[Originating in the Committee on the Judiciary; reported March 14, 2013.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §3-2-30 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend said code by adding thereto a new section, designated §59-1-2b, all relating to the preparation and sale of voter registration lists; exempting certain voter data from being provided; clarifying that records are to be kept in electronic form; permitting certain voter lists be obtained for noncommercial purposes from the clerk of the county commission or the Secretary of State; providing certain exemptions allowing the Secretary of State to provide voter information to others; setting forth the fees to be charged for the sale of voter registration lists; setting forth the types of lists and services that are available; requiring the net proceeds from the voter registration list sales be deposited in the State

Election Fund; and clarifying that the Secretary of State may share voter information with those authorized to receive the information.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §3-2-30 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §59-1-2b, all to read as follows:

CHAPTER 3. ELECTIONS.

ARTICLE 2. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.

§3-2-30. Public inspection of voter registration records in the office of the clerk of the county commission; providing voter lists for noncommercial use; prohibition against resale of voter lists for commercial use or profit.

(a) Any person may examine the active, inactive, rejected
 and canceled voter registration records during office hours of
 the clerk of the county commission in accordance with the
 provisions of chapter twenty-nine-b of this code. as follows:

 (1) When the active and inactive files are maintained on
 precinct registration books, any person may examine the files
 under the supervision of the clerk and obtain copies of
 records except when a precinct book is in temporary use for

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9 updating and preparing lists or during the time the books are
10 sealed for use in an election. Other original voter registration
11 records, including canceled voter records, pending
12 applications, rejected applications, records of change
13 requests, reinstatements and other documents, shall be
14 available for inspection upon specific request; and

(2) When the Active, inactive, rejected and canceled 15 voter files are to be maintained in electronic data format. 16 17 Any person may examine voter record information in printed form or in a read-only data format on a computer terminal set 18 aside for public use, if available. The data files available for 19 examination and copying shall include all registration and 20 21 voting information maintained in the file, but may not include the registrant's telephone number, email address, 22 Social Security number or driver's license number or 23 nonoperator's identification number issued by the Division 24 of Motor Vehicles. 25

26 (b) Printed lists of registered voters may be purchased for
27 noncommercial use from the clerk of the county commission
28 at a cost of 1¢ per name.

29 (c) In counties maintaining active and inactive files in
 30 digitized data format, (b) The clerk of the county commission

31 shall, upon request, prepare provide printed copies of the lists 32 of voters for each precinct. No list prepared under this section may include the registrant's telephone number, email 33 address, Social Security number or driver's license number 34 or nonoperator's identification number issued by the 35 36 Division of Motor Vehicles. The clerk shall establish a written policy, posted within public view, listing the options 37 for selection and sorting criteria and available data elements. 38 The data elements shall include, at least: 39

40 (1) The name, residence address, political party41 affiliation and status of the registrant;

42 (2) The available formats of the lists; and

43 (3) The times at which lists will be prepared. A copy of
44 the county policy shall be filed with the Secretary of State no
45 later than January 1 of each even-numbered year.

(d) In counties which maintain voter files in a digitized
data format, (c) Lists of registered voters may be obtained for
noncommercial purposes in data format on disk <u>or as a</u>
<u>printed list</u> provided and prepared by the clerk of the county
commission at a cost of 1¢ per name. plus \$10 for each disk
required. No data file prepared under this <u>subsection</u> may
include the registrant's telephone number, email address,

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(c) (d) The fees received by the clerk of the county 56 commission shall be kept in a separate fund under the 57 supervision of the clerk. for the purpose of defraying the cost 58 of the preparation of the voter lists. Any unexpended 59 balance revenue in the fund shall be transferred to the 60 General Fund of the county commission. deposited in the 61 State Election Fund as set forth in subsection b, section forty-62 eight, article one of this chapter. 63

(f) (e) The Secretary of State may shall make voter lists 64 available for sale subject to the limitations as provided in 65 subsection (a) of this section. for counties. The cost for a 66 partial list shall be one and one-half cents per name plus \$10 67 68 for each disk required; the cost for a complete statewide list shall be one-half cent per name and a flat fee of \$1,000. One 69 cent per name for each voter from a particular county on 70 71 each partial list and one-half cent per name for each voter from a particular county on each statewide list sold shall be 72 reimbursed to the appropriate county. The fees for the voter 73 lists shall be as prescribed in section two-b, article one, 74

<u>chapter fifty-nine of this code.</u> The disk fee and one-half cent
per name revenue associated with <u>purchase of</u> a partial list
and the flat fee of \$1,000 or associated with a complete
statewide list shall be deposited to a special revenue account
for purpose of defraying the cost of preparing the lists <u>in the</u>
State Election Fund as set forth in subsection (b), section
forty-eight, article one of this chapter.

(g) An update to a previously purchased list may be
provided by the Secretary of State or the clerk of the county
commission at a prorated cost based on the amount of
additional information provided. The additional rates
charged by the clerk of the county commission shall be
specified in the policy established pursuant to subsection (c)
of this section.

(h) (f) No voter registration lists or data files containing
voter names, addresses or other information derived from
voter data files obtained pursuant to the provisions of this
article may be used for commercial or charitable solicitations
or advertising, sold or reproduced for resale.

94 (g) This section may not be interpreted to prevent the
 95 Secretary of State from sharing data files containing voter
 96 information with authorized service providers or sharing data

97 across state lines with any state or local election official for

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- 98 the purpose of voter registration and election administration
- 99 in accordance with this chapter or applicable federal law.

CHAPTER 59. FEES, ALLOWANCES AND COSTS;

NEWSPAPERS; LEGAL ADVERTISEMENTS.

ARTICLE 1. FEES AND ALLOWANCES.

§59-1-2b. Purchase of voter registration lists and election data; fees.

(a) Except as may be otherwise provided in this code, the
 Secretary of State shall charge the following fees for data
 originating in the statewide voter registration system to be
 paid by the person for whom the service is rendered at the
 time it is performed:

6	(1) Election Cycle Subscription Service \$6,000
7	(2) Statewide Voter Registration List \$500
8	(3) Master Voter History List Export \$500
9	(4) Statewide Early Voters List \$200
10	(5) Statewide Absentee Requests List \$200
11	(6) Statewide Absentee Received List \$200
12	(7) Partial Voter Registration List Current hourly rate
13	(8) Voter History List Current hourly rate
14	(9) Complex Research Query Current hourly rate

15 (b) For the purposes of this section, "Election Cycle16 Subscription Service" includes:

17 (1) Statewide Registered Voter List updated monthly18 throughout the year and updated daily starting thirty days19 prior to election day through election day;

(2) Master Voter History List Export following
certification of the primary, general and odd-year elections;
(3) Statewide All Mail-in Absentee Request List and
Statewide Public Received Mail-in Absentee List for the
primary, general and odd-year elections, updated daily
starting thirty days prior to election day through ten days
following election day; and

(4) Statewide Early Voters List for the primary, general
and odd-year elections, updated daily starting on the first day
of early voting through election day.

30 (c) At the time that a request is made under subdivisions
31 (7), (8) or (9) of subsection (a) of this section, the current
32 hourly rate, as determined by the Secretary of State, shall be
33 communicated to the prospective purchaser along with an
34 estimate of the number of hours needed to fulfill the request
35 before any list is compiled.

- 36 (d) Net proceeds from the sale of data originating in the
 37 statewide voter registration system, along with any interest
 38 on such funds, shall be deposited into the State Election Fund
 39 as set forth in subsection (b), section forty-eight, article one,
- 40 chapter three of this code.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill concerns the preparation and sale of voter registration lists. The bill exempts certain voter data from being provided. The bill permits voter lists be obtained for noncommercial purposes. The bill sets forth the fees to be charged for the sale of voter registration lists. The bill sets forth the types of lists and services that are available. The bill requires the net proceeds from the sales of voter registration lists be deposited in the State Election Fund. The bill clarifies that the Secretary of State may share voter information with those authorized to receive the information.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

§59-1-2b is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.)
