Television receivers in view of driver prohibited. 21 (a) No motor vehicle shall may be operated on any a street or 22 highway in this state when equipped with a television receiver 23 unless such receiver is so placed that the screen or picture tube

- 2 vehicle and not in view of the operator of such motor vehicle. the
- 3 receiver is configured so that the moving images are not in view of
- 4 the operator while the vehicle is in motion.

- 6 installed in a vehicle:
- 7 (1) A visual display if it does not show video or television
- 8 broadcast images in view of the operator while the motor vehicle is
- 9 in motion;
- 10 (2) A global positioning device;
- 11 (3) A mapping display;
- 12 (4) A visual display used to enhance or supplement the
- 13 driver's view forward, behind or to the sides of a motor vehicle
- 14 for the purpose of maneuvering the vehicle;
- 15 (5) A visual display used to enhance or supplement a driver's
- 16 view of vehicle occupants;
- 17 (6) Television-type receiving equipment used exclusively for
- 18 safety or traffic engineering information; or
- 19 (7) A television receiver, video monitor, television or video
- 20 screen for other similar means of visually displaying a television
- 21 broadcast or video signal if the equipment has an interlock device
- 22 that, when the motor vehicle is driven, disables the equipment for
- 23 all uses except as a visual display described in paragraphs (1)
- 24 through (6) of this subsection.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish conditions for use of television receivers in vehicles and to except specific devices from application of the section.
