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Senate Bill No. 381

(By Senators Stollings, Plymale and Unger)

[Originating in the Committee on Health and Human Resources; reported January 29, 2014.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §18-2-9 of the Code of West Virginia,

1931, as amended, relating to required course of instruction in

all public schools in West Virginia; and requiring instruction in

cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the Heimlich maneuver.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18-2-9 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,

be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2. STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

§18-2-9. Required courses of instruction; violation and penalty.

1 (a) In all public, private, parochial and denominational 2 schools located within this state, there shall be given prior to 3 the completion of the eighth grade at least one year of instruction in the history of the State of West Virginia. The 4 schools shall require regular courses of instruction by the 5 6 completion of the twelfth grade in the history of the United 7 States, in civics, in the Constitution of the United States, and in the government of the State of West Virginia for the 8 purpose of teaching, fostering and perpetuating the ideals, 9 principles and spirit of political and economic democracy in 10 America and increasing the knowledge of the organization 11 12 and machinery of the government of the United States and of 13 the State of West Virginia. The state board shall, with the 14 advice of the state superintendent, prescribe the courses of study covering these subjects for the public schools. It shall 15 be the duty of the officials or boards having authority over 16 the respective private, parochial and denominational schools 17

3 [Eng. Com. Sub. for Com. Sub. for S. B. No. 381 18 to prescribe courses of study for the schools under their 19 control and supervision similar to those required for the 20 public schools. To further such study, every high school 21 student eligible by age for voter registration shall be afforded 22 the opportunity to register to vote pursuant to section twenty-23 two, article two, chapter three of this code.

24 (b) The state board shall cause to be taught in all of the 25 public schools of this state the subject of health education, including instruction in any of the grades six through twelve 26 as considered appropriate by the county board, on: (1) The 27 28 prevention, transmission and spread of acquired immune 29 deficiency syndrome and other sexually transmitted diseases; (2) substance abuse, including the nature of alcoholic drinks 30 and narcotics, tobacco products, and other potentially 31 32 harmful drugs, with special instruction as to their effect upon the human system and upon society in general; (3) the 33 importance of healthy eating and physical activity to 34 maintaining healthy weight; and (4) education concerning 35 CPR and first aid which includes instruction in the care for 36 conscious choking. The course curriculum requirements and 37

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38	materials for the instruction shall be adopted by the state
39	board by rule in consultation with the Department of Health
40	and Human Resources. The state board shall prescribe a
41	standardized health education assessment to be administered
42	within health education classes to measure student health
43	knowledge and program effectiveness.
44	(c)(1) After July 1, 2015, the state board shall require to
45	be taught in all of the public schools of this state once during
46	grades nine through twelve as a requirement for graduation
47	at least thirty minutes of instruction on the subject of
48	cardiopulmonary resuscitation, which must include a psycho-
49	motor skills component. However, full certification is
50	encouraged.
51	(2) Instruction may be given by community members
52	such as emergency medical technicians, paramedics, police
53	officers, firefighters and representatives of the American
54	Heart Association or the American Red Cross. These
55	community members are encouraged to provide necessary
56	training and instructional resources such as cardiopulmonary

57 resuscitation kits and other material at no cost to the schools.

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58	(d) An opportunity shall be afforded to the parent or
59	guardian of a child subject to instruction in the prevention,
60	transmission and spread of acquired immune deficiency
61	syndrome and other sexually transmitted diseases to examine
62	the course curriculum requirements and materials to be used
63	in the instruction. The parent or guardian may exempt the
64	child from participation in the instruction by giving notice to
65	that effect in writing to the school principal.

(c) (e) Any person violating the provisions of this section 66 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction 67 thereof, shall be fined not exceeding \$10 for each violation, 68 and each week during which there is a violation shall 69 70 constitute a separate offense. If the person so convicted occupies a position in connection with the public schools, 71 72 that person shall automatically be removed from that position 73 and shall be ineligible for reappointment to that or a similar 74 position for the period of one year.
