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10 A BILL to amend and reenact article 9, chapter 64 of the Code of
11 West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to authorizing the
12 Board of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses to
13 promulgate a legislative rule relating to practitioner
14 requirements for accessing the West Virginia controlled
15 substances monitoring program database.

16 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

17 That article 9, chapter 64 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
18 as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

19 **ARTICLE 9. AUTHORIZATION FOR MISCELLANEOUS AGENCIES AND BOARDS TO**
20 **PROMULGATE LEGISLATIVE RULES.**

21 **§64-9-1. Board of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses.**

22 The legislative rule filed in the State Register on the
23 thirty-first day of July, two thousand twelve, authorized under the
24 authority of section five-a, article nine, chapter sixty-a, of this
25 code, modified by the Board of Examiners for Registered
26 Professional Nurses to meet the objections of the Legislative Rule-

1 Making Review Committee and refiled in the State Register on the
2 seventh day of December, two thousand twelve, relating to the Board
3 of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses (practitioner
4 requirements for accessing the West Virginia controlled substances
5 monitoring program database, [19 CSR 14](#)), is authorized.

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7 NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Board of
8 Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses to promulgate a
9 legislative rule relating to Practitioner Requirements for
10 Accessing the West Virginia Controlled Substances Monitoring
11 Program Database.
