(By Senators Miller, Laird, Barnes and Williams)

[Originating in the Committee on the Judiciary; reported March 27, 2013.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §29-22A-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; to amend and reenact §29-22B-332 of said code; and to amend and reenact §29-25-2 and §29-25-24 of said code, all relating to deleting those video lottery games that allow players an option to select replacement symbols or numbers or additional symbols or numbers after the game is initiated and in the course of play from the definition of "video lottery game"; deleting prohibition against game themes commonly associated with casino gambling; and permitting certain employees of an historic resort hotel to wager at the gaming facility of that historic hotel.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §29-22A-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; that §29-22B-332 of said code be amended and reenacted; and that §29-25-2 and §29-25-24 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 22A. RACETRACK VIDEO LOTTERY.

§29-22A-3. Definitions.

- 1 As used in this article:
- 2 (a) "Applicant" means any person applying for any video3 lottery license or permit.

4 (b) "Associated equipment" means any hardware located 5 on a licensed racetrack's premises which is connected to the 6 video lottery system for the purpose of performing 7 communication, validation or other functions, but not 8 including the video lottery terminals or the communication 9 facilities of a regulated public utility.

(c) "Background investigation" means a security,
criminal and credit investigation of a person, as defined in
this section, who has applied for a video lottery license or

permit, or who has been granted a video lottery license orpermit.

(d) "Central computer," "central control computer" or
"central site system" means any central site computer
provided to and controlled by the commission to which video
lottery terminals communicate for purposes of information
retrieval and terminal activation and to disable programs.

20 (e) "Commission" or "State Lottery Commission" means
21 the West Virginia Lottery Commission created by article
22 twenty-two of this chapter.

23 (f) "Control" means the authority to direct the
24 management and policies of an applicant or a license or
25 permit holder.

(g) "Costs" means the expenses incurred by the
commission in the testing and examination of video lottery
terminals and the performance of background investigations
and other related activities which are charged to and
collected from applicants or license or permit holders.

(h) "Director" means the individual appointed by the 31 Governor to provide management and administration 32 33 necessary to direct the State Lottery Office. (i) "Disable" or "terminal disable" means the process of 34 35 executing a shutdown command from the central control 36 computer which causes video lottery terminals to cease 37 functioning. 38 (j) "Display" means the visual presentation of video 39 lottery game features on a video lottery terminal in the form of video images, actual symbols or both. 40 41 (k) "EPROM" and "erasable programmable read-only 42 memory chips" means the electronic storage medium on 43 which the operation software for all games playable on a 44 video lottery terminal resides and which can also be in the 45 form of CD-ROM, flash RAM or other new technology medium that the commission may from time to time approve 46 for use in video lottery terminals. All electronic storage 47

48 media are considered to be the property of the State of West49 Virginia.

50 (l) "Floor attendant" means a person, employed by a 51 licensed racetrack, who holds a permit issued by the 52 commission and who corrects paper jams and bill jams in 53 video lottery terminals and also provides courtesy services 54 for video lottery players.

(m) "Gross terminal income" means the total amount of cash, vouchers or tokens inserted into the video lottery terminals operated by a licensee, minus the total value of coins and tokens won by a player and game credits which are cleared from the video lottery terminals in exchange for winning redemption tickets.

(n) "License" or "video lottery license" means
authorization granted by the commission to a racetrack which
is licensed by the West Virginia Racing Commission to
conduct thoroughbred or greyhound racing meetings pursuant
to article twenty-three, chapter nineteen of this code
permitting the racetrack to operate video lottery terminals
authorized by the commission.

(o) "Lottery" means the public gaming systems or games 68 69 established and operated by the State Lottery Commission. (p) "Manufacturer" means any person holding a permit 70 granted by the commission to engage in the business of 71 72 building, constructing, assembling designing, or manufacturing video lottery terminals, the electronic 73 74 computer components of the video lottery terminals, the 75 random number generator of the video lottery terminals, or the cabinet in which it is housed, and whose product is 76 77 intended for sale, lease or other assignment to a licensed 78 racetrack in West Virginia, and who contracts directly with 79 the licensee for the sale, lease or other assignment to a licensed racetrack in West Virginia. 80 (q) "Net terminal income" means gross terminal income 81

minus an amount deducted by the commission to reimburse
the commission for its actual costs of administering racetrack
video lottery at the licensed racetrack. No deduction for any
or all costs and expenses of a licensee related to the operation

(r) "Noncash prize" means merchandise which a video
lottery player may be given the option to receive in lieu of
cash in exchange for a winning redemption ticket and which
shall be assigned a redemption value equal to the actual cost
of the merchandise to the licensed racetrack.

93 (s) "Own" means any beneficial or proprietary interest in
94 any property or business of an applicant or licensed
95 racetrack.

(t) "Pari-mutuel racing facility," "licensed racetrack," 96 "racetrack" or "track" means a facility where horse or dog 97 98 race meetings are held and the pari-mutuel system of 99 wagering is authorized pursuant to the provisions of article 100 twenty-three, chapter nineteen of this code: *Provided*. That, for the purposes of this article, "pari-mutuel racing facility," 101 "licensed racetrack," "racetrack" or "track" includes only a 102 facility which was licensed prior to January 1, 1994, to hold 103 104 horse or dog race meetings, and which conducts not less than

105	two hundred twenty live racing dates for each horse or dog
106	race meeting or such other number of live racing dates as
107	may be approved by the Racing Commission in accordance
108	with the provisions of section twelve-b, article twenty-three,
109	chapter nineteen of this code.
110	(u) "Permit" means authorization granted by the
111	commission to a person to function as either a video lottery
112	manufacturer, service technician or validation manager.
113	(v) "Person" means any natural person, corporation,
114	association, partnership, limited partnership, or other entity,
115	regardless of its form, structure or nature.
116	(w) "Player" means a person who plays a video lottery
117	game on a video lottery terminal at a racetrack licensed by
118	the commission to conduct video lottery games.
119	(x) "Service technician" means a person, employed by a
120	licensed racetrack, who holds a permit issued by the
121	commission and who performs service, maintenance and
122	repair on licensed video lottery terminals in this state.

(y) "Video lottery game" means a commission approved,
owned and controlled electronically simulated game of
chance which is displayed on a video lottery terminal and
which:

127 (1) Is connected to the commission's central control128 computer by an on-line or dial-up communication system;

(2) Is initiated by a player's insertion of coins, currency,
vouchers or tokens into a video lottery terminal, which
causes game play credits to be displayed on the video lottery
terminal and, with respect to which, each game play credit
entitles a player to choose one or more symbols or numbers
or to cause the video lottery terminal to randomly select
symbols or numbers;

(3) Allows the player to win additional game play credits,
coins or tokens based upon game rules which establish the
random selection of winning combinations of symbols or
numbers or both and the number of free play credits, coins or
tokens to be awarded for each winning combination of
symbols or numbers or both;

(4) Is based upon computer-generated random selection
of winning combinations based totally or predominantly on
chance;

145 (5) In the case of a video lottery game which allows the 146 player an option to select replacement symbols or numbers or 147 additional symbols or numbers after the game is initiated and 148 in the course of play, either: (A) Signals the player, prior to 149 any optional selection by the player of randomly generated replacement symbols or numbers, as to which symbols or 150 151 numbers should be retained by the player to present the best chance, based upon probabilities, that the player may select 152 153 a winning combination; (B) signals the player, prior to any 154 optional selection by the player of randomly generated 155 additional symbols or numbers, as to whether such additional 156 selection presents the best chance, based upon probabilities, 157 that the player may select a winning combination; or (C) 158 randomly generates additional or replacement symbols and 159 numbers for the player after automatically selecting the 160 symbols and numbers which should be retained to present the

best chance, based upon probabilities, for a winning 161 combination, so that in any event, the player is not permitted 162 to benefit from any personal skill, based upon a knowledge 163 of probabilities, before deciding which optional numbers or 164 165 symbols to choose in the course of video lottery game play; 166 (6) (5) Allows a player at any time to simultaneously clear all game play credits and print a redemption ticket 167 entitling the player to receive the cash value of the free plays 168 169 cleared from the video lottery terminal; and (6) Does not use the following game themes commonly 170 associated with casino gambling: Roulette, dice, or baccarat 171 card games: Provided, That games having a display with 172 173 symbols which appear to roll on drums to simulate a classic 174 casino slot machine, game themes of other card games and

175 keno may be used.

(z) "Validation manager" means a person who holds a
permit issued by the commission and who performs video
lottery ticket redemption services.

(aa) "Video lottery" means a lottery which allows a game 179 180 to be played utilizing an electronic computer and an 181 interactive computer terminal device, equipped with a video screen and keys, a keyboard or other equipment allowing 182 183 input by an individual player, into which the player inserts 184 coins, currency, vouchers or tokens as consideration in order 185 for play to be available, and through which terminal device 186 the player may receive free games, coins, tokens or credit that 187 can be redeemed for cash, annuitized payments over time, a noncash prize or nothing, as may be determined wholly or 188 predominantly by chance. "Video lottery" does not include 189 190 a lottery game which merely utilizes an electronic computer 191 and a video screen to operate a lottery game and communicate the results of the game, such as the game 192 193 "Travel," and which does not utilize an interactive electronic terminal device allowing input by an individual player. 194

(bb) "Video lottery terminal" means a commissionapproved interactive electronic terminal device which is
connected with the commission's central computer system,

and which is used for the purpose of playing video lottery
games authorized by the commission. A video lottery
terminal may simulate the play of one or more video lottery
games.

202 (cc) "Wager" means a sum of money or thing of value203 risked on an uncertain occurrence.

ARTICLE 22B. LIMITED VIDEO LOTTERY.

§29-22B-332. Video lottery game defined.

"Video lottery game" means an electronically simulated 1 2 game of chance that is approved, owned and controlled under 3 this article by the commission, which is displayed on the 4 screen or video monitor of a video lottery terminal and that: 5 (1) Is connected to the commission's central control 6 computer by an on-line or dial-up communication system; (2) Is initiated by a player's insertion of coins or currency 7 into a video lottery terminal, which causes game play credits 8 to be displayed on the video lottery terminal and, with respect 9

10 to which, each game play credit entitles a player to choose

one or more symbols or numbers or to cause the video lottery 11 12 terminal to randomly select symbols or numbers; 13 (3) Allows the player to win additional game play credits based upon game rules which establish the random selection 14 of winning combinations of symbols or numbers or both and 15 16 the number of free-play credits to be awarded for each winning combination of symbols or numbers or both; 17 18 (4) Is based upon computer-generated random selection of winning combinations based totally or predominantly on 19 chance: 20 (5) In the case of a video lottery game which allows the 21 22 player an option to select replacement symbols or numbers or additional symbols or numbers after the game is initiated and 23 24 in the course of play, either: (A) Signals the player, prior to any optional selection by the player of randomly generated 25 replacement symbols or numbers, as to which symbols or 26 numbers should be retained by the player to present the best 27 chance, based upon probabilities, that the player may select 28 a winning combination; (B) signals the player, prior to any 29

optional selection by the player of randomly generated 30 31 additional symbols or numbers, as to whether the additional 32 selection presents the best chance, based upon probabilities, 33 that the player may select a winning combination; or (C) 34 randomly generates additional or replacement symbols and numbers for the player after automatically selecting the 35 36 symbols and numbers which should be retained to present the 37 best chance, based upon probabilities, for a winning combination, so that in any event, the player is not permitted 38 to benefit from any personal skill, based upon a knowledge 39 40 of probabilities, before deciding which optional numbers or symbols to choose in the course of video lottery game play; 41 (6) (5) Allows a player at any time to simultaneously 42 clear all game play credits and print a redemption ticket 43 44 entitling the player to receive the cash value of the free plays cleared from the video lottery terminal; and 45

46 (6) Does not use game themes of roulette, dice or
47 baccarat card games commonly associated with casino
48 gambling: *Provided*, That games having a video display

49 depicting symbols that appear to roll on drums to simulate a

50 classic casino slot machine, game themes of other card games

51 and keno may be used.

ARTICLE 25. AUTHORIZED GAMING FACILITY.

§29-25-2. Definitions.

As used in this article, unless the context otherwise
 requires, the following words and phrases have meanings
 indicated:

4 (a) "Applicant" means any person or entity applying for5 a license.

6 (b) "Adjusted gross receipts" means the gross receipts of
7 a gaming facility from West Virginia Lottery table games less
8 winnings paid to wagerers in such games.

9 (c) "Annual average gross receipts of the pari-mutuel 10 racetracks with table games licenses" means the amount 11 obtained by adding the adjusted gross receipts of all West 12 Virginia pari-mutuel racetracks with table games licenses and 13 then dividing that calculation by the number of West Virginia 14 pari-mutuel racetracks with table games licenses.

15	(d) "Background investigation" means a security,
16	criminal and credit investigation of an applicant who has
17	applied for the issuance or renewal or a license pursuant to
18	this article or a licensee who holds a current license.
19	(e) "Controlling interest" means:
20	(1) For a partnership, an interest as a general or limited
21	partner holding more than five percent interest in the entity;
22	(2) For a corporation, an interest of more than five
23	percent of the stock in the corporation; and
24	(3) For any other entity, an ownership interest of more
25	than five percent in the entity.
26	(f) "Controlling person" means, with respect to another
27	person, any person directly or indirectly owning or holding
28	a controlling interest in that other person.
29	(g) "Commission" means the State Lottery Commission
30	created in section four, article twenty-two of this chapter.
31	(h) "Designated gaming area" means one or more specific
32	floor areas of a licensed gaming facility within which the
33	commission has authorized operation of video lottery

34 terminals or West Virginia Lottery table games, or the
35 operation of both video lottery terminals and West Virginia
36 Lottery table games.

37 (i) "Director" means the Director of the State Lottery38 Commission.

39 (i) "Erasable programmable read-only memory chips" or "EPROM" means the electronic storage medium on which 40 41 the operation software for all games playable on a video 42 lottery terminal resides and can also be in the form of CD-43 ROM, flash RAM or other new technology medium that the 44 commission may from time to time approve for use in video 45 lottery terminals. All electronic storage media are considered to be property of the State of West Virginia. 46

47 (k) "Fringe benefits" means sickness and accident
48 benefits and benefits relating to medical and pension
49 coverage.

(1) "Gaming devices and supplies" mean gaming tables
for all West Virginia Lottery table games, roulette wheels,
wheels of fortune, video lottery terminals, cards, dice, chips,

53	tokens, markers or any other mechanical, electronic or other
54	device, mechanism or equipment or related supplies utilized
55	in the operation of a West Virginia Lottery table game.
56	(m) "Gaming facility" means a designated area on the
57	premises of an existing historic resort hotel in which West
58	Virginia Lottery table games are conducted by a gaming
59	licensee.
60	(n) "Gaming licensee" means the licensed operator of a
61	gaming facility.
62	(o) "Gross receipts" means the total amount of money
63	exchanged for the purchase of chips, tokens or electronic
64	cards by patrons of a gaming facility reduced by gross
65	terminal income to the extent gross terminal income is
66	included in the amount of money exchanged.
67	(p) "Gross terminal income", as used in this article and as
68	used in article twenty-two-a of this chapter, means the total
69	amount of cash, vouchers or tokens inserted into the video
70	lottery terminals operated by a licensee, minus promotional

71 credits played, and minus the total value of coins and tokens

won by a player and game credits which are cleared from the
video lottery terminals in exchange for winning redemption
tickets.

(q) "Historic resort hotel" means a resort hotel registered
with the United States Department of the Interior as a
national historic landmark in its National Registry of Historic
Places having not fewer than five hundred guest rooms under
common ownership and having substantial recreational guest
amenities in addition to the gaming facility.

(r) "Historic Resort Hotel Fund" means the special fund
in the State Treasury created in section twenty-two of this
article.

84 (s) "Human Resource Benefit Fund" means the special
85 fund in the State Treasury created in section twenty-two-a of
86 this article.

(t) "Human Resource Benefit Advisory Board" or
"board" means the advisory board created in section twentytwo-a of this article.

90 (u) "License" means a license issued by the commission,91 including:

92 (1) A license to operate a gaming facility;

93 (2) A license to supply gaming devices and supplies to a94 gaming facility;

- 95 (3) A license to be employed in connection with the96 operation of a gaming facility; or
- 97 (4) A license to provide management services under a98 contract to a gaming facility under this article.
- 99 (v) "Licensed gaming facility employee" means any
 100 individual licensed to be employed by a gaming licensee in
 101 connection with the operation of a gaming facility.

(w) "Licensed gaming facility supplier" means a person
who is licensed by the commission to engage in the business
of supplying gaming devices and gaming supplies to a
gaming facility.

106 (x) "Licensee" means a gaming licensee, a licensed
107 gaming facility supplier or a licensed gaming facility
108 employee.

(y) "Manufacturer" means any person holding a license 109 110 granted by the commission to engage in the business of 111 building, constructing, assembling designing. or manufacturing video lottery terminals, the electronic 112 113 computer components of the video lottery terminals, the 114 random number generator of the video lottery terminals, or 115 the cabinet in which it is housed, and whose product is intended for sale, lease or other assignment to a licensed 116 117 gaming facility in West Virginia and who contracts directly 118 with the licensee for the sale, lease or other assignment to a 119 licensed gaming facility in West Virginia.

(z) "Net terminal income" means gross terminal income
minus an amount deducted by the commission to reimburse
the commission for its actual cost of administering video
lottery at the licensed gaming facility. No deduction for any
or all costs and expenses of a licensee related to the operation
of video lottery games shall be deducted from gross terminal
income.

(aa) "Person" means any natural person, corporation,
association, partnership, limited partnership, limited liability
company or other entity, regardless of its form, structure or
nature.

(bb)"Premises of an existing historic resort hotel" means
the historic resort hotel, attachments of the historic resort
hotel, and the traditional, immediate grounds of the historic
resort hotel.

(cc) "Promotional credits" means credits given by the
licensed gaming facility or licensed racetrack to players
allowing limited free play of video lottery terminals in total
amounts and under conditions approved in advance by the
commission.

(dd) "Video lottery game", as used in this article and as
used in article twenty-two-a of this chapter, means a
commission-approved, -owned and -controlled electronically
simulated game of chance which is displayed on a video
lottery terminal and which:

147	(2) Is initiated by a player's insertion of cash, vouchers or

the player of randomly generated additional symbols or
numbers, as to whether such additional selection presents the
best chance, based upon probabilities, that the player may
select a winning combination; or

177 (C) Randomly generates additional or replacement
178 symbols and numbers for the player after automatically
179 selecting the symbols and numbers which should be retained
180 to present the best chance, based upon probabilities, for a

winning combination, so that in any event, the player is not
permitted to benefit from any personal skill, based upon a
knowledge of probabilities, before deciding which optional
numbers or symbols to choose in the course of video lottery
game play;

(6) (5) Allows a player at any time to simultaneously
clear all game play credits and print a redemption ticket
entitling the player to receive the cash value of the free plays
cleared from the video lottery terminal; and

(6) Does not use the following game themes commonly
associated with casino gambling: Roulette, dice or baccarat
card games: *Provided*, That games having a display with
symbols which appear to roll on drums to simulate a classic
casino slot machine, game themes of other card games and
keno may be used.

(ee) "Wager" means a sum of money or thing of valuerisked on an uncertain occurrence.

(ff) "West Virginia Lottery table game" means any gameplayed with cards, dice or any mechanical, electromechanical

or electronic device or machine for money, credit or any 200 201 representative of value, including, but not limited to, baccarat, blackjack, poker, craps, roulette, wheel of fortune 202 or any variation of these games similar in design or operation 203 and expressly authorized by rule of the commission, 204 including multiplayer electronic table games, machines and 205 devices, but excluding video lottery, punchboards, faro, 206 207 numbers tickets, push cards, jar tickets, pull tabs or similar 208 games.

§29-25-24. Individual gaming restrictions.

(a) An individual may enter a designated gaming area or
 remain in a designated gaming area only if the individual:

3 (1) Is either;

4 (A) A registered overnight guest at the historic resort
5 hotel on whose premises the gaming facility is located;

6 (B) A person who is a not a registered overnight guest,
7 but is a registered participant at a convention or event being
8 held at the historic resort hotel: *Provided*, That this
9 paragraph does not apply on any calendar day when less than

- 10 four hundred guest rooms are occupied at the historic resort11 hotel; or
- 12 (C) A member of a homeowner or facility association that 13 entitles members to substantial privileges at the historic resort 14 hotel on whose premises the gaming facility is located or an 15 overnight guest of such a member: *Provided*, That the 16 association was in existence as of April 1, 2009;
- 17 (2) Is at least twenty-one years of age;
- 18 (3) Is not visibly intoxicated;
- (4) Has not been determined by the gaming facility
 operator or the commission to be unruly, disruptive or
 otherwise interfering with operation of the gaming facility; or
 to be likely to commit, or to attempt to commit, a violation of
 this article; and
- 24 (5) Has not been barred by the commission from entering25 a gaming facility.

(b) Notwithstanding any provisions of this code to the
contrary, no employee of the commission or employee of the
historic resort hotel or any member of his or her immediate

- 29 household may wager at the gaming facility, and no licensed
- 30 limited gaming facility employee may wager on any table
- 31 game at the limited gaming facility.
