Establishment of state speed zones. 20 Whenever the state road commissioner shall determine upon 21 Commissioner of Highways determines, on the basis of an engineering 22 and traffic investigation, that any a speed limit set forth in this 23 article is greater or less than is reasonable or safe under the 24 conditions found to exist at any at an intersection or other place 25 or <del>upon any</del> on a part of a highway, said the commissioner may

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1 determine and declare a reasonable and safe speed limit thereat
2 which shall be effective at all times or during hours of daylight
3 or darkness or at such other times as may be determined. when as
4 determined. Appropriate signs giving notice thereof are erected at
5 such shall be erected at the intersection or other place or part of
6 the highway at which time the change in speed limit is effective.
7 Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, the speed
8 limit on the section of I-77, also known as the West Virginia
9 Turnpike, between the Chelyan exit, exit 85 in Kanawha County, and
10 the Mossy exit, exit 60 in Fayette County, is 70 mph. This speed
11 limit does not apply in a construction zone, to trucks which are
12 otherwise limited or on the stretches of road immediately preceding
13 the toll plaza.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase the speed limit from 60 mph to 70 mph on the West Virginia Turnpike between the Chelyan exit, exit 85 in Kanawha County, and the Mossy exit, exit 60 in Fayette County.
