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# Senate Bill No. 202

(By Senator Kessler (Mr. President), Fitzsimmons, Beach, Miller, Laird, Nohe and Stollings)

[Originating in the Committee on Finance; reported March 28, 2013.]

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A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article, designated §19-20C-1, §19-20C-2 and §19-20C-3, all relating to establishing the West Virginia Spay Neuter Assistance Program and Fund; designating the Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture to manage the program and fund; providing grants to nonprofit spay neuter programs in state; limiting administrative expenses of fund; requiring annual reporting; and authorizing rulemaking.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new article, designated §19-20C-1, §19-20C-2 and §19-20C-3, all to read as follows:

# ARTICLE 20C. WEST VIRGINIA SPAY NEUTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

## §19-20C-1. West Virginia Spay Neuter Assistance Program.

- 1 The Department of Agriculture shall establish a spay
- 2 neuter assistance program that provides grants to nonprofit
- 3 spay neuter organizations and programs in the state. The
- 4 purpose of this program is to have more dogs and cats
- 5 sterilized, thereby reducing shelter populations and costs,
- 6 euthanasia rates and threats to public health and safety from
- 7 rabies and other problems posed by the growing population
- 8 of stray, feral and abandoned dogs and cats.

## §19-20C-2. Fund established; acceptance of funds.

- 1 (a) There is created in the State Treasury a special
- 2 revenue account to be designated the West Virginia Spay

- 3 Neuter Assistance Fund. Expenditures from the fund are for
- 4 the purposes set forth in this article and are to be made in
- 5 accordance with appropriation by the Legislature and in
- 6 accordance with the provisions of article three, chapter
- 7 twelve of this code and upon the fulfillment of the provisions
- 8 set forth in article two, chapter eleven-b of this code.
- 9 (b) All moneys received and collected pursuant to this
- 10 article shall be deposited into the fund. The fund may receive
- 11 any appropriations, gifts, grants, contributions or other
- 12 money from any source that is designated for deposit into the
- 13 fund.
- 14 (c) Administrative expenses of the department may not
- 15 exceed ten percent of the funds deposited in any fiscal year.
- 16 The remainder shall be used exclusively for implementation
- 17 of the program.

# §19-20C-3. Rulemaking; annual report.

- 1 (a) The commissioner shall propose rules for legislative
- 2 approval in accordance with article three, chapter twenty-

- 3 nine-a of this code, to implement the provisions of this
- 4 article.
- 5 (b) Rules promulgated under this section shall, at a
- 6 minimum:
- 7 (1) Identify the types of nonprofit organizations and
- 8 programs that qualify for spay neuter grants;
- 9 (2) Establish parameters for spay neuter grants;
- 10 (3) Establish procedures and requirements for grant
- 11 applications; and
- 12 (4) Establish administration, record-keeping and
- 13 reporting requirements for nonprofit organizations and
- 14 programs that receive spay neuter grants.
- 15 (c) Beginning the year following the program's
- 16 inception, the commissioner shall file an annual report with
- 17 the Joint Committee on Government and Finance regarding
- 18 the program, funds received and grants awarded, the number
- 19 of dogs and cats sterilized and other pertinent data.
