## Senate Bill No. 515

AN ACT to amend and reenact §17C-15-42 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to equipment installed in motor vehicles; prohibiting video screens, video monitors, televisions and television receivers in view of the driver while a motor vehicle is in motion; exceptions; restrictions; conditions for use; and inapplicability of prohibition to specific devices.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §17C-15-42 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

## ARTICLE 15. EQUIPMENT.

- §17C-15-42. Video screens, video monitors and television receivers in view of driver prohibited; exceptions.
  - 1 (a) No motor vehicle may be operated on a street or
  - 2 highway in this state when equipped with a television
  - 3 receiver, video monitor, television or video screen unless the
  - 4 receiver, screen or monitor is configured so that the moving
  - 5 images are not in view of the operator while the vehicle is in
  - 6 motion, or it falls within one or more of the categories set
  - 7 forth in subsections (b) or (c) of this section.

- 8 (b) This prohibition does not apply to the following 9 equipment installed in a vehicle:
- 10 (1) A visual display if it does not show video or television 11 broadcast images in view of the operator while the motor 12 vehicle is in motion;
- 13 (2) A global positioning device;
- 14 (3) A mapping display;
- 15 (4) A visual display used to enhance or supplement the 16 driver's view forward, behind or to the sides of a motor 17 vehicle for the purpose of maneuvering the vehicle;
- 18 (5) A visual display used to enhance or supplement a 19 driver's view of vehicle occupants; or
- (6) Television-type receiving equipment used exclusively
   for safety or traffic engineering information.
- (c) A television receiver, video monitor, television or video screen or other similar means of visually displaying a television broadcast or video signal is not prohibited if the equipment has an interlock device that, when the motor vehicle is driven, disables the equipment for all uses except as a visual display described in subdivisions (1) through (6) of subsection (b) of this section.
