuting attorney or 10 a duly appointed investigator employed by a prosecuting attorney; 11 (7) Any resident of another state who holds a valid <u>permit or</u> 12 license to <u>possess or</u> carry a <u>concealed weapon handgun issued</u> by a 13 state or a political subdivision <u>which has entered into a</u> 14 <del>reciprocity agreement with this state,</del> subject to the provisions 15 and limitations set forth in section six-a of this article;

16 (8) Any federal law-enforcement officer or federal police 17 officer authorized to carry a weapon in the performance of the 18 officer's duty; and

(9) Any Hatfield-McCoy Regional Recreation Authority Rangerwhile the ranger is on duty.

21 §61-7-6a. Reciprocity and recognition; out-of-state concealed
 handgun permits.

(a) A holder of a valid out-of-state permit or license to
 24 possess or carry a concealed handgun as issued by another state
 25 with which the State of West Virginia has executed a reciprocity

1 agreement shall be recognized as <u>is</u> valid in this state <u>for the</u>
2 <u>carrying of a concealed handgun</u>, if the following conditions are
3 met:

4 (1) The permit or license holder is twenty-one years <u>of age</u> or
5 older;

6 (2) The permit or license is in his or her immediate
7 possession;

8 (3) The permit or license holder is not a resident of the 9 State of West Virginia; and

10 (4) The State of West Virginia has executed a valid and 11 effective reciprocity agreement with the issuing state pertaining 12 to the carrying and verification of concealed handgun licenses and 13 permits issued in the respective states. The Attorney General has 14 been notified by the Governor of the other state that the other 15 state allows residents of West Virginia who are licensed in West 16 Virginia to carry a concealed deadly weapon to carry a concealed 17 deadly weapon in that state or the Attorney General has entered 18 into a written reciprocity agreement with the appropriate official 19 of the other state whereby the state agrees to honor West Virginia 20 concealed handgun licenses in return for same treatment in this 21 state.

(b) A holder of a valid permit or license from another state a who is authorized to carry a concealed handgun in this state pursuant to provisions of this section is subject to the same laws and restrictions with respect to carrying a concealed handgun as a

1 resident of West Virginia who is so permitted, and must carry the 2 concealed handgun in compliance with the laws of this state.

3 (c) A license or permit from another state is not valid in 4 this state if the holder is or becomes prohibited by law from 5 possessing a firearm.

6 (d) The West Virginia Attorney General shall seek to <u>obtain</u> 7 <u>recognition of West Virginia concealed handgun licenses and</u> enter 8 into and may execute reciprocity agreements on behalf of the State 9 of West Virginia with states <del>which meet the following standards and</del> 10 <del>requirements:</del>

11 (1) The standards applied by the other state before issuing a 12 concealed handgun license or permit must be similar to or greater 13 than the standards imposed by this article;

14 (2) This state's law-enforcement officers have continuous 15 access to databases on the criminal information network, 16 8twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week, to verify the 17 continued validity of any license or permit to carry a concealed 18 handgun that has been granted by the issuing state;

19 (3) The other state agrees to grant the right to carry a
20 concealed handgun to residents of West Virginia who have valid
21 concealed handgun permits issued pursuant to this article in their

22 possession while carrying concealed weapons in that state; and 23 (4) The states agree to apprise one another of changes in 24 permitting standards and requirements, to provide for a prompt 25 reexamination of whether any adopted change in licensing or

1 permitting standards negates the states' ability to continue with
2 the reciprocity agreement. for the recognition of concealed handgun
3 permits issued pursuant to this article.

4 (e) The West Virginia State Police shall maintain a registry 5 of states with which the State of West Virginia has entered into 6 reciprocity agreements <u>or which recognize West Virginia concealed</u> 7 <u>handgun licenses</u> on the criminal information network and make the 8 registry available to law-enforcement officers for investigative 9 purposes.

(f) Every twelve months after the effective date of this section, the West Virginia Attorney General shall make written inquiry of the concealed handgun <u>licensing or</u> permitting authorities in each other state as to: (i) Whether a West Virginia resident may carry a concealed handgun in their state based upon having a valid West Virginia concealed handgun permit; and (ii) whether a West Virginia resident may carry a concealed handgun in that state based upon having a valid West Virginia concealed handgun permit, pursuant to the laws of that state or by the secution of a valid reciprocity agreement between the states.

(g) The West Virginia State Police shall make available to the public a list of states which have entered into reciprocity agreements with the State of West Virginia <u>or that allow residents</u> of West Virginia who are licensed in West Virginia to carry a <u>concealed deadly weapon to carry a concealed deadly weapon in that</u> <u>state.</u>

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide full faith and credit to a nonresident who has a permit or license to carry a handgun in his or her state when that state allows residents of West Virginia who are licensed in West Virginia to carry a concealed deadly weapon to carry a concealed deadly weapon in that other state.
