10	A BILL to amend and reenact \$17C-14-15 of the code of West
11	Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to traffic regulations,
12	laws of the road; miscellaneous rules; and prohibiting the
13	denial of insurance coverage based on the prohibited use of
14	electronic communications devices while driving.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That \$17C-14-15 of the code of West Virginia, 1931, as
17	amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 14. MISCELLANEOUS RULES.
19	§17C-14-15. Prohibited use of an electronic communications device
20	driving without handheld features; definitions;
21	exceptions; penalties.
22	(a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a
23	person may not drive or operate a motor vehicle on a public street

1 or highway while:

- 2 (1) Texting; or
- 3 (2) Using a cell phone or other electronic communications 4 device, unless the use is accomplished by hands-free equipment.
- 5 (b) For purposes of this section, the following terms shall 6 mean:
- 7 (1) "Cell phone" shall mean means a cellular, analog, wireless 8 or digital telephone.
- 9 (2) "Driving" or "operating a motor vehicle" means operating
 10 a motor vehicle, with the motor running, including while
 11 temporarily stationary because of traffic, a traffic control
 12 device, or other momentary delays, but does not include operating
 13 a motor vehicle after the driver has moved the vehicle to the side
 14 of, or off, a highway and halted in a location where the vehicle
 15 can safely remain stationary.
- 16 (3) "Electronic communication device" means a cell telephone,
 17 personal digital assistant, electronic device with mobile data
 18 access, laptop computer, pager, broadband personal communication
 19 device, 2-way messaging device, electronic game, or portable
 20 computing device. For the purposes of this section, an "electronic
 21 communication device" does not include:
- (A) Voice radios, mobile radios, land mobile radios, commercial mobile radios or two way radios with the capability to transmit and receive voice transmissions utilizing a push-to-talk

1 or press-to-transmit function; or

- 2 (B) Other voice radios used by a law-enforcement officer, an
- 3 emergency services provider, an employee or agent of public safety
- 4 organizations, first responders, Amateur Radio Operators (HAM)
- 5 licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and school bus 6 operators.
- 7 (4) "Engaging in a call" means when a person talks into or
- 8 listens on an electronic communication device, but shall may not
- 9 include when a person dials or enters a phone number on a pushpad
- 10 or screen to initiate the call.
- 11 (5) "Hands-free electronic communication device" means an
- 12 electronic communication device that has an internal feature or
- 13 function, or that is equipped with an attachment or addition,
- 14 whether or not permanently part of such electronic communication
- 15 device, by which a user engages in a call without the use of either
- 16 hand or both hands.
- 17 (6) "Hands-free equipment" means the internal feature or
- 18 function of a hands-free electronic communication device or the
- 19 attachment or addition to a hands-free electronic communication
- 20 device by which a user may engage in a call or text without the use
- 21 of either hand or both hands.
- 22 (7) "Texting" means manually entering alphanumeric text into,
- 23 or reading text from, an electronic communication device, and
- 24 includes, but is not limited to, short message service, e-mailing,

- 1 instant messaging, a command or request to access a World Wide Web
- 2 page or engaging in any other form of electronic text retrieval or
- 3 entry, for present or future communication. For purposes of this
- 4 section, "texting" does not include the following actions:
- 5 (A) Reading, selecting or entering a telephone number, an
- 6 extension number, or voicemail retrieval codes and commands into an
- 7 electronic device by the pressing the device in order to initiate
- 8 or receive a phone call or using voice commands to initiate or
- 9 receive a telephone call;
- 10 (B) Inputting, selecting or reading information on a global
- 11 positioning system or navigation system; or
- 12 (C) Using a device capable of performing multiple functions,
- 13 including fleet management systems, dispatching devices, smart
- 14 phones, citizens band radios or music players, for a purpose that
- 15 is not otherwise prohibited in this section.
- 16 (8) "Using a cell phone or other electronic communication
- 17 device" means holding in a person's hand or hands an electronic
- 18 communication device while:
- 19 (A) Viewing or transmitting images or data;
- 20 (B) Playing games;
- 21 (C) Composing, sending, reading, viewing, accessing, browsing,
- 22 transmitting, saving or retrieving e-mail, text messages or other
- 23 electronic data; or
- 24 (D) Engaging in a call.

- 1 (c) Subsection (a) of this section shall does not apply to:
- 2 (1) A law-enforcement officer, a firefighter, an emergency
- 3 medical technician, a paramedic or the operator of an authorized
- 4 emergency vehicle in the performance of their official duties;
- 5 (2) A person using an electronic communication device to 6 report to appropriate authorities a fire, a traffic accident, a
- 7 serious road hazard, or a medical or hazardous materials
- 8 emergencies.
- 9 (3) The activation or deactivation of hands-free equipment or 10 a function of hands-free equipment.
- 11 (d) This section does not supersede the provisions of section
- 12 three-a, article two, chapter seventeen-b of this code or any more
- 13 restrictive provisions for drivers of commercial motor vehicles
- 14 prescribed by the provisions of chapter seventeen-e of this code or
- 15 federal law or rule.
- 16 (e) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection (a)
- 17 of this section is guilty of a traffic offense and, upon conviction
- 18 thereof, shall for a first offense be fined \$100; for a second
- 19 offense be fined \$200; and for a third or subsequent offense be
- 20 fined \$300. No court costs or other fees shall may be assessed for
- 21 a violation of subsection (a) of this section.
- 22 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the
- 23 contrary, points may not be entered on any driver's record
- 24 maintained by the Division of Motor Vehicles as a result of a

- 1 violation of this section, except for the third and subsequent
- 2 convictions of the offense, for which three points shall be entered
- 3 on any driver's record maintained by the Division of Motor
- 4 Vehicles.
- 5 (g) Driving or operating a motor vehicle on a public street or
- 6 highway while texting shall be enforced as a primary offense as of
- 7 July 1, 2012. Driving or operating a motor vehicle on a public
- 8 street or highway while using a cell phone or other electronic
- 9 communication device without hands-free equipment shall be enforced
- 10 as a secondary offense as of July 1, 2012, and as a primary offense
- 11 as of until July 1, 2013, when it shall be enforced as a primary
- 12 offense for purposes of citation.
- 13 (h) Within ninety days of the effective date of this section,
- 14 the Department of Transportation shall cause to be erected signs
- 15 upon any highway entering the State of West Virginia on which a
- 16 welcome to West Virginia sign is posted, and any other highway
- 17 where the Division of Highways deems considers appropriate, posted
- 18 at a distance of not more than one mile from each border crossing,
- 19 each sign to bear an inscription clearly communicating to motorists
- 20 entering the state that texting, or the use of a wireless
- 21 communication device without hands-free equipment, is illegal
- 22 within this state.
- (i) Nothing contained in this section $\frac{\text{shall }}{\text{may}}$ be construed
- 24 to authorize seizure of a cell phone or electronic device by any

- 1 law-enforcement agency.
- 2 (j) No policy providing liability coverage for personal lines
- 3 insurance may contain a provision which may be used to deny
- 4 coverage or exclude payment of any legal damages recoverable by law
- 5 for injuries proximately caused by a violation of this section, as
- 6 long as those amounts are within the coverage limits of the
- 7 insured.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit the denial of insurance coverage based on the prohibited use of electronic communications devices while driving.
